## ACCOUNT OF THE MAIN ROAD CONSTRUCTION FUND.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has, in accordance with the provisions of *The Local Government Act*, No. 176, section 224, directed that the several Shire Councils and District Road Boards receiving additional subsidy in respect of Works on Main Roads executed under Orders in Council of 1865, which additional subsidy is and has been payable from a vote numbered division 32, item 9, £32,760, "to subsidize District Road Boards, &c." shall cause the several sums so received to be paid to the account of the "Main Road Construction Fund"; and that a copy of so much of the said account as shall not have been theretofore sent shall be made up to the 20th of October instant, and shall be forwarded on or before the 31st of December next for the information of the Commissioners of Audit, together with the requisite vouchers relating to the same.

## AGENTS OF THE BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS EMPOWERED TO ENTER UPON ALLOTMENTS, ETC., OF DEFAULTING LESSEES.

To all to whom these Presents shall come, the Board of Land and Works send,

### GREETING—

WHEREAS under and by virtue of the 12th and 13th sections of *The Amending Land Act 1865*, the Board of Land and Works have granted certain leases under their seal of certain allotments or subdivisions of allotments in certain agricultural areas, for the term of seven years, at the rent of Two shillings per annum for each and every acre or fractional part of an acre of such allotments or subdivisions of allotments: And whereas it was provided in every such lease, and such lease was upon the condition, that in case the rent thereby reserved or any part thereof should not be paid in accordance with the covenant for

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payment thereinbefore contained, although no demand for payment should have been made; or if the lessee, his executors or administrators, should not before the end of the second year from the commencement of the term thereby created have made on the land thereby demised substantial and permanent improvements within the meaning of the said Act, certified in writing under the seal of the said board, or under the hands of arbitrators, or under the hand of the value of One pound for every acre and fractional part of an acre of the land demised; or if the lessee, his executors, administrators, or assigns, should not faithfully observe and perform all and every the covenants and conditions herein contained, and on his or their part to be observed and performed; it should be lawful for the said board to enter forthwith or at any time thereafter upon the land thereby demised and the same to repossess and enjoy and from thenceforth the said term thereby granted should absolutely cease and determine; and it was thereby agreed and declared that in any such case it should be lawful for the said board, and for any such agent of the said board, or for any other agents or officers of the said board authorized in that behalf, without any demand whatsoever, to enter upon the land thereby demised, and the lessee, his executors or administrators, and all persons claiming under him or them for ever to expel and remove therefrom, without any legal process whatsoever and as effectually as any sheriff might do in case the said board had obtained judgment in ejectment for recovery of possession of the said land, and a writ of *habere facias possessionem* or other process had issued on such judgment directed to such sheriff in due form of law: And whereas the said board is desirous of appointing agents for the purpose of making an entry on any allotment or subdivision of an allotment so leased as aforesaid, in any case where a right to enter has arisen under any such lease: Now therefore the said board doth hereby appoint each of the persons whose names are set forth in the schedule to these presents to be an agent of the said board for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned, and doth authorize and empower every and each of them jointly and severally in the name of the said board to enter upon all lands so granted and demised by the said board to any person whomsoever under and by virtue of *The Amending Land Act 1865*, and the lessee thereof, his executors, administrators, or assigns, and all persons claiming under him or them for ever to expel and remove therefrom, in any case where a right to enter the same has arisen under any such lease as aforesaid.

**TOWN IN AN AGRICULTURAL AREA.**

**PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may from time to time, before or after the proclamation of any agricultural area, proclaim as a road or as a town or village any portion or portions of such area not selected, purchased, or leased, and not exceeding, if proclaimed as a town or village, six hundred and forty acres of the lands comprised in such area; and the lands in such town or village shall be sold by auction in the manner provided for the sale by public auction of lands not reserved for proclamation in such areas: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the land hereinafter described as a town in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

