CONSTRUCTION OF BRIDGES BY LOCAL BODIES. NOTICE TO SHIRE COUNCILS AND DISTRICT ROAD BOARDS.

SHIRE Councils and District Road Boards are informed, in relation to clause 4 of the Regulations attached to the circular of 11th June last, on the above subject, that progress payments from their respective grants will, where absolutely necessary, be made to them on the following scale, viz.:-

When the grant does not exceed £1000, one progress payment.

When the grant exceeds £1000 and does not exceed £2000, two progress payments.

When the grant exceeds £2000, three progress payments.

It is, however, to be distinctly understood that such payments will be made by way of re-imbursement only, not to exceed in amount two-thirds of vouchers rendered.

Local bodies requiring such progress payments must make application, stating clearly the circumstances which necessitate their seeking the accommodation, as this modification of the existing regulation is only intended to obviate special difficulties.

At the Court at Osborne House, Isle of Wight, the ninth day of August, 1866.

PRESENT:

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Passengers Act 1855 it is enacted, that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by any Order in Council, to prescribe such rules and regulations as to Her Majesty may seem fit, for certain purposes in the said Act specified, and, amongst others, for requiring duly qualified medical practitioners to be carried in passenger ships in cases where they would not be required to be carried under the provisions of the said Act; and such Order in Council from time to time, in like manner, to alter, amend, and revoke as occasion may require:

And whereas from the prevalence of choleraic disease in certain parts of the United Kingdom, it has become expedient that Her Majesty should exercise the discretion and authority so vested in Her as aforesaid:

Now therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, and in pursuance and exercise of the authority

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vested in Her by the said Passengers Act 1855, doth hereby order as follows, that is to say:

From and after the 20th instant, and so long as this Order shall continue in force, every passenger ship carrying more than 50 passengers on any voyage to which the said Act extends shall, whatever be the duration of the voyage, and subject to the provisions of the 42nd section of the said Act, carry a duly qualified medical practitioner, who shall be rated on the ship's articles.

To prevent all doubts in the construction of this Order in Council, it is hereby further ordered, that the terms "passenger" and "passenger ship" shall have the same significations as are assigned to them respectively in the said Passengers Act 1855, and unless inconsistent with the context words of one number shall import both numbers.

And the Right Honorable the Earl of Carnarvon, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted, that where there are two or more neighboring commons the Governor in Council may proclaim that the same shall be a common under the name of "The United Town and Gold-field [or, as the case may be] Common of" for the benefit of all persons entitled to commonage on either: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the neighboring commons hereinafter mentioned to be a United Common, under the following name, that is to say:—

THE UNITED FARMERS' COMMON OF BAGSHOT, GOORNONG, ELLESMERE, AND NOLAN, comprising the Bagshot and Goornong Farmers' Common (described in two several Proclamations bearing date respectively the eighteenth day of March, 1861, and the twelfth day of September, 1864), and the Ellesmere and Nolan Farmers' Common (described in a Proclamation bearing date the sixteenth day of November, 1863) and the said United Common shall be for the benefit of all persons entitled to commonage on either of the above-mentioned commons.—(66.M.12888.)

CHAPMAN AGRICULTURAL AREA COMMON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land a farmers' common; when one-eighth part of any agricultural area has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim any unselected and unleased portion of such agricultural area, not exceeding twice the quantity so selected and leased, to be a temporary common for the use of such selectors and lessees: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the area hereinafter mentioned to be temporary common for the use of lessees and selectors in the under-mentioned agricultural area in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

The allotments and piece of land hereinafter enumerated, comprising an area of 2,125 acres, more or less, shall be a tem-

porary Common for the use of selectors and lessees in the agricultural area of Chapman, viz.:—Parish of Merrybuela, allotments 6, 8, 9, 12, 13, 20, 21, and 22, and the water reserve lying between the Port Fairy and Ararat road and the River Hopkins, and adjoining Chirnside and Logan's pre-emptive section on the south, as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(66.N.10850.)

