## THE CIRCUIT COURTS OF VICTORIA DURING THE YEAR 1867.

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the third day of December, 1866.*

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the fifteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled *An Act to make provision for the better administration of Justice in the Colony of Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor of the said Colony, by any Orders to be by him, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, from time to time made and proclaimed, to define the limits of districts within and the times at which circuit courts shall be holden in the said colony, and the said limits and times to alter and vary as he shall, with the advice aforesaid, deem necessary: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order appoint the places and times at which the several Circuit Courts of Victoria shall be holden during the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven to be as follow, that is to say:—

### At ARARAT, on—

Monday the eleventh day of February.  
Friday the twelfth day of July.

### At BALLARAT, on—

Wednesday the thirteenth day of February.  
Tuesday the sixteenth day of April.  
Monday the fifteenth day of July.  
Tuesday the first day of October.

### At BEECHWORTH, on—

Thursday the eleventh day of April.  
Thursday the seventeenth day of October.

### At BELFAST, on—

Thursday the twenty-first day of February.  
Thursday the twenty-fifth day of July.

### At CASTLEMAINE, on—

Monday the eighteenth day of February.  
Tuesday the ninth day of July.

### At GEELONG, on—

Saturday the twentieth day of April.  
Saturday the fifth day of October.

### At MARYBOROUGH, on—

Thursday the twenty-first day of February.  
Friday the twelfth day of July.

### At SALE, on—

Friday the twenty-sixth day of April.  
Friday the eleventh day of October.

### At SANDHURST, on—

Tuesday the twenty-third day of April.  
Tuesday the eighth day of October.

## ALTERED AND NEW CIRCUIT COURT DISTRICTS.

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the third day of December, 1866.*

WHEREAS by the Act of the Lieutenant-Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the fifteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled *An Act to make provision for the better administration of Justice in the Colony of Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant-Governor of the said colony, by any Orders to be by him, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, from time to time made and proclaimed, to define the limits of districts within which Circuit Courts shall be holden in the said colony, and the said limits to alter and vary as he shall, with the advice aforesaid,

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deem necessary: And whereas by Proclamations bearing date respectively the sixth day of November, 1856, the seventeenth day of August, 1860, and the twenty-eighth day of January, 1861, the limits of the Circuit Districts of Geelong, Portland, Ballarat, Castlemaine, and Sandhurst were defined. And whereas it is deemed expedient to alter the said limits: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order rescind the said Proclamations, and doth appoint that the limits of the undermentioned districts, within which Circuit Courts shall be holden, shall be those hereinafter defined, that is to say:—

THE CIRCUIT COURT DISTRICT OF GEELONG—Commencing at Curdie's Inlet; thence northerly by Curdie's Creek to a point on the 143rd degree of east longitude, seven miles south of Lake Elingamite; thence by the eastern side of the said lake by a line nearly due north to a great bend in the Mount Emu Creek due west from Mount Emu; thence by the said creek northerly to Darlington; thence by the southern and eastern boundaries of that township to the north-east angle thereof; thence in a north-westerly direction to the point where the Fiery Creek runs into Lake Boloke; thence by the northern boundary of the county of Hampden to the most southerly bend of Emu Creek, south-

west of Anderson's Hill; thence by a line bearing easterly to the junction of Williamson's Creek with the Yarrowee River; and thence to the junction of the Lal-lal Rivulet and the River Moorabool; thence by the River Moorabool to a point due west from the south-west angle of the township of Ballan; thence to the said south-west angle; thence by the southern and eastern boundary of that township to the Werribee River; thence by that river south-easterly to the sea; thence by the coast to Curdie's Inlet, the commencing point.

THE CIRCUIT COURT DISTRICT OF BELFAST.—Bounded on the north by a line bearing west from the southern shore of Lake Hindmarsh to the western frontier of Victoria and by that frontier to the sea; and thence east by the coast to Curdie's Inlet; thence northerly by the western boundary of the Circuit Court District of Geelong (hereinbefore defined) to the point where the Piery Creek runs into Lake Boloke; thence by the southern shore of that lake and the southern and western boundary of the county of Ripon to the River Glenelg; thence north-west by that river to the most northerly point of the county of Dundas; thence by a northerly line to the Norton Creek, and by that creek to the River Wimmera, and by that river to Lake Hindmarsh, the commencing point.

THE CIRCUIT COURT DISTRICT OF BALLARAT.—Commencing at the source of the Emu Creek in the Main Dividing Range; thence by that creek southerly and westerly to the most southerly bend of that creek south-west of Anderson's Hill; thence by the northern boundary of the Geelong Circuit District (hereinbefore defined) to the River Moorabool; thence by that river to its source; thence by the Main Dividing Range to the range between the Bullarook Creek and Joyce's Creek; thence by that range and a line westerly to the junction of the Dry Creek with the Mount Greenock Creek; thence by that creek to its source; thence by the Main Dividing Range to the source of the Emu Creek, the commencing point.

