W HEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign (No. 265), called The Police Offences Statute 1865, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may by Proclamation in the Government Gazette extend all or any of the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, and may define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place, and vary and alter such limits, and may revoke any such Proclamation; and upon any such Proclamation the provisions so proclaimed shall extend to and be in force in such city, town, district, or place; Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Proclamation extend the provisions contained in sections V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X. of Part I. of the said Statute to the

WHEREAS by The Land Act 1862 it is amongst other things enacted that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any municipal district, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold fields common, or a town common respectively, as the case may be: And whereas by The Amending Land Act 1865 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of The Land Act 1862 and the tow recting Act. Now therefore I. Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase, and proclaim (as the case may be) certain commons as hereinafter unentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Acts, that is to say:—

#### SHIRE OF MARONG.

BYE-LAW No. 1.—TO REGULATE BY STANDING ORDERS THE PROCEEDINGS AND AFFAIRS OF THE COUNCIL OF THE SHIEE OF MARONG.

THE business of the council shall be conducted with open doors, except on special occasions; and if at any time interruption be caused by persons present who are not members of the council, the president shall require them to withdraw.

2. The ordinary meetings of the council shall be held at the Council Chambers, on the first and third Thursday in every month, at Eleven o'clock a.m., and the business shall commence as soon after that hour as a quorum of five councillors shall be in attendance; but should a quorum not be present at the expiration of one hour after that time appointed for the meetings the same shall be entered with the names of the councillors present in the minute-book, and such meeting shall be adjourned.

3. Special meetings of the council shall on the requisition of

adjourned.

3. Special meetings of the council shall, on the requisition of three or more councillors, be convened by the secretary, the object of such meeting being set forth in the requisition. Four clear days' notice, at least, shall be given to cach councillor.

4. The first business at all ordinary meetings of the council shall be the reading the minutes of any preceding meeting (or meetings, if any special), in order to their confirmation; and no discussion shall be permitted thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record.

5. At all ordinary meetings of the council, after the confirmation of the minutes, the following shall be the order of business:—

- 1. Reading, considering, and ordering upon correspon-
- dence.

  2. Receiving and reading petitions and memorials.

  3. Reading and ordering on reports of committees and
- officers.
  4. Orders of the day.
  5. Examination and passing of accounts for payment.
  6. Reading notices of motion for future meetings.

6. Reading notices of motion for future meetings.
6. Every petition or memorial addressed to the council shall be presented by a councillor, who shall be responsible for its being respectfully worded.
7. The orders of the day shall include all business incomplete at a former meeting, all matters of which due notice has been given, and any business which the president, or any councillor, or the secretary, may introduce, and in the ordering of which a verbal instruction to an officer may be deemed sufficient.
8. Notices of motion for the next ordinary meeting of the council, signed by the mover, shall be read aloud and handed to the secretary, to be entered in a book to he kept for that purpose.

9. Any motion of which notice has been given being brought forward, and the councillor giving the notice not being present, shall be struck out or dealt with as the council may decide.

10. The president's ruling shall be final on all matters of order or practice, and shall be given without comment or argument.

11. Every councillor, including the president, shall stand while addressing the council.

12. Any councillor when speaking to a motion or amendment shall address the president, and shall not be interrupted except by a call to order, when the member calling to order shall be heard and the point of order decided before the business shall be resumed or other matters brought forward. resumed or other matters brought forward.

13. Any motion or amendment not seconded will not be entertained.

14. When two or more councillors rise to speak, the president shall call upon the councillor who, in his opinion, first rose in

15. No councillor shall speak twice on the same motion or amendment except by way of explanation, or in reply upon any original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as mover of the amendment last proposed; and the president shall call to order any councillor proceeding to speak a second time on the same motion or amendment.

16. Any councillor moving or seconding any motion or amendment shall be held to have spoken upon that motion or amendment.

amendment.

17. As soon as the debate on any question shall be concluded the president shall put the question distinctly and audibly, first in the affirmative and then in the negative, as often as he may think necessary; and no councillor shall speak to any question after the same shall have been put by the president.

18. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but if lost, another may be moved before the original question is put to the vote; but upon any amendment being carried, it shall be competent for any councillor to move one other amendment upon it, but no more.

competent for any councillor to move one other amendment upon it, but no more.

19. The council shall vote in all cases by show of hands, and if there be an equal division of votes on any question, the president or acting president shall, in addition to his own vote as councillor, have a second or casting vote; provided that if there be an equality of votes in the election of president, it shall be decided by ballot which of the councillors having an equal number of votes shall be the president.

20. The adoption of any amendment by the council shall, be held to have quashed the original motion.

21. No motion involving the expenditure of a sum exceeding \$10, or any important business, shall be entertained by the council unless notice of the same has been given at a previous meeting.

council unless notice of the same has occur given as a provide meeting.