WHEREAS by the *Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the commons hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, that is to say:—

BRANXHOLME TOWN COMMON.—The Town Common of Branxholme is hereby increased by adding thereto two hundred and fourteen acres twenty-seven perches of land, being allotment 8 of section 33, parish of Yulecart, and the unappropriated portion of allotment 9 of section 6, parish of Branxholme.—(66.M.12236.)

Tenderers must state the security proposed, whether in debentures, bank deposit-receipt, cash deposit, or sureties; if the latter, the certificate on the printed form of tender must be signed by two responsible persons willing to become bound in the sum specified for the due fulfilment of the contract, and the names of the tenderers and their proposed sureties, together

with their respective addresses, must be stated at full length upon such certificate.

Tenders must be accompanied by bank notes, or a bank draft in favor of the Chairman of the Tender Board, for ten per cent. of the amount of security required, which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

The Government may elect to require a cash deposit; but any approved security must be completed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders will be disqualified from tendering for Government supplies for a period of twelve months.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

All tenders must be enclosed in a separate envelope, marked "Tenders for ——" (as the case may be), and be deposited in the Tender-box at the Government Stores, King street; or (if sent by post) must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Stores and Transport Office, Melbourne.

CONDITIONS.

1. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best condition, and to be delivered in sound packages.

2. Bread. A sample of the best ordinarily retailed to the public will be considered as a test loaf for first quality. Second quality to be made of flour known in the trade as "best seconds," and the third quality (that issued for prisoners of the Crown) to be made of flour, the produce of prime wheat, from which twelve per cent. has been extracted in bran and waste.

3. Fresh meat is to be supplied in such proportions as may be required, and, when the quantity admits, to be delivered in fore and hind quarters alternately. When shins of beef form a portion of the supply, a fair proportion of the bone, not less than five inches, must have been cut off.

4. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of department, either for delivery at the Stores and Transport Office, or at the office of the department concerned, as may be stated in the order.

5. The order issued by the head of department must accompany the goods, and the account is to be rendered simultaneously with delivery of the supplies. In other cases the account is to be rendered monthly. The rates quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.

6. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order they will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the Contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a Board of Survey composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

8. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it will be procured by the person requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 6.

9. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the person to whom the rations are due, or to the contractor in waiting for a Board of Survey, the head of the department, or officer in charge of the station, will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report of the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

12. It will be competent for the Inspector of Stores, on behalf of the Government, or the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of three full calendar months, it being understood that such notice can be given only from the first day of the month.

BYE-LAWS OF THE DUNOLLY DISTRICT HOSPITAL OBJECT.

THE object of the institution shall be to afford medical and surgical aid to poor persons requiring the same, and for casualties, but no person who shall meet with casualties and who shall, in the opinion of the committee be considered able to pay for such aid, shall receive further than temporary assistance.

GENERAL MEETINGS.

2. At all meetings of contributors the president, vice-president, or treasurer, as the case may be, shall take the chair, but in their absence the meeting shall choose its own chairman, who shall, in the event of an equality of votes, have a casting in addition to a deliberative vote.

3. The annual meeting of contributors to the hospital shall be held on the second Thursday in the month of January in every year, for the following purposes, viz. —

1. To receive the annual report of the committee of management.
2. For the election of a president, vice-president, and treasurer.
3. For the election of members of the committee of management, in the places of those retiring, under rule 9.
4. For the election of two honorary medical officers and two auditors.
4. All disputes as to the validity of any election shall be referred to and be determined by the committee of management.
5. At all meeting of contributors twelve shall constitute a quorum, and as soon as a quorum is present the chair shall be taken, but if no quorum be present within half an hour of the time named, such meeting shall stand adjourned to the following week at the same day and hour.

