## NOTICE TO NEWSPAPER PROPRIETORS AND PUBLISHERS, AND TO PRINTERS.

BY the *Printers and Newspapers Registration Statute 1864*, it is required that an affidavit, duly sworn and signed by the proprietors, and by the printer and the publisher of every newspaper, shall be deposited with the Registrar General prior to the first publication of a newspaper, and whenever in any newspaper already registered any change is made in any of the particulars required to be stated in the affidavit. The penalty for breach of this provision is a sum of not less than £25 nor more than £100. By the same statute it is also required that the printer and the publisher of a newspaper, together with two sufficient sureties, shall, prior to the publication of the newspaper, and also upon the insolvency of a surety and notice from the Chief Secretary, or upon the withdrawal of a surety, enter into recognizances before a Judge of the Supreme Court, or the Police Magistrate of the district, for payment of any fine or penalty that may be inflicted for printing or publishing any blasphemous or seditious libel. The penalty for breach of this provision is a sum of not less than £5 nor more than £20, together with all reasonable costs of discovering and prosecuting the offence.

2. Every person who has any printing press or types for printing is required by the above-mentioned statute to give notice thereof in writing, signed by himself and attested by a witness, to the Registrar General. The penalty for breach of this provision is a sum of not less than £5 nor more than £20. And every person who prints for publication or dispersion any paper or book is required to print his name and place of abode upon the front of every such paper if it be printed upon one side only, and upon the first and last leaf of every paper or book if there be more than one such leaf. The penalty for breach of this provision is a sum of not less than £5 nor more than £20.

The above provisions of the law have been hitherto wholly or in part disobeyed by a large number of newspaper proprietors, publishers, and printers: Notice is hereby given, that after the expiration of one month from this date the law will be strictly enforced against all offenders.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted, that where there are two or more neighboring commons the Governor in Council may proclaim that the same shall be a common under the name of "The United Town and Gold-field [or, as the case may be] Common of" for the benefit of all persons entitled to commonage on either: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that the neighboring commons hereinafter mentioned shall be United Commons, under the names prefixed thereto respectively, that is to say:—

**THE UNITED FARMERS' COMMON OF BURKE, DRUMMOND, AND EDGEcombe.**—The Burke, Drummond, and Edgecombe Farmers' Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the fourth day of March, 1861, and the Edgecombe Farmers' Common, described in two several Proclamations bearing date respectively the fourth day of March, 1861, and the twentieth day of November, 1865, are hereby united; and the said United Common shall be for the benefit of all persons entitled to commonage on either of the above-mentioned neighboring commons.—(66.N.15560.)

**THE UNITED FARMERS' COMMON OF LOADER DOWNS.**—The Laanecoorie and Woodstock Farmers' Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the fourth day of March, 1861, and the Loader Downs Farmers' Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the twelfth day of March, 1866, are hereby united; and the said United Common shall be for the benefit of all persons entitled to commonage on either of the above-mentioned neighboring commons.—(66.M.15075.)

## BULLA CEMETERY.

## RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE BULLA GENERAL CEMETERY.

ALL charges must be paid when orders are given for interment.

2. Application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery must be made to the trustees; permission, in the form contained in schedule A, will be granted to applicants on payment of the proper charges.

3. The charges will be remitted on the burial of a poor person in the cemetery, on evidence to the satisfaction of the trustees that the deceased was without means, and that his relations or friends are unable to pay the charges.

4. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but should a brick grave or vault be required, it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees, or of some person appointed by them. No grave to be less than six feet deep.

5. Orders for interment to be given to the sexton or other person appointed by the trustees, on the day preceding the interment, between the hours of eight a.m. and six p.m.; the particulars required in schedule B must be stated when giving the order.

6. The time fixed for the funeral must be the time of arrival at the cemetery.

7. The hours appointed for interment are from eight a.m. to six p.m. from 1st September to 30th April, and from eight a.m. to four p.m. during the remainder of the year.

