WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act* 1865 it is amongst other things enacted by sec. 15, that no person shall within any period of twelve months become the lessee, or sub-lessee, or assignee, either in his own name or in the name or names of any other person or persons, of more than 640 acres of the lands proclaimed under that Act, as therein mentioned; and no person shall become the lessee, or sub-lessee, or assignee of any allotment who is an infant, or who is a married woman not having obtained a decree of judicial separation binding in Victoria, or who is not domiciled in Victoria, or who is in respect of the allotment for a lease of which he applies, or in respect of any part thereof, an agent or a servant of or a trustee for any other person, or who at the time of his application has entered into any agreement to permit any other person to acquire, by purchase or otherwise, the allotment in respect of which such application is made, or any part thereof, or the applicant's interest therein; and all land applied for under that Act shall be so applied for *bond fide* for the use and benefit of the applicant in his own proper person, and not as the agent or servant, or trustee of or for any other person; and allotments selected or purchased under the provisions thereinbefore contained shall be reckoned as part of the 640 acres thereinbefore mentioned; and it is by the said Act provided that if any person shall, in violation of any of the provisions of that section, become the lessee, or assignee, or sub-lessee of an allotment, the Governor in Council may declare the lease of such allotment to be forfeited, and upon publication in the *Government Gazette* of notice of such declaration, the term created by the said lease shall cease and determine, and the right, title, and interest of the lessee, and of every assignee and sub-lessee in and to such lease, and all moneys paid for rent in respect of such allotment shall be absolutely forfeited, and the allotment may be sold in fee simple or leased again, in manner in the said Act provided: And whereas the leases mentioned in the first column of the

schedule hereto of the allotments therein comprised and thereby demised, being land proclaimed under the provisions of the said Act, were granted at the time, in manner, and to the lessees therein mentioned: And whereas the persons whose names are mentioned in the second column of the schedule hereto became the lessee and assignees respectively of the said allotments comprised in and demised by the hereinbefore-mentioned leases, in violation of the provisions to the contrary of the said hereinbefore-recited section, in manner, and for the reasons mentioned in the third column of the schedule hereto: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise and execution of the power or authority in that behalf given by the said hereinbefore-mentioned Act, doth hereby declare that the said leases mentioned in the said first column of the schedule hereto of the allotments therein comprised and thereby demised are forfeited.

SHIRE OF BELFAST.

BYE-LAW No. 1.

THE business of the council at all meetings shall be conducted with open doors, unless when the council is in committee.

2. The ordinary meetings of the council shall be held each alternate Saturday throughout the year, at eleven o'clock in the forenoon.

3. The business of the council shall commence as soon as a quorum is present, but should such quorum not be present at the expiration of one hour after the time appointed for such meeting, the circumstance shall be entered in the minute-book together with the names of the councillors present; or if no members of council are present, the secretary may adjourn the meeting, and if not adjourned the meeting shall lapse.

4. The first business of each meeting of council shall be the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting and their confirmation, but no discussion shall take place thereupon, except as to the accuracy thereof.

5. After the disposal of the minutes (1st) all correspondence despatched and received shall be read. (2nd) Petitions and memorials shall be presented. (3rd) Reports shall be brought up. (4th) Motions and orders of the day shall be considered. (5th) The correspondence taken into consideration. (6th) The disposing of tenders and accounts shall be dealt with.

6. No motion, the effect of which, if carried, would involve the expenditure of any sum of money exceeding £50, shall be entertained by the council unless notice of such motion be given in the usual manner.

7. Memorials and petition shall be presented by members of council only, who shall be responsible for the same being couched in respectful terms. And on the presentation of a petition no debate shall take place thereupon until notice has been given in the usual manner, and the only question that shall be entertained on the occasion of its presentation shall be that the memorial or petition be received, and if necessary, that it be referred to a committee.

8. The order of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of council, and any business which the president may think fit to bring under consideration.

9. No motion entered on the notice-book shall be proceeded with unless the member who gives such notice is present when the motion is called for, or unless some other member be authorized, in writing, by the proposer to take up the motion during his absence; and all notices not so proceeded with shall be struck out.

10. No councillor shall digress from the subject matter of question under discussion, or impute improper motives to others; and all personal reflections upon any councillor (or any councillor appearing before the council in an improper manner) shall be considered highly disorderly, and shall be liable, at the discretion of the council, to a fine not exceeding five pounds. The president shall be the judge. Every councillor, including the president, shall stand while addressing the council. The president's ruling shall be final in all matters of order and practice.

11. Any councillor may of right require the production of any of the documents of the council relating to the question or matter under discussion.

