## CONSTRUCTION OF BRIDGES BY LOCAL BODIES. NOTICE TO SHIRE COUNCILS AND DISTRICT ROAD BOARDS.

SHIRE Councils and District Road Boards are informed, in relation to clause 4 of the Regulations attached to circular of 11th June last, on above subject, that progress payments from their respective grants will, where absolutely necessary, be made to them on the following scale, viz.:-

When the grant does not exceed £1000, one progress payment.

When the grant exceeds £1000 and does not exceed £2000, two progress payments.

When the grant exceeds £2000, three progress payments.

It is, however, to be distinctly understood that such payments will be made by way of re-imbursement only, not to exceed in amount two-thirds of vouchers rendered.

Local bodies requiring such progress payments must make application, stating clearly the circumstances which necessitate their seeking the accommodation, as this modification of the existing regulation is only intended to obviate special difficulties.

## VERDON AGRICULTURAL AREA COMMON DIMINISHED.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act* 1862 it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common proclaimed before or after the passing of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby diminish the Verdon Agricultural Area Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the seventeenth day of September now last past, by deducting therefrom allotments 27, 28, 29, and 30, parish of Moorngag, containing 518 acres 21 perches.—(66.M.12052.)

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this eighth day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, and in the thirtieth year of Her Majesty's reign.

and Works send.

WHEREAS under and by virtue of the 12th and 13th sections of *The Amending Land Act 1865*, the Board of Land and Works have granted certain leases under their seal of certain allotments or subdivisions of allotments in certain agricultural areas, for the term of seven years, at the rent of Two shillings per annum for each and every acre or fractional part of an acre of such allotments or subdivisions of allotments: And whereas it was provided in every such lease, and such lease was upon the condition, that in case the rent thereby reserved or any part thereof should not be paid in accordance with the covenant for payment thereinbefore contained, although no demand for payment should have been made; or if the lessee, his executors or administrators, should not before the end of the second year from the commencement of the term thereby created have made on the land thereby demised substantial and permanent improvements within the meaning of the said Act, certified in writing under the seal of the said board, or under the hands of arbitrators, or under the hand of an arbitrator appointed as provided by the said Act, to be of the value of One pound for ever

acre and fractional part of an acre of the land demised; or if the lessee, his executors, administrators, or assigns, should not faithfully observe and perform all and every the covenants and conditions herein contained, and on his or their part to be observed and performed; it should be lawful for the said board to enter forthwith or at any time thereafter upon the land thereby demised and the same to repossess and enjoy and from thenceforth the said term thereby granted should absolutely cease and determine; and it was thereby agreed and declared that in any such case it should be lawful for the said board, and for any bailiff of Crown lands, or for any other agents or officers of the said board authorized in that behalf, without any demand whatsoever, to enter upon the land thereby demised, and the lessee, his executors or administrators, and all persons claiming under him or them for ever to expel and remove therefrom, without any legal process whatsoever and as effectually as any sheriff might do in case the said board had obtained judgment in ejectment for recovery of possession of the said land, and a writ of *habere facias possessionem* or other process had issued on such judgment directed to such sheriff in due form of law: And whereas the said board is desirous of appointing agents for the purpose of making an entry on any allotment or subdivision of an allotment so leased as aforesaid, in any case where a right to enter has arisen under any such lease: Now therefore the said board doth hereby appoint each of the persons whose names are set forth in the schedule to these presents to be an agent of the said board for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned, and doth authorize and empower every and each of them jointly and severally in the name of the said board to enter upon all lands so granted and demised by the said board to any person whomsoever under and by virtue of *The Amending Land Act 1865*, and the lessee thereof, his executors, administrators, or assigns, and all persons claiming under him or them for ever to expel and remove therefrom, in any case where a right to enter the same has arisen under any such lease as aforesaid.

## REMARKS ON MANUKAU HARBOR, BY THOMAS WING, HARBOR MASTER.

Subsequently to Captain Sidney's survey of the entrance of the Manukau, and to his report in 1863, the following changes and improvements, hereby notified for general information, have been made.