THE CIRCUIT COURT DISTRICT OF SANDHURST AND CASTLEMAINE.—Commencing at the junction of the River Murray with the River Goulburn; thence by the River Goulburn to its junction with Hughes's Creek; thence by a line south-west to the head of the McIvor Creek; thence by a line north-west to the junction of the rivers Campaspe and Coliban; thence by the River Coliban to its source in the Main Dividing Range; thence by that range to the north-easterly boundary of the Circuit Court District of Ballarat (hereinbefore defined); thence by that boundary to the confluence of the Bullarook Creek and Deep Creek; thence by the Deep Creek to its junction with the River Loddon; thence by the said river to its junction with an ana branch of the River Murray; thence by the said ana branch westerly to the south-east angle of the township of Castle Donnington; thence by the southern, western, and northern boundaries of the said township to the River Murray; thence by the said river easterly to the commencing point.

And the Honorable George Higinbotham, Her Majesty's Attorney-General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

THE CIRCUIT COURT DISTRICT OF SALE.—Commencing at Cape Patterson on the sea-coast; thence by the eastern boundary of the county of Mornington to the southern boundary of the county of Evelyn; thence by the latter boundary to Mount Baw-baw; thence by a straight line north-easterly to Mount Useful; thence by the range dividing the sources of the Macalister River from those of Aberfeldy River to the Great Dividing Range; thence by a straight line north-easterly to Mount Buller; thence by a straight line northerly to Mount Howitt; thence by the Dividing Range to Forest Hill; thence by a line south-easterly to Cape Howe, being the boundary between Victoria and New South Wales; thence by the sea-coast to Cape Patterson, the commencing point.

And the Honorable George Higinbotham, Her Majesty's Attorney-General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

#### THE SUBDIVISIONS OF THE UPPER YARRA ROAD DISTRICT.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-sixth day of November, 1866.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1863* it is amongst other things enacted that at any time after the first annual election or general election, as the case may be, or first appointment of members of the district board for any original or proclaimed district thereafter sometimes called "single district," the Governor in Council, if it seem fit, may, and if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said district, shall, within three months after the receipt of the same, divide the district into two, or, if the Governor in Council shall see fit, into three separate electoral subdivisions, thereafter called subdivisions by such names as shall by such Order in Council be assigned to the same, and in and by such Order in Council the boundaries of the subdivisions shall be set forth; provided that no such division shall be made within three months before any day appointed for holding any election of members of the district board in and for such district: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the eighteenth day of September, 1856, a road district was proclaimed under the designation of "The Upper Yarra Road District." And whereas by another Proclamation bearing date the nineteenth day of August, 1861, the boundaries of the said district were altered as therein mentioned: And whereas the Governor in Council has received a petition signed by not less than twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said road district, praying for the division of the same into three subdivisions: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order divide the Upper Yarra Road District into three separate electoral subdivisions in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, by the names hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, and doth hereby set forth the boundaries of the said several subdivisions in manner following, that is to say:—

NORTH-WESTERN SUBDIVISION.—Commencing on the west boundary of the road district where it is intersected by the south boundary of the parish of Yering; thence north and east by the west and northern boundary of the district to where it is intersected by the east boundary of the said parish; thence south and west by the east and south boundaries of the parish of Yering to the commencing point.

SOUTH-WESTERN SUBDIVISION.—Commencing on the boundary of the district at the south-east angle of the parish of Yering; thence south, west, and north by the boundaries of the district to the south-west angle of the above parish; thence by the south boundary of the parish of Yering East to the commencing point.

EASTERN SUBDIVISION.—Commencing at the south-east angle of the parish of Yering; thence north by the east boundary of the said parish to the northern boundary of the road district; thence easterly, southerly, and westerly by the said district boundary to the commencing point.

And the Honorable William Mountford Kinsey Vale, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

#### SECTIONS V. TO X. OF "THE POLICE OFFENCES STATUTE 1865" EXTENDED.

PROCLAMATION  
By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign (No. 265), called *The Police Offences Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend all or any of the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, and may define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place, and vary and alter such limits, and may revoke any such Proclamation; and upon any such Proclamation the provisions so proclaimed shall extend to and be in force in such city, town, district, or place: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Proclamation extend the provisions contained in sections V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X. of Part I. of the said Statute to the Shire hereinafter mentioned, viz.:—