8. The plans of all monuments, tablets, and fences to be erected, must first be submitted to the trustees for approval.

9. Monuments, tablets, and fences are to be kept in proper order and repair at the expense of the owners, or they may be removed by order of the trustees.

10. Every coffin in a vault must be bricked in or cemented.

11. If an interment is to be made in any private vault or grave, the written consent of the owner must be left with the order.

12. A plan of the cemetery, and a register will be kept.

13. No person employed by the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge of his duties.

14. All persons injuring the cemetery, its fences or monuments, will be prosecuted as the law directs.

15. The trustees reserve the right to alter these regulations and charges from time to time, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Governor.

The foregoing Rules and Regulations were agreed to by us at a meeting of trustees held at Bulla, on the 19th September, 1866.

## SCHEDULE A.

Forms of certificate of rights of burial in the Bulla General Cemetery.

On application of \_\_\_\_\_ and upon payment of the sum of \_\_\_\_\_ the trustees of the Bulla General Cemetery, in terms as authorised by the Act of Council, intituled *The Cemeteries Statute 1864*, have agreed to grant and do hereby grant unto the said \_\_\_\_\_ permission to dig or make a grave or vault on that piece of ground \_\_\_\_\_ feet long by \_\_\_\_\_ feet broad, lying within the portion of the said cemetery appropriated for burial, and marked No. \_\_\_\_\_ compartment \_\_\_\_\_ on map or plan of said

cemetery kept by said trustees, with permission to erect or place on the said ground a monument or tombstone on payment of such charges as may from time to time be established. And it is hereby declared that the said \_\_\_\_\_ shall be entitled to have, maintain, and keep up such vault, monument, or tombstone according to the terms of this permission, to and for the sole and separate use of the said \_\_\_\_\_ heirs or near relations for ever. Provided always and it is hereby declared that this grant is made subject to the terms and conditions following, viz.:-

1. That the piece of ground shall be kept and used by the said \_\_\_\_\_ heirs and near relations, solely as a burying-place; and that no other use be made thereof.

2. That no enclosing wall, fence, building, monument, or tombstone shall be erected or placed on the said piece of ground until a plan thereof shall have been exhibited to the said trustees, and their authority given for the erection thereof.

3. That the said grave or vault, and the said wall, fence, building, monument, or tombstone, shall be maintained and kept up by the said \_\_\_\_\_ heirs and near relations in proper repair, to the satisfaction of the said trustees.

4. That the said \_\_\_\_\_ heirs and near relations, shall, in the use of the said piece of ground and access thereto, be subject in every respect to such rules and regulations as the trustees of the said cemetery, may from time to time make; and shall not be entitled to exercise the right to bury or enter therein, except on payment of such charges as shall from time to time be established by the said trustees.

## BOROUGH OF EAGLEHAWK.

### BYE-LAW No. 15.—FOR THE REGULATION OF COMMON LODGING HOUSES.

BE it enacted by the Borough Council of Eaglehawk, that the following Rules shall be and are made for the control and regulation of Common Lodging Houses within the Borough:—

1. In sleeping apartments in wooden buildings not lathed and plastered, where there is a fire-place and door and windows in proportion to the size of the room, a space of 300 cubic feet shall be allowed for each person.
2. In wooden buildings lathed and plastered inside, and in brick and stone buildings with a fire-place and doors and windows in proportion to the size of the room, 400 cubic feet shall be allowed.
3. In all buildings where there is no chimney, 500 cubic feet shall be allowed.

In rooms where there is no chimney, proper means must be taken of admitting a plentiful supply of fresh air near the bottom of the room, and also for permitting the foul air to

escape at the upper part of the room, and no building must be occupied as a sleeping place without a proper amount of ventilation.

Any person or persons neglecting to comply with the above regulations shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and in case of a continuing offence, a further penalty of a sum not exceeding Forty shillings for each day during which such offence shall be continued after written notice from such local authority, or his or their officer appointed aforesaid, of the offence having been committed.