A signal-mast has been erected on the South Head at the entrance of the harbor, and is now attended for the purpose of signalling vessels to and from sea. The signals are similar to those formerly used on the North Head (Paratutai), signified in the present Harbor Regulations for general use. Also three large iron buoys have been placed in the southern channel in the positions hereafter mentioned. In future there will not be any fairway buoys as formerly, in consequence of their having been so frequently damaged and sunk by vessels while passing in and out of the harbor. But in place of fairway buoys, two large beacons, cone-shaped at top, 600 feet apart, are now erected on the South Head, about 400 feet above the sea-beach, painted white, with a vertical red stripe in the centre; and by keeping the same in one, bearing about N.E. by N. (magnetic), from sea, will lead a fairway course between the shoals to the turning of the channel at the Tranmeer and Treachery buoys; and by keeping northward along the line of beach, the South Head and Emma Spit buoys will be plainly seen. Two beacons in line are now being erected on the north side of the harbor to guide vessels through this part of the channel, particularly as a guide when the buoys are missing or otherwise out of place.

## Buoys in Southern Channel.

South Head Spit Buoy—Red; placed in three and a half fathoms water low-water, near the spit, with low beacon at South Head, bearing S.E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E., magnetic.

Emma Spit Buoy—Black; placed at the extreme N.E. end of the shoal, in three and a half fathoms low-water.

Tranmeer Shoal Buoy—Black; placed at the eastern part of the shoal, in three and a half fathoms low-water.

Treachery Shoal Buoy—Red; placed at the eastern part of the shoal in four fathoms low-water.

Note.—As the shoals at the entrance of the harbor are liable to shift (although not very frequently), care should be taken to follow the telegraphic signals given by the signal man at the signal station, particularly when there is strength in the tide, which has a strong tendency to set towards and through the swatchways in the shoals, which should be avoided as far as possible.

## Tides.

High-water at the full and change of the moon at the entrance of the harbor, 9.30 a.m.; and the rise and fall of tides may be taken to be as follows: Neaps about eight feet, and springs twelve feet—at ordinary tides running (at half-tide) from four to six knots between the South Head and Emma spits, decreasing gradually to about three miles per hour as you leave this part of the channel.

## Sailing Directions for Southern Channel—Inwards.

On entering the Manukau Harbor by the Southern Channel from the south, the soundings should not be less than six or seven fathoms before bringing the South Head beacons in one, bearing about N.E. by N. (magnetic); and should it be strong flood when in the vicinity of the Tranmeer and Treachery shoals, care should be taken not to keep northward, so as to open the South Head beacons to the eastward, until in four or five fathoms water to the N.E. of the Tranmeer Shoal buoy, or the proposed beacons on the north side of the harbor are brought in one; and then by steering northward along the line of beach, the South Head and Emma Spit buoys will be plainly seen, when a vessel may proceed up the harbor into safe anchorage.

Note.—The flood-tide, after reaching the South Head shoals, has a tendency to set across the Treachery and Tranmeer shoals, passing through a narrow channel between the Tranmeer shoal and Emma bank, which channel should be avoided except when the tide is well in, and then should only be navigated by vessels of light draft of water. The soundings in the channel have been recently examined and found to be very uneven, having only six and seven feet water in places near it at low tide; but from this locality the flood sets fair into the harbor along the shore.

## Directions for the Southern Channel—Outward bound.

On leaving the Manukau by the Southern Channel, on the ebb-tide, care should be taken to keep the South Head shore aboard by one-fourth of the distance across the harbor, so as to keep a midway course between the South Head and Emma Spit

buoys (or the north leading beacons in one now being erected). This precaution, as a rule, will be the means of preventing the vessel being set past the South Channel into the influence of the main channel tide, which may bring her in contact with the Emma Bank, or otherwise cause loss of time in regaining a proper position, should the bar be unsafe. Once a vessel has fairly entered the Southern Channel between the South Head and Emma Spit buoys, the ebb-tide sets fair towards the Tranmeer, and there will not be much difficulty in working to sea with a westerly wind in moderate weather. After passing the Tranmeer buoy on the starboard hand, with a westerly wind, it will be advisable not to open the South Head beacons in a northerly direction more than about three times their width, when, by tacking to the north-westward the whole force of the ebb-tide will be brought on the vessel's lee, setting to windward clear of the Tranmeer Shoal, and by making short tacks on the line of South Head beacons will soon set the vessel to sea clear of the influence of the tide, which has a tendency to set over the south part of the Treachery and South Head shoals.

Note.—The South Head beacons are placed on sliding ways for moving so as to be adjusted to lead the channel course as circumstances may require in cases of the shoals shifting, and if required the beacons can be used as lighthouses.

