RECEPTION OF VESSELS OF WAR OF THE UNITED STATES.

SIR,—With reference to my circular despatch of the 3rd June last, I transmit to you herewith, for your information and guidance, a copy of a further letter from Earl Russell (13th October, 1865), announcing that all measures of a restrictive nature on vessels of war of the United States in British ports, harbors, or waters, are now to be considered as at an end, and that it is the desire and intention of Her Majesty's Government that unrestricted hospitality and friendship should be shown to vessels of war of the United States in all Her Majesty's ports whether at home or abroad.

SIR,—With reference to my letter of the 2nd of June last, prescribing the course to be taken by Her Majesty's several authorities in all ports, harbors, and waters belonging to Her Majesty, whether in the United Kingdom or beyond the seas, in consequence of the recognition by Her Majesty's Government that peace was restored within the whole territory of which the United States of North America before the commencement of the civil war were in undisturbed possession, and with reference more particularly to that passage in my letter in which it was laid down that Confederate vessels departing in pursuance of requisitions to be made by Her Majesty's authorities from any port, harbor and waters belonging to Her Majesty, in which, at the time of the receipt by those authorities of the fresh orders, such vessels might be found, should then and for the last time have the full benefit of the prohibition theretofore enforced against pursuit of them within twenty-four hours by a cruiser of the United States lying at the time within any such ports, harbors, and waters, I have the honor to state to you that Her Majesty's Government are of opinion that it is desirable that Her Majesty's naval and other authorities at home and in Her Majesty's possessions abroad, should be formally apprised that, as full time has now elapsed since my letter of the 2nd of June for giving effect to the provisions of that letter, all measures of a restrictive nature on vessels of war of the United States in British ports, harbors or waters, are now to be considered as at an end, and that it is the desire and intention of Her Majesty's Government that unrestricted hospitality and friendship should be shown to vessels of war of the United States in all Her Majesty's ports, whether at home or abroad.

I have addressed a similar letter to the Secretaries of State for the Home and India Departments, and to the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury and the Admiralty.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Local Government Act 1863, it is amongst other things enacted, that if the district boards of any two or more districts which shall adjoin each other and form with the boundaries of each one continuous area, and in each of which an annual election or general election, as the case may be, or first appointment of members of the board shall have taken place, shall by petitions under the several common seals thereof pray the Governor in Council that such districts shall be constituted one united district, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council if it shall seem fit so to do to constitute such districts one district under the said Act by such name as shall in and by such Order in Council be assigned to the same, and they shall thereupon be such district accordingly, and with the like effect as upon the constitution of any district thereby or thereunder; and the words "united district" where used in the said Act shall be deemed to mean a district formed by such union: Provided that no such union shall take place upon or within thirty days before the day thereby appointed for holding an annual election of members of the board in or for such several districts or any subdivision thereof: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the first day of December, One

thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, a road district was constituted under the designation of "The Stanley Road District." And whereas by another Proclamation bearing date the thirtieth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, a road district was constituted under the designation of "The Wooragee Road District." And whereas the district boards of the said road districts have by petitions under the respective common seals of the said boards prayed the Governor in Council, in manner provided by the above-recited Act, that the said road districts shall be constituted one united district: And whereas it seemed fit to the Governor in Council to make an Order in Council this day, constituting the said road districts one district as hereinafter mentioned: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the constitution of the said Stanley Road District and Wooragee Road District to be One District under the said Act, by the name in and by the said Order in Council assigned to the same, that is to say:—

THE BEECHWORTH UNITED ROAD DISTRICT.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-seventh day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, and in the twenty-ninth year of Her Majesty's reign.

WORKS ON MAIN ROADS.

THE Governor in Council, in exercise of the power conferred by *The Local Government Act 1863*, has, by Orders severally made on the 18th and 27th days of December, 1865, directed that the undermentioned Shire Councils shall, within the times by the said respective Orders appointed, execute the works on Main Roads hereinafter named and described, as provided by the 220th section of the said Act, according to plans deposited with the Board of Land and Works, that is to say:—

The Council of the Shire of Avoca shall, within twelve months from the 18th of December, 1865, drain, form, and metal about sixty-seven chains of the Main Maryborough to Avoca road.

The Council of the Shire of Hampden shall, within twelve months from the 27th of December, 1865, drain, form, and metal about seven miles seventy-seven chains and sixty-five links of the Main Geelong to Warnambrook road.

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Inspector of Stores, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge of police at each station, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

The tenders for each station will be accepted or rejected separately.

Tenders may be for either of the supplies required, oats, bran, hay, or straw only; and if all be included in one tender, it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable.

As much forage as the storage will accommodate will be drawn at a time for the convenience of contractors.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS.

1. The hay to be eaten, good, sound, and sweet; the straw to be wheaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (colonial grown) and bran to be sound and sweet and of the best description.