6. At all general meetings, benefactors of £10, or annual contributors of £1 and under £3, shall have one vote; and benefactors of £20, or annual contributors of £3 and under £5, two votes; and benefactors of £50, or annual contributors of £5 and upwards, three votes; and at such meetings contributors may vote either in person or by proxy, such proxy being a contributor duly qualified.

7. It shall be competent for the committee of management or any twenty or more contributors, by a writing under their hands, to require the secretary to summon a special meeting of contributors, the occasion of calling such meeting being specified in the requisition; and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting except that for which it shall have been summoned; and every such meeting shall be convened by the Secretary by advertisement in one or more local papers, at least one week before the day of meeting.

CONSTITUTION.

(Extracts from Act of Incorporation.)

8. The governing committee, in whom is vested the powers and authorities of this corporation, shall consist of the president, vice-president, and treasurer for the time being, and seven contributors. — (27 Vict., No. 220, sec. 4.)

9. On the second Thursday in the month of January in every year, one-third part of the elected members of the committee shall go out of office, but may nevertheless be re-elected; and the persons who shall go out of office shall be those who have been the longest in office without re-election; or where two or

more shall have been in office the same length of time, then those who shall go out of office shall be determined by lot.—(27 Vict., No. 220, sec. 11.)

10. The president, vice-president, treasurer, honorary medical officers, and auditors shall retire annually from their respective offices, but shall nevertheless be eligible for re-election.

11. If any member of the committee shall die, or resign by letter under his hand addressed to the chairman of the committee, or become insolvent, or compound with his creditors, or be convicted of any treason, felony, or misdemeanor, or be absent for four consecutive meetings from the committee, his office shall become vacant, and the remaining members of the committee may declare his office vacant, and temporarily appoint thereto some contributor to such institution until the next annual meeting, when the person thus temporarily appointed shall retire, as one of those who by the provisions of this Act are required to go out of office.—(27 Vict., No. 220 sec. 12.)

12. Whenever any vacancy shall occur in the office of president, vice-president, treasurer, or auditor, or in the honorary medical staff, the committee of management shall appoint some person to fill such vacancy until the next annual meeting.

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT.

13. No person shall be qualified to be a member of the committee of management except he be a contributor to the institution of not less than one pound.

14. The committee of management may suspend any member of the honorary medical staff, provided that an absolute majority of the committee concur in such suspension, and provided that the suspension, and cause thereof, be reported to a general meeting of contributors, to be specially convened for that purpose, within two weeks after the order of suspension be made.

15. The committee of management shall direct the general business of the hospital; shall frame bye-laws in accordance with the Act, and rules for the internal regulation; shall enter into contracts for the supply of provisions and other articles for the use of the hospital, and direct payment to be made for the same; and shall appoint and discharge all paid officers and servants of the institution. They shall meet at least once in every month, on such day as they may appoint. They shall superintend and give all necessary directions for the admission, discharge, and dismissal of patients; in accordance with the terms and spirit of the general rules. The chairman of committee, who shall be the president, when present, the vice-president, in his absence, or some other member, in their absence, shall have a casting vote in addition to a deliberative vote.

16. Three members of committee shall, by writing under their hands, be at liberty at any time to require the secretary to summon a special meeting of committee to be held within two weeks from the delivery thereof. Notice of such meeting shall be given to each member, by circular, by the secretary; and the occasion for calling the meeting shall be stated, both in the requisition and summons, and no other business than that so stated or clearly indicated shall be transacted at such meeting.

17. The committee shall present a general report of the affairs of the hospital at the meeting of contributors to be held in the month of January in each year, together with a full statement of the accounts, duly audited; of the corporation, for the preceding year, from the first of January to the thirty-first of December inclusive.

18. Sub-committees may be appointed from time to time, at the discretion of the committee of management.

19. At the first meeting of the committee in each year, after the annual general meeting, the following sub-committees shall be appointed, viz.:

1. A visiting committee, to consist of two members, for each month in the year.
2. A finance committee, to consist of three members.