Six hundred and twenty acres, more or less, county unnamed, parish of Broadlands, Gipps Land: Commencing at the point where the south side of the road forming the south boundary of the Lucknow pre-emptive section abuts on the River Mitchell; bounded thence by that road bearing east One hundred and twenty-five chains, more or less, to the north-west angle of portion 33, parish of Broadlands; thence by that portion and by portion 53, bearing south one mile; thence by a road bearing west fourteen chains sixty-two links to Jones' Bay; thence by Jones' Bay, bearing north-westerly to the south-east angle of portion 28; thence by the southern boundary of that portion, bearing N. 45° W. twenty-two chains seventy-four links, and S. 40° W. twenty-four chains, more or less, to Jones' Bay; thence by that bay, bearing south-westerly to a point bearing east from the south-east angle of portion 71; thence by a line by the south boundary of that portion, by a line by the south boundary of portion 61, and by a line bearing west to the River Mitchell aforesaid; and thence by that river bearing northerly to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(66.M.13571.)

## REGULATIONS FOR THE GUIDANCE OF KEEPERS OF POWDER MAGAZINES.

IT is hereby notified for general information, that His Excellency the Governor in Council, has been pleased to cancel the Regulations for the guidance of Keepers of Powder Magazines, dated 10th September, 1860, and to approve of the following being substituted in lieu thereof.

1. Before any barrel, box, or case is received into the magazine it is to be carefully examined, and if it is not perfectly closed, so that no powder or combustible matter can escape, or should any iron be found to have been used either in its construction or repair, it is not to be received into the magazine.

2. No barrel, box, or case is on any account to be opened in the magazine; but when required, it is to be taken to a shifting shed.

3. The magazine is to be kept strictly clean and free from all gravel, sand, or grit; and no iron, light, lucifer match, greased rag, or anything liable to cause combustion, is to be permitted therein.

4. No person is to enter the magazine except with magazine slippers on, or barefooted, and then only in the presence and with the permission of the keeper.

5. No smoking or fire is to be permitted in or near the magazine or shifting sheds.

6. All tools used in coopering casks, or for any other purpose within the magazine, must be of wood or copper.

7. Where there is an outer wall surrounding the magazine, no vehicles are to be permitted to enter within such wall.

8. The attention of keepers is particularly called to the following clause of the *Importation and Custody of Gunpowder Statute 1864*, and they must be careful that the provisions thereof are strictly observed with reference to vehicles receiving powder at the magazine:—

Clause 16. "No gunpowder shall be carried from any magazine, or from any one place to any other place, in quantities exceeding ten hundredweight on the same carriage, cart, dray, or wagon; and no gunpowder whatever shall be carried on any carriage licensed or used for the conveyance of passengers, or in any railway truck attached to a train conveying passengers, nor in any cart, dray, or wagon or other carriage, unless the same be provided with suitable covering."

1. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best condition, and to be delivered in sound packages.

2. Bread. A sample of the best ordinarily retailed to the public will be considered as a test loaf for first quality. Second quality to be made of flour known in the trade as "best seconds," and the third quality (that issued for prisoners of the Crown) to be made of flour, the produce of prime wheat, from which twelve per cent. has been extracted in bran and waste.

3. Fresh meat is to be supplied in such proportions as may be required, and, when the quantity admits, to be delivered in fore and hind quarters alternately. When shins of beef form a portion of the supply, a fair proportion of the bone, not less than five inches, must have been cut off.

4. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of department, either for delivery at the Stores and Transport Office, or at the office of the department concerned, as may be stated in the order.

5. The order issued by the head of department must accompany the goods, and the account is to be rendered simultaneously with delivery of the supplies. In other cases the account is to be rendered monthly. The rates quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.

6. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order they will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the Contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a Board of Survey composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

8. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it will be procured by the person requiring it and the expense charged as in clause 6.

9. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the person to whom the rations are due, or to the contractor in waiting for a Board of Survey, the head of the department, or officer in charge of the station, will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report of the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

12. It will be competent for the Inspector of Stores, on behalf of the Government, or the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of three full calendar months, it being understood that such notice can be given only from the first day of the month.

#### SHIRE OF MOUNT ROUSE.

#### BYE-LAW No. 1.—REGULATIONS FOR CONDUCT OF BUSINESS AT MEETINGS OF THE COUNCIL.

1. The first business of each meeting of council shall be the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting, and their confirmation, unless such has already been done at the close of the former meeting; but no discussion shall take place thereupon, except as to the accuracy thereof.