12. In taking the sense of the council the president shall put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, or call for a show of hands in like manner. The council shall in all cases vote by show of hands; and on a division the names of the members voting pro and con shall be recorded. The ruling of the president shall be final in all points of order, and shall be given without argument or comment, except by way of citing precedents; and if two or more members rise to speak at the same time, the president shall decide who has the first claim to be heard.

13. Any councillor may require the secretary to take down in writing any particular words used by a councillor immediately on the same being used.

14. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for the adjournment of the council; and if on the question being put the motion for adjournment is negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice-paper, or any other that may be allowed precedence by the president, shall be

discussed before any subsequent motion for adjournment be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, then the business undisposed of shall have precedence at the next meeting of the council.

15. It shall be competent for a majority of not less than two-thirds of the council in session to suspend, during the discussion of any subject, any standing order herein contained, except the purport of such suspension be the rescinding of any motion previously adopted by the council.

16. No motion proposing any bye-law or standing order shall be entertained unless the mover shall submit them with a draft of such bye-law or standing order, and such draft shall not be taken into consideration until the following meeting of the council.

17. Notices of motion, containing the name of the proposer, shall be handed to the secretary during the sitting of the council, who shall enter them in a minute-book to be kept specially for that purpose, and the member making such motion shall read the same aloud, and state day of bringing on such motion.

18. No motion shall be discussed or decided at any meeting of the council unless notice, in writing, signed by the councillor proposing it, shall have been given at a previous meeting of the council.

19. No councillor when speaking shall be interrupted, unless called to order, in which case the councillor calling to order shall be heard thereon in preference to any other speaker, and the question of order shall be disposed of before the subject is resumed or any other subject is entered upon.

20. No motion or amendment shall be entertained or discussed unless it be seconded.

21. If more than one councillor speak at the same time the president or, in his absence, the acting chairman shall decide which is entitled to precedence.

22. No councillor shall speak twice on the same motion or amendment, except by way of explanation, or in reply upon any original motion of which he may have been the mover, or the mover of the amendment last proposed, unless by permission of a majority of the council; and the president or acting chairman shall, without waiting for the interposition of the council, call to order any councillor proceeding to speak a second time on the same motion or amendment.

23. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but if lost another may be moved before the original question is put to the vote, but upon any amendment being carried it shall be competent for any councillor to move one other amendment but no more.

24. All works amounting to more than £50 shall be done by contract, and shall be advertised in one of the local papers not less than twice consecutively.

25. All tenders shall be addressed to the president of the council, and shall be endorsed on the envelope the works they are intended for; and shall not be opened till the time fixed for their consideration, and then only by the president or acting chairman; and the amounts, together with the names of the parties tendering, shall be entered on the minutes of the council; and whenever tenders are accepted a contract shall be entered into and signed by the contractor, one member, and the surveyor, within one week.

26. Contractors are to send in their tenders on printed forms, and tenders must not only include a lump sum for the whole of the work specified; but also a complete schedule of quantities and prices, showing how the lump sum has been arrived at; tenders which do not comply with these conditions shall be rejected.

27. All tenders must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit of not less than five per cent. on the amount of the tender; any contractor whose tender has been accepted by the council, and who fails or refuses to sign a contract or pay the deposit required by the council, shall forfeit the moneys paid in by him as a preliminary deposit; any error in computing the amount of the said tender, or ignorance or misunderstanding of the conditions of the specification that may be alleged to the contrary notwithstanding, and the council shall be at liberty to re-let the contract.

28. Within one week of the acceptance of the tender by the council the contractor shall make up his preliminary deposit of ten per cent. on the amount of the tender, which additional deposit shall be paid over by the contractor to the treasurer, and the money so paid shall be deposited in the bank with the other moneys of the council, and shall not be repaid to the contractor until he has obtained a certificate from the surveyor of the council that the works under his contract are satisfactorily completed.

29. Money on progress payments may be paid to contractors at a rate not exceeding eighty-five per cent. on the surveyor's report of work performed at intervals of not less than fourteen days.

30. All payments above one pound shall be made by cheque, signed by the president or acting chairman, and one other councillor, and countersigned by the treasurer; and no such cheque shall be given unless the amount for which it is given shall have been previously passed at an ordinary meeting of the council.

31. No councillor or officer of the council shall have any pecuniary interest, either directly or indirectly, in any contract under the council, nor be received as surety for any officer or servant appointed by the council or any contractor under the council.

32. No salaried officer of the council shall take any part in elections of members for this shire council, excepting giving his own vote and taking such steps as are required in carrying out the Local Government Act. Any officer, directly or indirectly, canvassing, using his influence with any ratepayer or non-ratepayer to take part for or against any candidate at such election, and shall be proved to have done so to the satisfaction of the majority of this council, shall at once forfeit his situation, and shall without further consideration be dismissed.