ORDER OF PROCEEDINGS.

20. All ordinary meetings of committee shall be summoned by circular by the secretary, three days at least before the day of meeting; four members of committee to form a quorum.

21. No person shall be a member of committee and a salaried officer of the institution at the same time; nor shall any salaried officer be present at any committee meeting except when specially requested to attend.

22. The president or vice-president, if present, shall preside at the meetings of the committee; but in their absence the meeting shall appoint its own chairman.

23. The committee shall commence business as soon after the time notified, if there is a sufficient number of members present to constitute a quorum; but if, at the expiration of half an hour from the time specified, there be not a quorum present, the meeting shall stand adjourned until the corresponding day and hour in the following week.

24. No business shall be entered upon until the minutes of the previous meeting have been read, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy.

25. No proposition to enact or amend a bye-law, or to frame or vary any rule, shall be entertained, unless one month's previous notice shall have been given of such; and no motion to rescind a resolution shall be submitted within three months after such resolution has been passed unless one month's notice of the same be given, and such motion be passed by an absolute majority of the whole committee.

26. No motion, except on ordinary business, shall be entertained unless three days' notice of the same shall have been given to the secretary, who shall notify the same in the summons to each member of the committee.

27. No member of committee shall vote or take part in the discussion of any matter in or before the committee in which he shall directly or indirectly, by himself or his partners, have any pecuniary interest; and no person shall vote at any meeting of subscribers while he is a salaried officer of the institution.

PRIVILEGES OF CONTRIBUTORS AND BENEFACTORS.

28. Every contributor of not less than One pound per annum shall be eligible to be a member of committee, and shall, if the funds and accommodation of the hospital permit, be at liberty to recommend for the current year in which the subscription is paid, free patients as follows, viz.:

For every annual contribution of One guinea, one (1) out-door patient.

For every annual contribution of Two guineas, one (1) in-door or three (3) out-door patients.

For every annual contribution of Three guineas, two (2) in-door or six (6) out-door patients.

For every annual contribution of Five guineas, three (3) in-door or nine (9) out-door patients.

For every annual contribution of Ten guineas, nine (9) in-door or twelve (12) out-door patients.

29. Every person collecting and paying in Two guineas in one year by subscription-boxes shall be allowed to recommend one (1) in-door or three (3) out-door patients for every such sum so collected, but shall not have the right of voting by virtue of such collection.

30. Every benefactor of Twenty guineas and upwards shall be eligible for life to be a member of committee, and shall have the privilege of recommending in each year two (2) in-door or three (3) out-door patients.

31. Every public or corporate body which shall contribute an annual sum of Five pounds and upwards shall be entitled to recommend, for the current year, the same number of patients as private contributors of like amount, but shall not have the right of voting.

32. Every executor (under any will) paying to the institution a bequest of Fifty pounds or upwards, and every person (not being a paid collector) raising in one year the sum of Fifty pounds or upwards, and every other person elected at an annual meeting at the recommendation of the out-going committee, in consideration of special services rendered to the institution, shall be entitled to the privileges of benefactors of Twenty guineas.

33. Every clergyman paying, to the institution the sum of Three pounds or upwards, from collections in his church, shall be entitled to recommend the same number of patients as private contributors of like amount, but shall not have the right of voting.

34. Every annual contributor of One pound shall receive a yearly ticket which shall entitle him, and him only, to one admission in every current year to the hospital and all its benefits, as an in-door patient or to out-door relief as often as occasion may require in every current year. Provided that if on application for admission or relief, or subsequently, such contributor be found possessed of sufficient means the provisions of Rule 92 shall be strictly enforced.

35. Every yearly subscription shall be paid in advance, and every first yearly payment shall be calculated from the date of such payment.

36. The privileges of annual contributors shall continue in force for twelve months, only, and shall be suspended until all arrears be paid.