2. After the disposal of the minutes—(1.) Correspondence despatched and received shall be read; (2.) Petitions and Memorials presented; (3.) Notices of Motion given; (4.) Reports brought up; (5.) Motions and Orders of the Day considered; (6.) Accounts dealt with.

3. All correspondence, after being read, must stand over for consideration until the disposal of the motions and orders of the day.

4. Petitions must be presented by a member of the council, who shall be responsible for the same being couched in respectful terms; and on the presentation of a petition, no debate shall

take place thereupon until notice has been given in the usual manner; and the only question that shall be entertained on the occasion of its presentation shall be—"That the petition be received, and if necessary, that it be referred to a committee."

5. No motion shall be discussed or decided on at any meeting of the council unless notice in writing, signed by the councillor proposing, shall have been given at a previous meeting of council; nor shall any report of committee be decided on unless similar notice be given; and the secretary shall furnish each councillor with a copy of each notice of motion three clear days at least before the meeting for which the same is given.

6. The "Orders of the Day" shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of council, and any business which the president may think fit to bring under consideration. Any member of the council may, however, bring forward such business as he may consider advisable in the form of a notice of motion, such notice to be given at the previous meeting to that at which the same is to be taken into consideration (unless the council agree to a suspension of Standing Order No. 5), and all such notices of motion shall be considered in the order in which they are given.

7. No motion entered on the notice paper shall be proceeded with unless the councillor who has given such notice, or some other councillor authorized by him, be present when the business is called in his order; and notices not so proceeded with shall be struck out of the paper.

8. No motion proposing any petition, address, bye-law, or standing order shall be entertained unless the mover shall submit therewith a draft of such petition, address, bye-law or standing order, and such draft shall not be taken into consideration until the following meeting of the council.

#### ORDER OF DEBATE.

9. Any councillor desirous of proposing a motion or amendment, or of speaking to any matter under consideration, must address the president; and no councillor, when speaking, shall be interrupted, unless called to order, in which case the councillor calling to order shall be heard thereon in preference to any other speaker, and the question of order shall be disposed of before the subject is resumed, or any other subject entered upon.

10. Any councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of such motion or amendment before addressing the council in support thereof, and deliver the written form thereof, signed by himself, to the secretary, who shall add thereto the name of the seconder. No motion or amendment so made shall be withdrawn without leave of the council.

11. No motion or amendment shall be entertained or discussed unless it be seconded.

12. If more than one councillor speak at the same time, the president, or in his absence the acting president, shall decide which is entitled to precedence.

13. No councillor shall speak twice on the same motion or amendment, except by way of explanation or in reply upon any original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of the amendment last proposed, unless by permission of a majority of the council; and the president or acting president shall, without waiting for the interposition of the council, call to order any councillor proceeding to speak a second time on the same motion or amendment; and no councillor shall be allowed to address the council on any motion or amendment after the reply. No right of reply shall be allowed the seconder of any motion or amendment, but after the reply of the mover, the motion or amendment, as the case may be, shall be immediately put to the vote.

14. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but if lost, another may be moved before the original question is put to the vote; but upon any amendment being carried, it shall be competent for any councillor to move one other amendment, but not more.

15. In taking the sense of the council, the president shall put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, or call for a show of hands in like manner.

16. No councillor shall digress from the subject-matter of question under discussion, or impute improper motives to others; and all personal reflections upon any councillor shall be considered highly disorderly.

17. Any councillor may require the secretary to take down any particular words used by a councillor immediately on the same being used.

18. Any councillor may of right require the production of any of the documents of the council relating to the question or matter under discussion.

19. Any councillor may require the enforcement of any Standing Order of the Council, by simply noticing that such Standing Order is disobeyed; and the president, when called upon to decide a point of order or practice, shall state the rule or precedent applicable to the case, without argument or comment, and his decision as to what is order or practice shall be final in such case.

20. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment; but if on the question being put, the motion be negative, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the business then undisposed of shall have precedence at the next meeting of the council.

21. Any one or more of the Standing Orders of the Council may be suspended *pro tempore* in case of emergency, provided that a majority of the councillors present shall deem such suspension necessary, but not otherwise.