33. The surveyor shall lay all surveys, plans, and specifications

of works proposed to be executed before the council; approval to be certified by the signature of the president or acting chairman being attached on every page, and no alteration from surveyor's plans and specifications so approved shall be made unless accompanied by a report, in writing, from the surveyor recommending such alteration, and which, if approved by the council, shall be certified in like manner by the president or acting chairman.

34. The shire council office shall be open every day, except the days excepted by the Local Government Act, and such other days as may be fixed upon by the council, between the hours of (10) Ten and (1) One, and from (2) Two to (4) Four, when the secretary shall attend to transact the ordinary business of the council.

35. The secretary and surveyor of the council, with all books and documents, shall attend all meetings of the council at least one hour prior to the hour of meeting, to afford members any information they may desire; and the other officers when required to attend.

36. All the officers of the council shall be elected annually at the ordinary meeting preceding the annual meeting. Any office falling vacant before the commencement and close of the year of office shall be filled up only for the remainder of the current year, and the salaries of all officers shall be fixed at the ordinary meeting immediately preceding their election.

37. All officers of the council shall furnish vouchers for the amount of their monthly salary for payment when due at the first ordinary meeting of each succeeding month.

38. All applications for leave of absence from any officer of the council shall be in writing, and if the term of such leave exceed three days, the council to decide upon such application; any shorter term may be granted by the president, provided he is satisfied that proper provision has been made for the performance of the duties of such applicant during his absence.

39. The treasurer shall present to the council at every ordinary meeting a statement of the moneys received by him since the previous one, and of all moneys lodged by him in the bank to the council's credit.

40. All moneys of the council amounting to Ten pounds and upwards shall, within three days after they have come into the possession of the treasurer, be paid by him into such bank as the council shall, from time to time, appoint for that purpose.

41. The secretary shall present a statement of the financial affairs of the council at every ordinary meeting and shall also keep a debtor and creditor account for each division of the shire, the same to be posted up for reference at all ordinary meetings. The secretary and surveyor of the council, with all books and documents, shall attend all meetings of the council at least one hour prior to the hour of meeting, to afford members any information they may desire; and the other officers when required to attend.

42. The surveyor shall be the custodian of all plans, specifications of work executed, and hereafter to be executed under the orders of the council; and all such plans and specifications shall be the property of the council; and the surveyor shall be responsible for the safe keeping of the same.

43. The valuator shall make a fair and equitable valuation of all the rateable property in his division, and should it be found that he has neglected or left out of his valuation any rateable property, he shall be liable to the council for the full amount of rates payable on such property; he shall complete his valuation within ten weeks from the time he enters on his duties.

44. The collector shall, previous to the day on which the ordinary meetings of the council takes place, prepare a report showing the amount of rates received by him during the fortnight preceding, the moneys paid in to the treasurer, and the amount of uncollected rates, and shall deliver the same to the secretary. The collector shall in no case detain without the orders of the council. Every seven days all moneys received by the collector for rates shall be paid to the treasurer, and the collector shall take the treasurer's receipt for the same. The collector shall not be paid his salary in full until he has collected all rates due in his division, or that the council are satisfied no more rates can be collected in consequence of the absence of the proprietor or other causes.

45. A public works committee, comprised of five members of the council, three to form a quorum, shall be elected at every annual meeting, who shall continue in office until the next annual meeting. In the event of any member of the committee ceasing to be a member of the council before the next annual meeting, the vacancy shall be filled by the member elected in his place. The duties of the committee shall be to examine and report upon all plans and specifications submitted by the surveyor to the council for approval; to report upon all applications from ratepayers for new works; to examine the surveyor's report upon all works proposed or in progress; to examine disputes between contractors and the surveyor; and such other business relating to the works of the shire as may be referred to it by the council; and no application for a progress or final payment shall be entertained by the council unless recommended by the surveyor and approved by the works committee.

46. A financial committee, consisting of four members of the council, three to form a quorum, shall be appointed at every annual meeting and shall continue in office until the next annual meeting, with the same provisions in the event of a vacancy as in the case of the public works committee. The duties of the financial committee shall be to examine and report upon the accounts respectively of the secretary, treasurer, rate-collector, and generally to conduct and watch over the financial affairs of the council.

47. Any subject may be referred to a committee of the whole council upon a motion to that effect being carried at any meeting of any committee consisting of the whole council, five to form a quorum.

48. For the purpose of these bye-laws the officers of the council shall consist of the secretary, surveyor, treasurer, valuator, rate-collector, thistle and dog inspectors, and poundkeepers.