37. Every firm or partnership becoming contributors shall exercise their privileges through some one member of the same.

TREASURER.

38. All monies received on account of the hospital shall be paid to the treasurer, and appropriated by him to the purposes of the institution under the direction of the committee of management, and he shall deposit all monies received by him, whenever the same shall amount to Five pounds, in such bank as the committee shall direct, and place the same to the account of the "Dunolly District Hospital."

39. Previous to making any payment the treasurer shall require a warrant of the committee of management authorizing such payment, which shall be signed by the president or chairman of meeting and countersigned by the secretary; and all cheques for payment shall be signed by the treasurer and one member of the finance committee, and countersigned by the secretary.

SECRETARY.

40. The secretary shall have charge of the corporate seal of the institution; he shall keep the records and minutes of the institution, conduct the correspondence, call all meetings, and bring all business before the same, and carry out the resolutions passed at such meetings.

41. He shall compile all reports that may be ordered by the committee, fill up all cheques, and perform the clerical duties connected with the office of treasurer.

42. He shall convene the annual meeting of contributors, to be held on the second Thursday in the month of January, by advertisement published in one or more local papers fourteen days previous to such meeting.

43. He shall give notice to the members of the committee of each monthly or special committee meeting.

COLLECTOR.

44. The collector shall canvas for contributions such district as the committee of management may appoint, and shall afford clerical assistance, if called upon, to do so. He shall give a receipt for every sum he receives, and keep a counterpart of such receipt in a book which shall be provided for the purpose by the committee. He shall furnish admission tickets to such contributors as may be entitled to them; and shall hand over to the treasurer in the first week of every month the monies received by him during the preceding month, and at the same time supply the treasurer with a statement of the contributors, and the respective sums paid by them; and shall enter into a bond with two sureties, jointly and severally, in the sum of £150 for the due fulfilment of his office.

45. He shall be at liberty, from time to time, and for such periods as may be deemed advantageous to the interests of the institution, to appoint such person or persons as assistant col-

lector or collectors as may be approved of by the committee of management for the time being; such appointment as aforesaid to be in writing, signed by the president or chairman of meeting at which such appointments shall be made, countersigned by the treasurer, and duly advertised; and such assistant collector or collectors shall find security satisfactory to the committee.

AUDITORS.

46. The accounts of the hospital shall be audited in the first week in January in every year by the auditors, who shall sign a statement of accounts exhibiting a summary of receipts and expenditure for the preceding year.

HONORARY MEDICAL OFFICERS.

47. They shall consist of two legally qualified medical practitioners, who shall be elected for one year.

48. The resident surgeon shall have the management of the patients, but the honorary medical officer of the month shall be invited to attend on all important cases.

49. The honorary medical officers shall be expected to attend not less than twice a week for one month in rotation, but in cases of emergency both may be requested to attend; the arrangement of the rotation of duty to be left to themselves.

50. The honorary medical officers shall have free access to the institution at all times, irrespective of the rotation of duty.

51. The honorary medical officers shall not interfere with the admission or discharge of patients.

52. No capital operation shall be performed until after the medical staff shall have been invited to a consultation, except in cases of emergency; and the honorary medical officers shall be invited to consult with the resident surgeon in all cases of importance or protracted continuances in the house.

53. No one shall be present at the time of any operation or post-mortem examination, except such persons as may be connected with the institution or members of the medical profession.

54. When anything important occurs, they shall make a report of the same in a book kept for that purpose.

RESIDENT SURGEON.

55. The resident surgeon shall possess the certificate of qualification of the Medical Board of Victoria.

56. He shall live in the house provided for him, and shall not be absent for more than six hours at any one time without the sanction of the visiting committee, nor for more than twelve hours without the consent of the general committee.

57. He shall not engage in any business foreign to his profession, nor unnecessarily divulge any of the proceedings of the committee or honorary medical officers in the discharge of their duties.