## Main Channel.

The present directions for crossing the bar are to get the signal-mast on the South Head to bear E. by N.  $\frac{1}{2}$  N. (magnetic) on the Ninepin Rock, in line with the tangent of the inner point of the South Head, as shown on the chart and sketch by Commander Sydney, R.N., in 1863. This course will lead a fair way over the bar, carrying three and a half fathoms at low water. After crossing the bar, a glance at the chart will be sufficient to keep the channel. To cross the bar at low-water is not advisable unless the water be very smooth, with a commanding breeze or steam. As a rule, it will be better to wait for half-flood or near high-water, and after having crossed the bar, and arrived to eight or nine fathoms water in the vicinity of the Orpheus Shoal, it will be necessary to steer along the line of break in the middle banks, distance about one quarter of a mile, which will clear and leave the Orwell Shoal on the port hand. From this, towards Paratutai, the channel leads straight into the harbor. The main channel is seldom used since the South Channel has been buoyed and beaconed, and the Signal Station removed from the North to the South Head, where the site is less obstructed by back land. The Southern Channel, in general, is preferred, in consequence of being more sheltered and accessible at times when the main bar is dangerous.

Note.—The flood comes from the northward, setting along the shore from one to two knots; but when coming in contact with the banks about the bar, it trends into the channel, increasing its rate to four or five knots as it approaches the Heads.

Care should be taken to guard against the cross-tides about the spits and swatchways, when near them; but in the middle of the main channel the tides set fair in and out of the harbor.

The prevailing winds are from N.W. to S.W.; it seldom blows a gale from the southward, the wind moderating as it draws from S.W. to southward. Easterly gales are not frequent, and generally shift suddenly to the westward in a violent squall, and bring heavy rain. The gales rarely continue long in one quarter, and a strong breeze from N.W. or even W.S.W., as a rule, does not cause a heavy sea in the South Channel, which can be taken with safety towards high-water. The bar, with such winds, generally speaking, breaks, and sometimes dangerously, towards low-water; but, in case the gale gets to the S.W., the sea will break right across both channels, but less across the South Channel, which is never at any time so dangerous as the main. This, however, is of short duration, and seldom lasts over a day and night, when by the morning it becomes moderate, and the South Channel free of break (even though there is considerable swell outside and the banks breaking heavily) and safe to enter at proper time of tide, say half-flood, or even at first quarter ebb, with a commanding breeze or steam.

## Barometer.

A falling barometer generally indicates a change to a northerly quarter, to be shortly attended with rain; and, in case the barometer begins to rise, expect wind. When the barometer is ranging about 30 in. steady weather may be expected from the westward; a high barometer, say above 31 inches, and the land appearing very clear and nearer than usual, is (as a rule) a sign of a change to the eastward. On the coast of New Zealand, for many years past, I have observed that very clear and cloudless nights are indications of a change being at hand, either wind or rain.

## FENCING ACROSS OR OBSTRUCTING SURVEYED ROADS.

THE Board of Land and Works having learned that in many districts of the colony, persons have without authority fenced across and otherwise obstructed surveyed roads, directs attention to the 25th section of *The Amending Land Act 1865*, which prescribes the penalty for such offences.

In order to enforce the law, the Officers of Police throughout the colony are authorised as Bailiffs of Crown Lands to prosecute all such offenders.

"If any person shall dig any ditch trench or drain or erect or cause to be erected any fence on or across any proclaimed road or any surveyed road without the consent of the Board of Land and Works which consent shall be published in the *Government Gazette* he shall forfeit and pay on conviction a penalty of not less than two pounds nor more than ten pounds but nothing herein contained shall apply to any gate erected and continued by the written consent of the Board of Land and Works if such gate shall not be locked or otherwise permanently fastened."

Every tender must bear the *bona fide* signatures and addresses of the tenderer, and of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the same in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

Every tender must be accompanied by a bank deposit-receipt for a sum equal to twenty per cent. of the amount for which the tenderer is willing to undertake the service; the money to be lodged to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster General, and to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete, within ten days of the date of notice being given of the acceptance of his tender, the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient. On completion of bond the deposit money will be returned, on application and receipt being given for the amount.

The money deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them on application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts, but not otherwise.

Persons tendering are requested to state the description of the vehicle they intend to use, and the number of horses by which it is to be drawn.

