EXTENSION OF THE ELEVENTH CLAUSE OF THE

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Henry Thomas Manners Sutton, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

In-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament passed in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, initialed An Act to consolidate the Laws for the protection of Fisheries and Game, it is amongst other things enacted that if any person shall set, lay down, use, or fish with any kind of net in the Yarra Yarra, Plenty, Werribee, or Saltwater rivers, in the Colony of Victoria, or in any other river, lake, creek, stream, or pond, to which the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, shall, by Proclamation duly published in the Government Gazette, extend the provisions of the eleventh clause, he shall forfeit such net, and also such sum, not exceeding ten pounds, as the convicting justice shall think fit: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby extend the above recited provisions of the said Act, being the eleventh clause thereof, to the River Glenelg.

NOTICE TO NEWSPAPER PROPRIETORS AND PUBLISHERS, AND TO PRINTERS. PUBLISHERS, AND TO PRINTERS.

BY the Printers and Newspapers Registration Statute 1864, it is required that an affidavit, duly sworn and signed by the proprietors, and by the printer and the publisher of every newspaper, shall be deposited with the Registrar General prior to the first publication of a newspaper, and whenever, in any newspaper already registered, any change is made in any of the particulars required to be stated in the affidavit. The penalty for breach of this provision is a sum of not less than £25 nor more than £100. By the same statute it is also required that two sufficient sureties, shall, prior to the publication of the newspaper, and also upon the insolvency of a surety and notice from the Chief Secretary, or upon the withdrawal of a surety, enter into recognizances before a Judge of the Supreme Court, or the Police Magistrate of the district, for payment of any fine or penalty that may be influcted for printing or publishing any blasphemous or seditious libel. The penalty for breach of this provision is a sum of not less than £5 nor more than £20, together with all reasonable costs of discovering and prosecuting the offence.

2. Every person who has any printing press or types for printing is required by the above-mentioned statute to give notice thereof in writing, signed by himself and attested by a witness, to the Registrar General. The penalty for breach of this provision is a sum of not less than £5 nor more than £20. And every person who prints for publication or dispersion any paper or book is required to print his name and place of abode upon the front of every such paper if it be printed upon one side only, and upon the first and last leaf every paper or book if there be more than one such leaf. The penalty for breach of this provision is a sum of not less than £5 nor more than £20.

The above provisions of the law have been hitherto wholly or in part disobeyed by a large number of newspaper proprietors, publishers, and printers: Notice is hereby given, that after the expiration of one month from this date the law will be strictly enforced against all offenders.