58. He shall have the immediate superintendence of the dispenser, wardman, and nurses; he shall preserve order and sobriety, and in cases of insubordination or gross neglect of duty on the part of the wardman or nurse, he shall immediately report to the visiting committee, who may, if necessary, suspend or discharge such servant; and if discharged, provisionally engage a substitute for same, and report their having done so, with the cause of such suspension or discharge, to the committee of management at their next meeting.

59. He shall have the charge of and be accountable for the medicines and medical instruments in the hospital, and shall make an inventory of the same in a book to be kept for that purpose, in which shall regularly be entered the receipt, cost, issue, or breakage of each article; and he shall on the last day of the months of April and October of each year, prepare and submit to the committee of management a list of medicines and medical instruments required during the ensuing half-year.

60. He shall enter regularly in the Medical Registry the names of the patients as they are admitted or discharged, and note, if required, the nature and history of their diseases whilst in the hospital; and shall have such medical registry under the different heads ready at all times for the inspection of the visiting committee or committee of management.

61. He shall give all requisite information to the honorary medical officers on their visits to the hospital, and shall enter all prescriptions in a book to be kept for that purpose.

62. He shall visit each patient every morning and evening, or oftener if necessary, and inquire if the treatment prescribed has been attended to; and shall on his visits to the wards examine their condition with respect to cleanliness, temperature, and ventilation.

63. He shall cause to be affixed to the bed of each patient a card stating his name, age, and disease, the date of his admission, the religious denomination to which he belongs; also, whether a contributor or non-contributor, or, if recommended, by whom, and also the name of the honorary medical officer during whose month he may have been admitted.

64. He shall perform all post-mortem examinations, and shall keep the key and registry of the morgue.

65. In the absence of the honorary medical officers in all cases of emergency, he shall cause immediate notice of such emergency to be given to them, being authorized in the meantime to act to the best of his judgment.

66. He shall give due notice to the honorary medical officers when a consultation is to be held, or when an operation is to be performed.

67. He shall inspect the diet of the patients, when necessary, and see that it is properly cooked and prepared, and such as is ordered; and that the patients partake of no food, liquor, or medicine except that prescribed.

68. He shall report at once to the visiting committee any patient who may be disorderly; he shall make a special report of every patient who may have been two months in the hospital; and report to the committee every month the number of persons who have been received, discharged, and have died since the last report, with the number of all under treatment, and also of those considered incurable by the medical staff, to be dealt with as the committee may think fit.

DISPENSER.

69. He shall live in the house, and shall not leave except on necessary occasions and with the consent of the resident surgeon; he shall not be absent for more than three hours at one time, nor after twelve o'clock at night, without the leave of the resident surgeon; nor shall he at any time leave the institution during the absence of the wardman.

70. He shall carefully dispense the medicines prescribed, and write legibly the name of the patient on each bottle and the manner in which the medicines are to be administered, and shall keep a proper supply of medicine and utensils ready in cases of emergency, and shall carry out the instructions of the resident surgeon and honorary medical officers, and otherwise fulfil the duties of dispenser.

71. He shall have the immediate superintendence of the wardmen and nurses, and shall see that they do their duty; and he shall enforce order, sobriety, cleanliness, neatness, and obedience to orders on their part. In case of any misbehaviour, disobedience, or neglect of duty on the part of the wardmen or nurses, he shall at once report the same to the resident surgeon.

72. He shall have the charge of and be accountable for the furniture, utensils, and stores in the hospital, and shall keep an inventory of the same in a book to be kept for that purpose, in which shall regularly be entered the receipt, cost, issue, loss or breakage of each article; and in the month of December in each year he shall take stock of such articles in the possession of the institution; and hand the list over to the secretary.

