EXAMINATION OF CANDIDATES FOR PROMOTION.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power conferred by *The Volunteer Statute 1865* (23 Vict. No. 266), has approved of the subjoined Regulations for the examination of Candidates for promotion, to the grades of Subaltern and Non-commissioned Officers and has cancelled the Regulations of 21st December, 1863:—

1. No nomination for promotions made under clause VI. of *The Volunteer Statute 1865* will be confirmed unless the candidates for promotion so nominated shall, previous to nomination have passed the examination as in this regulation is hereafter prescribed, such examination to be conducted wholly by printed questions, and answers written by the candidates.

2. For petty and non-commissioned officers the subjects of examination will be parts I. and II. of the Field Exercise Regulations of 1862. It will also be necessary for their passing that the papers be written clearly and intelligibly.

3. For subaltern officers the pass examination will be in writing, spelling, English composition, and arithmetic, on which subjects the standard of examination will accord, as nearly as possible, with that observed in the preliminary examination for the Civil Service. The professional examination will be in parts I. and II. of the Field Exercise Regulations of 1862.

4. The candidates may also be examined for honors in parts III. and IV., excluding all that is not applicable to the branch of the service in which they are serving.

5. Candidates who pass will, at the close of the examination, be returned by the examiners in the order of merit of the professional examination.

6. In addition to the qualification hereinbefore defined, candidates from the Naval Brigade must produce to the Board of Examiners a certificate from their commanding officer that they are qualified for such nautical service as is proper to their branch of the force and according to their grade in it.

7. The Board of Examiners will be appointed by the Governor in Council before each examination; and all orders which the Colonel Commandant may deem it expedient to issue, for the due execution of the provisions of this order, will be submitted for approval to the minister of the department previously to promulgation.

SECTIONS V. TO X. OF "THE POLICE OFFENCES STATUTE 1865" EXTENDED TO QUEENSLIFFE.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign (No. 265), called *The Police Offences Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend all or any of the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, and may define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place, and vary and alter such limits, and may revoke any such Proclamation; and upon any such Proclamation the provisions so proclaimed shall extend to and be in force in such city, town, district, or place: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Proclamation extend the provisions contained in sections V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X. of Part I. of the said Statute to the Borough hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

The Borough of Queenscliffe.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold fields common, or a town common respectively, as the case may be: And whereas by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase and proclaim (as the case may be) certain commons as hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Acts, that is to say:—

ARARAT UNITED BOROUGH AND GOLD FIELD COMMON, diminished in a Proclamation bearing date the 22nd of February, 1864, and increased by another Proclamation bearing date the 11th of December, 1865, is hereby further increased by

adding thereto the land hereinafter described, viz.:—750 acres, more or less, being the unappropriated Crown Lands within the boundaries described as follows, viz.:—Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 9 of section 5, parish of Burrumbidgee; thence by a line bearing north-westerly to a point on the west boundary of allotment 3, about ten chains south from the north-west angle thereof; thence by a road bearing north to the north-west angle of allotment 1; thence by a road and line bearing north-easterly to the north-west angle of allotment 1A. of section 8; thence by the north boundary of that allotment bearing east to the western boundary of the Langhi Ghiran run; thence by that boundary bearing southerly to the north-east angle of allotment 2 of section 5; and thence by the east boundaries of allotments 2, 4, and 9 bearing southerly to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(66.165.)

CAVENDISH TOWN COMMON.—The unappropriated Crown Lands in the township reserve of Cavendish shall be and are hereby proclaimed a Town Common for all householders in the township of Cavendish.—(66.N.213.)

EURAMBEEN GOLD FIELD COMMON, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 13th day of November, 1865, is hereby diminished by deducting therefrom 6618 acres and 22 perches of land, being allotments 7, 8, 9, and 10, in the parish of Eurambeen; and allotments 41, 42, 43, 44, 45, 46, 47, 48, 49, 57, 58, and 59, in the parish of Trarwala.

1. The hay to be eaten, good, sound, and sweet; the straw to be wheaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (colonial grown) and bran to be sound and sweet and of the best description.

2. The supplies are for police and telegraph horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximative, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed or additional horses be required to be stationed in any of the districts tendered for, the supplies required may be drawn from the contractor. The excess over the estimate will not, however, exceed during the whole year 50 per cent. of the estimated quarterly consumption.

3. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being infringed or vitiated by any contracts made by the military commissariat.

4. 5. 6. 7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

8. If the board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE MACEDON COMMON.

EACH person entitled to depasture stock on the common may register such number as may be from time to time fixed by the managers, subject to such rules and regulations as may be in force. 
