EXTENSION OF THE ELEVENTH CLAUSE OF THE "FISHERIES AND GAME STATUTE" TO THE RIVER GLENELG.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament passed in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled *An Act to consolidate the Laws for the protection of Fisheries and Game*, it is amongst other things enacted that if any person shall set, lay down, use, or fish with any kind of net in the Yarra Yarra, Plenty, Werribee, or Saltwater rivers, in the Colony of Victoria, or in any other river, lake, creek, stream, or pond, to which the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, shall, by Proclamation duly published in the *Government Gazette*, extend the provisions of the eleventh clause, he shall forfeit such net, and also such sum, not exceeding ten pounds, as the convicting justice shall think fit: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby extend the above recited provisions of the said Act, being the eleventh clause thereof, to the River Glenelg.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this eleventh day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, and in the thirtieth year of Her Majesty's reign.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

NOTICE TO NEWSPAPER PROPRIETORS AND PUBLISHERS, AND TO PRINTERS.

BY the *Printers and Newspapers Registration Statute 1864*, it is required that an affidavit duly sworn and signed by the proprietors, and by the printer and the publisher of every newspaper, shall be deposited with the Registrar General prior to the first publication of a newspaper, and whenever, in any newspaper already registered, any change is made in any of the particulars required to be stated in the affidavit. The penalty for breach of this provision is a sum of not less than £25 nor more than £100. By the same statute it is also required that the printer and the publisher of a newspaper, together with two sufficient sureties, shall, prior to the publication of the newspaper, and also upon the insolvency of a surety and notice from the Chief Secretary, or upon the withdrawal of a surety, enter into recognizances before a Judge of the Supreme Court, or the Police Magistrate of the district, for payment of any fine or penalty that may be inflicted for printing or publishing any blasphemous or seditious libel. The penalty for breach of this provision is a sum of not less than £5 nor more than £20, together with all reasonable costs of discovering and prosecuting the offence.

2. Every person who has any printing press or types for printing is required by the above-mentioned statute to give notice thereof in writing, signed by himself and attested by a witness, to the Registrar General. The penalty for breach of this provision is a sum of not less than £5 nor more than £20. And every person who prints for publication or dispersion any paper or book is required to print his name and place of abode upon the front of every such paper if it be printed upon one side only, and upon the first and last leaf of every paper or book if there be more than one such leaf. The penalty for breach of this provision is a sum of not less than £5 nor more than £20.

The above provisions of the law have been hitherto wholly or in part disobeyed by a large number of newspaper proprietors, publishers, and printers: Notice is hereby given, that after the expiration of one month from this date the law will be strictly enforced against all offenders.

- On application for permission to make a vault, or erect a monument or fence in the cemetery, being made to the trustees, a certificate of permission will be granted on payment of the proper fees.
- All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences to be kept in repair at the expense of the owner.

- Every coffin in a vault must be bricked in, or cemented, or covered by a slab of stone, or slate, or iron.
- All persons found destroying the fences, or in any way injuring the cemetery, will be prosecuted as the law directs.
- When a meeting of trustees is required the same shall be called by the secretary, three to form a quorum.
- The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these regulations, subject to the approval of the Governor in Council.
- The friends of deceased must cause all graves to be dug and erect all monuments, tombs, or fences, under the directions of the trustees or whom they may appoint.