In cases where vehicles are intended to be used, tenderers are requested to state what additional charge, if any, would be made for the free conveyance of Members of Parliament along the line of road between the districts they represent and Melbourne.

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Inspector of Stores, Melbourne; the Sheriffs at Geelong, Ararat, Ballarat, Beechworth, Castlemaine, Kilmore, Maryborough, Sandhurst, and Portland; from the officers in charge of the police at Belfast, Warrnambool, and Palmerston; and from the officer in charge of the Industrial School, Sunbury; by whom also information will be afforded to persons tendering.

The value of all packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the price demanded (except flour, meal, and potato bags, which will be returned when empty).

Tenderers must state the security proposed, whether in debentures, bank deposit-receipt, cash deposit, or sureties; if the latter, the certificate on the printed form of tender must be signed by two responsible persons willing to become bound in the sum specified for the due fulfilment of the contract, and the names of the tenderers and their proposed sureties, together with their respective addresses, must be stated at full length upon such certificate.

Tenders must be accompanied by bank notes, or a bank draft in favor of the Chairman of the Tender Board, for ten per cent. of the amount of security required, which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the proscribed period.

The Government may elect to require a cash deposit; but any approved security must be completed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders will be disqualified from tendering for Government supplies for a period of twelve months.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

All tenders must be enclosed in a separate envelope, marked "Tenders for —" (as the case may be), and be deposited in the Tender-box at the Government Stores, King street; or (if sent by post) must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Stores and Transport Office, Melbourne.

#### CONDITIONS.

1. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best condition, and to be delivered in sound packages.

2. Bread. A sample of the best ordinarily retailed to the public will be considered as a test loaf for first quality. Second quality, to be made of flour known in the trade as "best seconds," and the third quality (that issued for prisoners of the Crown) to be made of flour, the produce of prime wheat, from which twelve per cent. has been extracted in bran and waste.

3. Fresh meat is to be supplied in such proportions as may be required, and, when the quantity admits, to be delivered in fore and hind quarters alternately. When shins of beef form a portion of the supply, a fair proportion of the bone, not less than five inches, must have been cut off.

4. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of department, either for delivery at the Stores and Transport Office, or at the office of the department concerned, as may be stated in the order.

5. The order issued by the head of department must accompany the goods, and the account is to be rendered simultaneously with delivery of the supplies. In other cases the account is to be rendered monthly. The rates quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.

6. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order they will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the Contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a Board of Survey composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

8. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it will be procured by the person requiring it and the expense charged as in clause 6.

9. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the person to whom the rations are due, or to the contractor in waiting for a Board of Survey, the head of the department, or officer in charge of the station, will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report of the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

12. It will be competent for the Inspector of Stores, on behalf of the Government, or the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of three full calendar months, it being understood that such notice can be given only from the first day of the month.

#### BOROUGH-COUNCIL OF STEIGLITZ.

BYE-LAW No. 1.—A BYE-LAW TO REGULATE, BY MEANS OF STANDING ORDERS, THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF STEIGLITZ.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Colony of Victoria, intituled *An Act to consolidate and amend the Laws relating to Municipal Institutions*, 11th Sept., 1863, No. 184, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Borough Councils from time to time to make such bye-laws as they think fit for the purpose of regulating the conduct of their officers and servants, and for providing for the due management of the affairs of the Council, and for other purposes: Be it therefore enacted by the Council of the Borough of Steiglitz, that from and after the date of this bye-law coming into operation, the proceedings and business of this Council shall be conducted according to the following regulations only, which shall be and be called the Standing Orders of the aforesaid Council, that is to say:—

##### ORDER OF PROCEEDINGS.

1. The business of the council shall be conducted on all ordinary occasions with open doors, unless it shall become necessary to exclude strangers on account of their disorderly conduct.

2. The council shall commence business at the time appointed by resolution or as soon after as a quorum shall be present; but if at the expiration of half an hour after the time appointed for holding the meeting there be not a quorum present, then the meeting shall be adjourned to the second day after such meeting at the same hour.

3. At all meetings appointed to take place, and there is not a quorum present, or when the council shall be counted out, such circumstances, together with the names of the councillors present, shall be recorded in the minute book.