2. The supplies are for police and telegraph horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximative, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed or additional horses be required to be stationed in any of the districts tendered for, the supplies required may be drawn from the contractor. The excess over the estimate will not, however, exceed during the whole year 50 per cent. of the estimated quarterly consumption.

3. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being infringed or vitiated by any contracts made by the military commissariat.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the gross weight, the tare, and the net weight, to be endorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the District, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

8. If the board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct not exceeding £20, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. MEREDITH ROAD BOARD.

BYE-LAWS TO REGULATE THE PROCEEDINGS THEREOF.

THAT the ordinary meetings of the board shall be held on the last Wednesday in every month at Twelve o'clock noon.

2. At every ordinary meeting of the board, the first business thereof shall be the reading and confirmation of the minutes of any preceding meetings not hitherto confirmed; and no discussion shall be permitted thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings. The minutes, when confirmed, shall be signed by the chairman, or (in his absence) by the acting chairman.

3. The order of business shall be as follows, or as near thereto as practicable:—

- (1.) Correspondence—considering and ordering thereon.
- (2.) Reading and ordering on reports of committees, deputations, and officers.
- (3.) Payment of accounts.
- (4.) Acceptance of tenders, if any.
- (5.) Reception and reading of memorials and petitions
- (6.) Orders of the day.
- (7.) Reading notices of motion for consideration at future meetings.
- (8.) That the introduction of new members take precedence of all other business of the board.

4. Every petition or memorial addressed to the board shall be in proper form, and must be presented by a member, who shall be responsible for its being respectfully worded; and no debate shall take place thereon, except as to its being received

and taken into consideration after the orders of the day, or at a future meeting, or, if necessary, that it be referred to a committee.

5. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the Board, and any business which the chairman may think fit to bring under consideration.

6. Every notice of motion shall be given to the clerk in writing, and shall be read aloud at the meeting previous to that in which the same is to be taken into consideration, and every such notice shall be considered in the order in which it is given.

7. No motion entered on the paper shall be considered unless the member who has given such notice, or some other member authorised by him in writing, be present when the business is called on. Notices not so proceeded with shall be struck off the paper.

8. The mover of any motion which may be referred to a committee shall for that occasion be a member of such committee.

9. Every member shall stand while addressing the chairman.

10. The chairman's ruling shall be final on all matters of order or practice.

11. Every motion and amendment shall be entered in the minutes, with the names of the mover and seconder, and on a division thereon the votes shall be recorded, if so required by any member.

12. One amendment only shall be discussed at a time, but if lost, another may be moved before the original motion be put to the vote; but on any amendment being carried it shall take the place of the original motion.

13. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for the adjournment of a meeting; but if on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject under consideration or the next on the notice paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the business then undisposed of shall have precedence at the next ordinary meeting of the Board.

14. No member shall speak twice on the same question, except by way of explanation or reply upon any original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of the amendment then last proposed; and after the reply, the amendment, or the original motion, as the case may be, shall be immediately put to the vote.

15. Every member when proposing a motion or an amendment, or when speaking on any matter, shall address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted, unless called to order, whereupon he shall sit down until the question of order shall have been decided: the member in possession of the chair may resume the subject.

16. Any member who shall refuse to obey when ruled out of order, or shall use any expression capable of being applied offensively to any other member, and who, if required by the chairman, shall refuse to withdraw such expression and make satisfactory apology, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for the offence.

17. Any member may require the clerk to take down any particular words used by a member immediately upon the same being uttered.

18. Any member may record his protest against any resolution of the board on giving notice of his intention to do so, on the adoption of such resolution, and on such member entering such protest, and his reasons for protesting, in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the board, and on his signing the same before the next meeting of the board; provided always that such protest may be expunged by a majority of the board as not being in accordance with the truth, or not being in its terms respectful to the board.

19. No motion, the effect of which, if carried, would involve the expenditure of any sum of money exceeding Twenty pounds (£20), excepting three clear days' notice shall be given in writing to each member, when the sum may be extended to Fifty pounds (£50).

20. When any tender shall have been accepted by the board the contractor shall comply with the general conditions of the contract.

21. All contracts shall be made by tender, unless the board shall otherwise direct. All tenders shall be addressed to the chairman, and only opened at the time of their consideration by the board; the respective amounts, together with the names of the persons tendering, are to be entered in every case in the minutes of the board. Every tender shall be accompanied with a deposit of ten per cent. on the amount of the contract; the sum so deposited shall be returned to the contractor when the works have been completed to the satisfaction of the board, and the surveyor's certificate obtained. In case of tenders not accepted the deposits will be returned immediately after the tenders have been considered.

22. The clerk and surveyor are to be present at all ordinary meetings of the board.

23. That a monthly report be always laid on the table by the surveyor, and a balance-sheet by the treasurer.

24. That the collector shall, once a week at least, pay to the treasurer of the board all moneys received by him from time to time on behalf of the board, and at the same time furnish the clerk with an account of such money.
