ACTS OF PARLIAMENT LEFT TO THEIR OPERATION.

THE Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies has, in two Despatches bearing date respectively the 20th and 21st of August, 1866, intimated to the Governor that Her Majesty will not be advised to exercise Her power of disallowance in respect of the Acts of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the 29th year of Her Majesty's reign, the numbers, titles, and dates of which are hereto subjoined, viz. :—

No. 293.—An Act for granting to Her Majesty certain Duties of Customs and for altering certain other Duties. [Assented to 18th April, 1866.]

No. 294.—An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Thirteen thousand and twenty-nine pounds twelve shillings and ninepence to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, and One million five hundred and fifty-three thousand six hundred and sixty-seven pounds and elevenpence to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, and Six hundred thousand pounds to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-six. [Assented to 18th April, 1866.]

WILFUL MURDER. ONE HUNDRED POUNDS REWARD.

WHEREAS about Four o'clock in the morning of Friday, the 19th of October instant, William McGinley, miner, of Scarsdale, was stabbed to the heart by a Chinaman whom he captured while attempting to steal fowls belonging to the deceased: Notice is hereby given that a Reward of One hundred pounds will be paid by the Government for such information as will lead to the conviction of the murderer.

PARTICULARS TO AID DETECTION.

A cap, stick, and bag were left behind by the murderer, and are now in possession of the police.

The perpetrator of this crime is supposed to be a Chinaman named Ah Hoy, aged 37, 5 feet 6 inches high, of stout build; he wore a dark monkey-jacket, blue cloth cap (left behind him in his flight), and very small English-made boots. He is said to have been discharged from Ballarat gaol on the 13th of June last.

WHEREAS by The Amending Land Act 1865 it is amongst other things enacted by sec. 15, that no person shall within any period of twelve months become the lessee, or sub-lessee, or assignee, either in his own name or in the name or names of any other person or persons, of more than 640 acres of the lands proclaimed under that Act, as therein mentioned;

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and no person shall become the lessee, or sub-lessee, or assignee of any allotment who is an infant, or who is a married woman not having obtained a decree of judicial separation binding in Victoria, or who is not domiciled in Victoria, or who is in respect of the allotment for a lease of which he applies, or in respect of any part thereof, an agent or a servant of or a trustee for any other person, or who at the time of his application has entered into any agreement to permit any other person to acquire, by purchase or otherwise, the allotment in respect of which such application is made, or any part thereof, or the applicant's interest therein; and all land applied for under that Act shall be so applied for *bond fide* for the use and benefit of the applicant in his own proper person, and not as the agent or servant, or trustee of or for any other person; and allotments selected or purchased under the provisions thereinbefore contained shall be reckoned as part of the 640 acres thereinbefore mentioned; and it is by the said Act provided that if any person shall, in violation of any of the provisions of that section, become the lessee, or assignee, or sub-lessee of an allotment, the Governor in Council may declare the lease of such allotment to be forfeited, and upon publication in the *Government Gazette* of notice of such declaration, the term created by the said lease shall cease and determine, and the right, title, and interest of the lessee, and of every assignee and sub-lessee in and to such lease, and all moneys paid for rent in respect of such allotment shall be absolutely forfeited, and the allotment may be sold in fee simple or leased again, in manner in the said Act provided: And whereas the lease mentioned in the first column of the schedule hereto of the allotments therein comprised and thereby demised, being land proclaimed under the provisions of the said Act, was granted at the time, in manner, and to the lessee therein mentioned: And whereas the person whose name is mentioned in the second column of the schedule hereto has entered into an agreement, in violation of the provisions to the contrary of the said hereinbefore-recited section, whereby the said allotments comprised in and demised by the hereinbefore-mentioned lease were permitted to be acquired by purchase or otherwise, in manner, and for the reasons mentioned in the third column of the schedule hereto: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise and execution of the power or authority in that behalf given by the said hereinbefore-mentioned Act, doth hereby declare that the said lease mentioned in the said first column of the schedule hereto of the allotments therein comprised and thereby demised is forfeited.

And the Honorable James Macpherson Grant, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by The Electoral Act 1865 it is amongst other things enacted, that where any accidental or unavoidable impediment, misfeasance, or omission shall have happened in the preparation or transmission or printing of any general roll or supplementary roll or ordinary electoral roll or roll of rate-paying electors, the Governor in Council may take all such measures as may be necessary for removing such impediment or rectifying such misfeasance or omission, or may declare any such roll valid as to and notwithstanding such impediment, misfeasance, or omission; and every such Order in Council shall state specifically the nature of the impediment, misfeasance, or omission, and shall be forthwith published in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas the Town Clerk of Hamilton omitted to send to the Electoral Registrar for the Hamilton North and Hamilton South divisions of the Districts of Dundas and Normanby respectively the Borough Lists of Ratepaying Electors resident in the said divisions within the time fixed by The Electoral Act 1865, for that purpose (20th of August), but has since forwarded them to the Registrar, who has received the same: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order authorize the Electoral Registrar for the said divisions, notwithstanding such omission as aforesaid, to incorporate the lists so received from the Town Clerk of Hamilton with any other list or lists of ratepaying electors duly received by him for the said divisions in the manner directed in the 64th section of the said Act, and doth declare the rolls so incorporated to be valid.

FENCING ACROSS OR OBSTRUCTING SURVEYED ROADS.

THE Board of Land and Works having learned that in many districts of the colony, persons have without authority fenced across and otherwise obstructed surveyed roads, directs attention to the 25th section of The Amending Land Act 1865, which prescribes the penalty for such offences.

In order to enforce the law, the Officers of Police throughout the colony are authorised as Bailiffs of Crown Lands to prosecute all such offenders.

The Amending Land Act 1865. Section 25.

"If any person shall dig any ditch trench or drain or erect or cause to be erected any fence on or across any proclaimed road or any surveyed road without the consent of the Board of Land and Works which consent shall be published in the *Government Gazette* he shall forfeit and pay on conviction a penalty of not less than two pounds nor more than ten pounds but nothing herein contained shall apply to any gate erected and continued by the written consent of the Board of Land and Works if such gate shall not be locked or otherwise permanently fastened."

5. The order issued by the head of department must accompany the goods, and the account is to be rendered simultaneously with delivery of the supplies. In other cases the account is to be rendered monthly. The rates quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.

6. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order they will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the Contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a Board of Survey composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.