4. The minutes of any preceding meeting not previously confirmed shall be read as the first business at all meetings of the council, in order to their confirmation, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings of the council; and upon their being confirmed, or amended and confirmed, as the case may be, shall be signed by the chairman.

5. At all meetings of the council, the reading of correspondence unconnected with the orders of the day, the presentation of petitions by members of the council, and the bringing up of reports of committee, shall have precedence of the regular business.

6. Every petition or memorial addressed to the council shall be in proper form, and presented by one of the members, who shall be responsible for its being respectfully worded.

7. On the presentation of a petition, no debate shall take place thereon until notice has been given in the usual manner; and the only question that shall be entertained on the occasion of its presentation shall be, that it be received, that it be referred to a committee, or if thought advisable, that it be made an order of the day.

8. Reports of committees shall be read and received *pro forma*, and if ordered by the council shall be printed for distribution among the members; but if in the report of a committee there are distinct recommendations contained, such report shall not be adopted until the sense of the council has been taken separately on each subject.

9. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the council, and business which the mayor may think fit to bring under consideration.

10. No councillor shall propose any motion initiating a subject for discussion but in pursuance of a notice openly given at a previous meeting of the council; and duly entered on the minutes; and such notice must be given immediately after the orders of the day are disposed of. Notice of motion shall be fairly written and signed by the councillor giving such notice, who shall read it aloud and give it to the town clerk. One councillor may, however, give notice of motion for an absent councillor.

11. No notice entered on the notice paper shall be proceeded with, unless the member who has given such notice, or some councillor authorized by him, be present when the business is called in order. Notices not so proceeded with shall be struck off the notice paper.

##### ORDER OF DEBATE.

12. The members in speaking shall designate each other by their respective titles, as mayor, or councillor, as the case may be.

13. Any councillor desirous of proposing a motion or amendment, or of discussing any matter under consideration, must rise and address the mayor or other presiding chairman; and no councillor when speaking shall be interrupted, unless called to order, when he shall sit down, in which case the councillor calling to order shall be heard thereon in preference to any other speaker, and the question of order shall be disposed of before the subject is resumed, or any other subject entered upon.

14. Any councillor desirous of proposing either an original motion or amendment must state the nature of such motion or amendment before addressing the council in support thereof.

15. No motion or amendment shall be entertained or discussed unless it be seconded. Motions and amendments not seconded shall lapse.

16. No councillor shall speak twice on the same motion or amendment except by way of explanation, or in reply upon any original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of the amendment last proposed. Any councillor proposing or seconding a motion or amendment shall be held to have spoken on the question.

17. No councillor shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or impute improper motives to

others; and all personal reflections upon any member of the corporation shall be considered highly disorderly.

18. The mayor or other presiding chairman when called upon to decide a point of order or practice, shall state the rule or precedent applicable to the case, and his decision of what is order shall be final in each case.

19. The mayor or other presiding chairman shall stand up when addressing the council upon any question.

20. Any councillor who shall use any expression capable of being applied offensively to any other councillor, shall, if required by the council, withdraw such expression and make a satisfactory apology to the council, or shall be liable to a penalty, in case he refuse or neglect to do so before the rising of the council, not exceeding Five pounds.

21. Any councillor may require the town clerk to take down any particular words used by a councillor immediately upon the same being uttered.

22. If two or more councillors rise to speak at the same time, the mayor or other presiding chairman shall decide which is entitled to pre-eminence.

23. Any councillor having proposed a motion or amendment may withdraw the same, but if seconded shall only do so by leave of the council.

24. Questions may be superseded—1st, By the adjournment of the council on the motion of a councillor that this council do now adjourn. 2nd, That the order of the day be now read. 3rd, By the previous question, viz., That this question be now put being proposed and negatived.

25. If the previous question be resolved in the affirmative, the original question shall be put forthwith without any amendment or debate.

26. The council may order a complicated question to be divided.

27. So soon as the debate upon any subject shall be concluded, the mayor or other presiding chairman shall put the question to the council in a distinct and audible manner.

28. The question being put shall be resolved in the affirmative or negative by the majority of votes by a show of hands.

29. No motion or amendment, which is the same in substance as any previous resolution of the council during the current year of the council which has been resolved either in the negative or affirmative, shall be a resolution of the council, unless carried by a majority of two-thirds of the members present, upon a call of the council.

