NOTE.—During the year 1865, 50,976 persons arrived in the colony and 25,292 persons departed therefrom. The increase by excess of arrivals over departures was therefore 5,884. The children born during the year numbered 25,811, and the persons who died 10,465. The excess of births over deaths was therefore 15,345, and the total gain to the population from all sources was 21,029, as shown above. The number of marriages solemilzed during the year was 4,394. It may be remarked that the number of births, deaths, and marriages will probably be alightly altered when the returns of the deputy registrars and clergy are finally examined.