73. He shall order and receive the stores and supplies furnished by the contractors and tradesmen, and see that they correspond in description, quality and quantity, with the tenders and orders; and in case they do not, he shall report accordingly to the committee. He shall weigh or measure out the provisions and other necessities required for daily consumption; and shall superintend the appointing of the diets before the delivery to the wardmen and nurses, entering the amount consumed regularly in a book to be kept for that purpose, and shall not suffer any of the provisions, utensils, or stores to be wasted or carried away from the hospital.

74. He shall not order any article required for the hospital, excepting stores and provisions, without the authority in writing of the visiting committee.

WARDMAN AND NURSE.

75. They shall live in the house, and shall not leave it except on necessary occasions. They shall not be absent for more than two hours at any one time, nor after twelve o'clock at night, without the permission of the visiting committee, and knowledge of the resident surgeon, nor shall they leave the institution during the absence of the dispenser.

76. The nurse shall have the charge of and be accountable for the bedding, linen, and make an inventory of the same in a book to be kept for that purpose, in which she shall regularly enter the receipt, loss, and expenditure of each article; and she shall, in the months of April and October in each year, prepare and submit to the committee a statement of the stock of each article on hand, and of the probable requirements for the ensuing half-year.

77. They shall be constantly in their wards, and regular in their attendance on patients.

78. They shall obey the orders of the resident surgeon, and shall behave with tenderness to all patients, and with civility and respect to strangers. They shall withdraw from the wards when the visiting committee enter them, unless requested to remain; and shall take no present or gratuity in money or otherwise from the patients, their friends, or strangers who may visit the institution on any pretence whatever.

79. The wardmen and nurses shall be particular to observe personal cleanliness; they shall have their respective wards thoroughly cleansed, and all dirt and rubbish removed from them by seven o'clock in the morning in summer, and before eight o'clock in the morning in winter.

80. They shall pay great attention to the bedding of patients, and have the mattresses thoroughly aired and dried when necessary, and the sheets, blankets, and counterpanes removed as often as may be required.

81. They shall administer to patients, at the times directed, the medicines and diet prescribed, and they shall not suffer them to take any which are not prescribed; and they shall be careful to explain to the patients the instructions of the honorary medical officers and resident surgeon.

82. They shall not permit patients to receive from visitors medicines, victuals, tobacco, or liquor of any kind, nor anything to be removed from the wards by the patients or visitors without an order from the resident surgeon.

83. They shall be careful to collect and carry to the dispenser all empty phials, gallipots, bandages, &c.; and they shall attend at the dispensary at the time appointed to receive medicines and instructions.

84. They shall watch attentively the state of the symptoms of the patients, more especially in urgent or uncommon cases, and report to the resident surgeon.

85. They shall not admit any stranger into the wards without permission of the resident surgeon, or of the dispenser in his absence.

86. All wardmen, nurses, and servants shall be obedient to the regulations of the institution, they shall report immediately to the resident surgeon any impropriety of conduct or infringement of the rules by any patient, visitor, or other person, and if such complaint be not properly attended to, they shall report the same to the visiting committee at its next meeting.

87. On the discharge of a patient they shall see that the bedding be replaced with clean articles; and on the death of a patient they shall be responsible for the orderly disposing of the body till the death be reported to the resident surgeon, and the body removed to the morgue; also, that the whole of the bedding be removed from the ward and replaced with a fresh set.

PATIENTS.

88. All applicants for admission must be provided with a recommendation ticket, the fitness of the applicant to be determined by the resident surgeon.

89. Severe accidents and cases of emergency may be admitted at any time by the visiting committee or by the resident surgeon.

90. No pregnant female for the purpose of confinement, no child under five years of age, no person insane or laboring under *delirium tremens*, or syphilis, or gonorrhoea, or epilepsy, or having any infectious or contagious disease, or in a dying state; nor anyone whose disease, in the opinion of the resident surgeon or honorary medical officer for the month, ought not to come within the operation of the charity, shall be admitted to the hospital as an in-patient, nor any person who in the opinion of either of them may receive equal benefit as an out-door patient.

