SHIRE OF GLENLYON.

BYE-LAW No. 1.—FOR PROVIDING FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE AFFAIRS OF THE COUNCIL, AND REGULATING THE CONDUCT OF THEIR OFFICERS AND SERVANTS.

AT every ordinary meeting of the council the first business thereof shall be the reading of, and putting for confirmation, the minutes of any preceding meeting; and no discussion shall be allowed thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings. The minutes, when confirmed, shall be signed by the president or chairman of the meeting at which the proceedings took place, in accordance with the Act.

2. The order of the business shall be as follows:—

1. Reading of correspondence, and considering and ordering thereon.
2. Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
3. Reading and ordering on reports of committees and officers.
4. Orders of the day.
5. Motions of which previous notice has been duly given.
6. Examination and passing of accounts for payment.
7. Reading notices of motions for future meetings.
8. Reading over the business of the present meeting before adjournment.

3. Special meetings of the council shall, on the requisition of three or more councillors, be convened by the president or secretary, the object of such meeting being stated in the requisition, and also in the circular convening the meeting. A fine of 5s. shall be imposed upon the councillors for non-attendance, unless a sufficient apology be tendered in writing.

4. Every petition or memorial addressed to the council shall be in proper form, and must be presented by a councillor, who shall be responsible for its being respectfully worded; and no debate shall take place thereon, except as to its being received and taken into consideration after the orders of the day, or at any future meeting, or, if necessary, that it be referred to a committee.

5. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the council, and any business which the president shall think fit to bring under consideration.

6. Every notice of motion shall be given to the secretary in writing, and shall be read aloud at the meeting previous to that in which the same is to be taken into consideration, and every notice of motion shall be considered in the order in which it is given.

7. No motion entered on the notice paper shall be cancelled, unless the councillor who has given such notice, or some other councillor authorised by him in writing, be present when the business is called on, and notice not so proceeded with shall be struck off the notice paper.

8. The mover of any motion which shall be referred to a committee shall, for the occasion, be a member of such committee.

9. No motion for the expenditure of a greater sum than £20, or for any important business, shall be introduced unless notice of such motion shall have been given to the secretary at previous meetings and read aloud. All such notices shall be numbered as they are received, and filed in the office for inspection, and their consideration shall be in their numerical order.

10. Every councillor, including the president, shall stand up while addressing the council.

11. The president's ruling shall be final on all matters of order or practice.

12. Every motion or amendment shall be entered on the minutes, with the names of the mover and seconder; and on a division thereon, the votes shall be recorded if required by any councillor.

13. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but, if lost, one other may be moved before the original motion is put to the vote; but upon any amendment being carried it shall be competent for any councillor to move one other amendment thereon.

14. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion or adjournment of the council; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained. But if the motion for adjournment be carried, the motions then undisposed of shall have precedence at the next adjourned meeting of the council.

15. No councillor shall speak more than once on the same question, except by way of explanation or reply on an original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of an amendment last proposed; and after the reply the amendment or the original motion, as the case may be, shall be put to the vote.

16. Every councillor when proposing a motion or amendment, or speaking on any matter, shall address the president, and shall not be interrupted, except called to order; whereupon he shall sit down until the question of order shall have been decided. The councillor in possession of the chair may then resume the subject.

17. Any councillor who shall refuse to obey when ruled out of order, or shall use any expression capable of being applied offensively to any other councillor, and who, if required by the president, shall refuse to withdraw such expressions and make satisfactory apology, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, to be recovered before any two or more justices of the peace.

18. Any councillor may, with the consent of the president, require the secretary to take down the particular words used by a councillor immediately upon the same being uttered.

19. Any councillor may record his protest against any resolution of the council on giving notice of his intention to do so on the adoption of a resolution, and on such councillor entering his protest and his reasons for the same in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the council, and on his signing the same before the next meeting of the council: provided always that such protest may be expunged if decided by

a majority of the council not to be in accordance with truth, or not to be in terms respectful to the council.

20. No election to any office at the disposal of the council shall take place until six clear days' notice shall have been given in some local newspaper, inviting application for the same, or unless the salary or allowances attaching to such offices shall have been fixed before proceeding to such election.

21. The revenue raised in any locality, including licenses, rates, and Government grant on account of same, or from whatever source received, shall be, as a general rule, expended in that locality, except for the execution of necessary works for the benefit of the shire generally.

22. All contracts over £10 shall be made by tender, unless the council shall otherwise direct. All tenders shall be addressed to the president, and only opened at the time of their consideration by the council. When any tender shall have been accepted by the council, the person tendering, or some one on his behalf, shall pay a deposit at the rate of £10 per centum on all contracts of not more than £20, of £4 on all from £20 to £50, of £7 10s. from £50 to £100, and £5 on all over £100, which amount shall be returned to the contractor when he obtains a final certificate from the engineer that works under such contract are satisfactorily completed.

23. All payments shall be made by cheque, and signed by the president and one other councillor or countersigned by the secretary, and no cheque shall be given unless the account for which it is payable shall have been passed at a meeting of the council, or by a committee duly empowered so to do.

24. The shire office shall be open every Tuesday and Saturday, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 2 p.m., for transacting the ordinary business of the council, during which times the secretary and treasurer shall be in attendance.

25. In all cases where contracts shall be entered into an agreement shall be drawn up between the council and the contractor for the execution of such works, and shall be signed by two members on behalf of the council, and the shire seal attached, and also the contractor. Any contractor failing to enter such agreement and sign the specifications within one week from acceptance of tender shall forfeit his deposit, and the contract shall be cancelled.

26. In all cases it shall be sufficient for the collector to call once for any rate due, and in the event of it not being paid to him when called for, he shall leave a notice demanding payment of such sum at the office of the council, within fourteen days of service of notice, and stating that in default of such payment legal proceedings for the recovery of the amount shall be taken. The collector shall pay over to the treasurer every Wednesday all moneys received by him for rates during the past week, and shall take a receipt for the same.

27. The secretary and surveyor shall, at each ordinary meeting, and every other officer and servant, whenever called on to do so, shall furnish official reports to the council.

28.
