#### REWARDS FOR THE DISCOVERY OF ILLICIT DISTILLATION, ETC.

IT is hereby notified that Rewards, varying in amount from Five pounds to Fifty pounds, will be given for such information as may lead to the detection and conviction of persons engaged in Illicit Distillation, or in the purchasing or selling of Spirits upon which the duty has not been paid.

The rewards will vary in amount in proportion to the importance of the seizure, and will be payable immediately upon conviction being obtained, and will be in addition to the portion of the fine or of the proceeds of the seizure which by law is to be paid to the person affording the information.

Information may be given to the Chief Inspector of Distilleries, at his office, La Trobe street west, Melbourne, or to any of the officers of police throughout the colony.

The name of the person giving the information will not be divulged, unless with his own consent.

#### SOUTH AUSTRALIA-SPENCER'S GULF. BUOY OFF CAPE ELIZABETH.

The Marine Board of Port Adelaide, South Australia, has given notice that a red pyramidal-shaped buoy has been placed in \$\frac{1}{2}\$ fathoms at low water off the outer end of the reef which extends nearly a mile in a N.E. by E. direction from Cape Elizabeth, Spencer's Gulf. The buoy is moored 4 cables length to the westward of the shoalest part of the reef; and in clear weather, from an elevation of 10 feet above the sea level, should be seen from a distance of 4 miles.

The bearings from the buoy are given as follows, viz.:—Cape Elizabeth E.N.E., and Tipara light-vessel N.N.W. \( \frac{1}{2} \) W.

#### GULF OF ST. VINCENT. BUOYS AT PORT WAKEFIELD.

Also that a large red pyramidal-shaped buoy, surmounted by a ball, has been placed on the south-west extremity of the Long Spit, which extends for about 20 miles in a north-westerly direction from Port Gawler flats, north of the channel, into Port Adelaide.

The buoy is moored in 19 feet at low water spring tides, with the summit of the Hummock range of hills at the head of the Gulf N. by W., and Mount Lofty E. 38°S.

Also that a large red pyramidal-shiped buoy, with a triangular head, has been moored in 17 feet at low water on the outer extremity of Bald Hill Spit, which extends in a westerly direction from Sandy Point, at the entrance of Port Wakefield. No bearings for this buoy are given.