91. The committee may, if necessary, make provision for the reception and treatment of patients laboring under contagious or infectious diseases on the hospital ground, but at a suitable and safe distance from the hospital itself.

92. If it shall appear to the satisfaction of the committee that any patient admitted under any of the foregoing rules be possessed of sufficient means, such patient will be required to reimburse the hospital in all reasonable charges for maintenance and medical attendance.

93. Patients shall conduct themselves in an orderly manner and shall observe all directions of the honorary medical officers: resident surgeon, dispenser, wardsmen, and nurses.

94. They shall take the medicines at the time directed, and they shall not take any other medicines than those prescribed; and they shall not conceal nor put away any portion of the medicine or diet administered to them.

95. No one shall leave his or her ward and go into another ward or department, nor leave the house nor remain out for a longer time than is granted, nor shall introduce visitors nor receive medicines, victuals, liquors, or tobacco, or anything without the express leave of the resident surgeon.

96. They shall not gamble, nor smoke, nor spit on the floor, nor deface or injure any part of the ward, nor any furniture, bedding, or clothing therein, nor sing, blaspheme, nor use rude or indecent language, on pain of dismissal.

97. No patient shall give reward or gratuity to any of the wardsmen, nurses, or servants.

98. Any patient having any cause of complaint shall make the same known to the visiting committee, or in their absence to the resident surgeon, whose duty it shall be to enter such complaint immediately, in the presence of the wardsmen or nurse of the ward, in a book kept for that purpose, which book shall be laid before the visiting committee at each meeting.

99. Patients considered by the resident surgeon sufficiently convalescent to be able to assist in the work of the institution may, at the discretion of the resident surgeon, and with the approval of the visiting committee, be so employed.

100. Patients shall not sit up after eight o'clock in the winter, or nine o'clock in the summer, and all patients considered by the resident surgeon able to do so, shall rise at seven o'clock in the summer and before eight o'clock in the winter.

101. Ministers of religion shall have access to sick persons of their respective denominations at such times as shall be appointed by the committee, and any minister may attend any patient at any time when requested by such patient.

102. On the death of a patient a printed circular shall be sent to a clergyman of the denomination to which the deceased belonged, inviting him to attend the funeral of such patient at a time named in the circular, and the usual burial fee shall be paid to the clergyman officiating in each case, if requested.

VISITORS.

103. Visitors are admitted into the institution on Sunday, Monday, and Thursday in each week, between the hours of Ten o'clock a.m. and Four o'clock p.m. in winter, and between Ten o'clock a.m. and Six o'clock p.m. in summer. Visitors may be admitted on special occasions by the resident surgeon, or by a written order from a member of committee, addressed to the resident surgeon.

104. Visitors will not be allowed to go into any ward without the leave of the resident surgeon, nor into the female ward without the knowledge or cognizance of the nurse, and must retire when requested.

105. They will not be permitted to give to or leave with any patient, medicine, food, tobacco, or liquor of any kind, or anything without the express sanction of the resident surgeon.

106. No visitor shall give to any servant of the institution any money or gratuity of any kind, without the sanction of the visiting committee previously obtained. Visitors are not allowed to interfere with the wardsmen or nurses, nor to disturb the patients by loud talking or unnecessary noise.

107. Any visitor violating any of the regulations of the institution may be compelled to retire, and will not be re-admitted without special leave from the resident surgeon or visiting committee.

No. 293.—An Act for granting to Her Majesty certain Duties of Customs and for altering certain other Duties. [Assented to 18th April, 1866.]

No. 294.—An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Thirteen thousand and twenty-nine pounds twelve shillings and ninepence to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, and One million five hundred and fifty-three thousand six hundred and sixty-seven pounds and elevenpence to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, and Six hundred thousand pounds to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-six. [Assented to 18th April, 1866.]

And the Honorable James McCulloch, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

6. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order they will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the Contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a Board of Survey composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.