30. A question may be amended by leaving out or adding words, such questions to be altered by the mayor or other chairman putting such alteration that the words proposed to be added to or struck out stand part of the question, and shall be resolved by the council in the affirmative or negative.

31. No amendment shall be proposed in any part of a question after a later part has been amended and resolved by the council.

32. The council shall have the power of altering any question or resolution of a committee of the whole or of vetoing the same.

#### COMMITTEES OF THE WHOLE.

33. A committee of the whole council must be appointed by resolution—That this council do now resolve itself into a committee of the whole for the purpose of considering and that take the chair.

34. The quorum of committee of the whole shall be the same as that required for the council, and shall consider only such questions as bye-laws and other questions that may be referred to them by the council.

35. Every question shall be decided by a majority of votes, the chairman to give his casting vote in addition to his vote as a member of committee.

36. If any disorder may arise in committee, the mayor or other presiding chairman of the council shall resume his seat without any question being put, and the chairman of committee shall be heard as to the disorder, and the member in fault shall be called upon for an apology; and in case of refusal, to be dealt with as provided in clause 20 of this bye-law.

37. During the time of sitting of a committee a motion may be made that the chairman do now report progress and ask leave to sit again; and being resolved in the affirmative, the mayor or other presiding chairman shall take his seat, and the council resume its functions.

38. When matters referred to a committee of the whole have been considered, the chairman shall report the same to the council.

39. Members of committee may speak more than once on the same subject.

#### ATTENDANCE OF MEMBERS.

40. Every member of the council shall attend at each ordinary meeting of the council according to resolution; if absent for four consecutive ordinary meetings, the council shall declare the seat of such absent councillor vacant, without a sufficient excuse be sent by or given by a councillor for the absent member.

41. Calls of the council may be made on the motion of a member duly carried, and such motion shall state the business for which such calls are made, and the day and hour of meeting.

42. No order for a call of the council shall be made for any day earlier than six days from the notice being given, such notice to be given to each member of the council by a notice either written or printed, and delivered at his residence or sent by post.

43. At every call of the council, as soon as the minutes of the previous meeting have been read and confirmed, the names of the members of the council shall be called over by the town clerk, and any member not answering to his name, or be present when the name is called over, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence; and if he fail to be in attendance on the expiration of the half-hour after the time appointed for holding the meeting, or sending a sufficient apology for his inability to attend, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

#### SUSPENSION OF STANDING ORDERS.

44. It shall be competent for the council to suspend any of these standing orders on the motion of a councillor, and concurred in by the votes of two-thirds of the members present; but the councillor proposing the motion shall show the imperative necessity for such suspension in order that he may introduce the subject-matter to the council.

#### BOROUGH OF STEIGLITZ.

BYE-LAW No. 2 OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF STEIGLITZ.—  
A BYE-LAW TO ADOPT BYE-LAW No. 37 OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF BALLARAT.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of the colony of Victoria, intituled *An Act to consolidate and amend the Laws relating to Municipal Institutions*, 11th September, 1863, No. 154, it was among other things enacted that borough councils shall have power to make bye-laws for various purposes, and may by bye-law adopt any bye-laws already legally in force in any of the boroughs mentioned in the second schedule to the said Act; and whereas it is expedient that the Council of the Borough of Steiglitz, aforesaid, pass a bye-law for the preservation of the public health and the suppression of nuisances, be it therefore ordained that the Bye-law No. 37, of the Municipal Council of Ballarat, be adopted by the Council of the Borough of Steiglitz, as Bye-law No. 2, and which is as follows:—

Whereas by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to make bye-laws for the preservation of the public health, the suppression of nuisances, and the restraining of noisome or offensive trades; be it therefore ordered and directed by the Municipal Council of the District of Ballarat, that if at any time the trade or business of any person or persons being the owner or occupier of any candle-house, melting-house, melting place, or soap-house, or any slaughter-house, or any building or place for boiling offal or blood, or for boiling, burning, or crushing bones, or any manufactory, building or place used for any trade, business process or manufacture causing effluvia, shall be carried on so as to be a nuisance or cause any effluvia injurious to the health of the inhabitants of the neighborhood, such person or persons shall forthwith, after receiving written notice from the local inspector of nuisances, use the best practical means of abating such nuisance or preventing or counteracting such effluvia.

Any person guilty of any breach or neglect of this bye-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction before two or more justices of the peace, a penalty or sum not exceeding Twenty pounds.