22. Every motion or amendment shall be in writing, and shall be signed by the mover and seconder and shall be entered in a minute book, and upon a division the names of the councillors for and against shall be recorded.

23. The mover of any motion or amendment may withdraw the same before it is seconded, by permission of the president; but if seconded, such leave can only be given by leave of the seconder.

seconder.

24. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the council; and if on the question being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next in order, shall be discussed before any other motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the business then undisposed of shall have precedence at the adjourned meeting of the council.

precedence at the adjourned meeting of the council.

25. No councillor shall digress from the subject under discussion, or impute motive to others, and all personal reflection upon any councillor shall be considered as highly disorderly, and the councillor making use of such offensive expressions shall withdraw the same and make an apology, if required to do so by the council the council.

26. The secretary may be required to take down in writing, any particular words used by a councillor immediately upon the same being used.

27. No resolution previously passed by the council shall be revoked or altered, except in strict accordance with clause 136 of The Local Government Act.

28. It shall be competent for any councillor, without previous notice, to move that a call be made of all the members of the council for the next ordinary meeting, for the consideration of any subject, which shall be stated in the motion, provided that such meeting be not held sooner than ten days from the day on which the motion is made, and if the motion of call be passed the secretary shall give due notice to each councillor of the obect of the call and the time and place of the neeting.

ect of the call and the time and place of the neeting.

29. Any councillor may, of right, require the production of any of the documents of the council that may bear on the subject under discussion.

30. Any councillor may enter his protest against any resolution of the council provided that such protest is not inconsistent with truth or disrespectful to the council; notice of intention to protest must, however, be given in every case on the adoption of the resolution protested against, and the protest, signed by the member or members protesting and specifying the reasons for protesting, must be entered before the next ordinary meeting of the council by the protesting member in a book kept for that purpose at the council-chamber and duly referred to in the minutes of the council, the same to be considered part of such minutes.

Any contractor whose tender shall be accepted by the council who fails, or refuses to sign the contract within seven days, and proceed with the work within ten days from the date of the acceptance of the tender, shall forfeit the amount of his deposit, and be disqualified for six months from tendering directly or indirectly under the council.

33. The preliminary deposit of the successful tenderer shall be retained by the council as security for the due fulfilment of his contract, such amount to be refunded to the contractor by the council, together with the balance due to him within one month from the date of the engineer's certificate of the due fulfilment of the contract.

34. Advances may be made to contractors at a rate not exceeding seventy-five per cent on the engineer's estimate of the value of work then-done.

35. When any tender shall have been accepted by the council, a contract bond shall be entered into, signed by the contractor and also two members of the council appointed for that purpose, and the contractor shall also be required to sign the plan and specification of the work for which his tender has been accepted.

36. 5. All fees must be paid quarterly in advance, on the 1st of day of January, 1st day of April, 1st day of July, and the 1st day of October in each year, and no cattle will be considered as registered unless such fees are paid at the time of entering the brand of such cattle by the herdsman.

6. The herdsman will attend at the branding yard during the first three days of each quarter to register and brand all cattle brought to him by the owners for registration, but after that time a fee of sixpence per head will be charged for all cattle which the herdsman shall receive and brand.

7. The fees for all cattle over 12 months old (horses excepted), will be eight shillings per head per annum; six months old and under twelve months, six shillings per head; and for horses twelve shillings per head per annum. All cattle under six months old free.

8. That in no case will either a bull or entire horse be permitted on the common without the written consent of the

9. That in no case will sheep be permitted to graze on said common during the first year, at the end of which time, if the then commoners or a majority of them agree to depasture sheep, this rule will be altered or amended to suit their wishes.

10. The herdsman will have the authority of the managers to impound all sheep or cattle found trespassing on said common, an entry of which he shall make in a book kept for that purpose, so that damages and fees arising from the same may be properly accounted for.

11. The managers reserve the right to cause all cattle suspected of disease to be removed from the common, or to such part of the common as they may direct; and in the event of any animal or animals dying upon the common, the owner or owners shall, within six hours of receiving notice from the managers or herdsman so to do, completely, destroy by fire, or cause to be destroyed, the carcass or carcasses of such animal or animals. If owner neglect to so destroy carcass or carcasses, the managers may have same destroyed at expense of owner, the cost recoverable as a common debt.

12. No person shall be allowed to remove cattle from the

13. It will be the herdsman's duty to see all the cattle under his charge once every 48 hours; should any be missing during that time, he is to inform or give notice to the owners thereof the day following, and make an entry in his book to that effect; failing to do so will subject him in each case to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings, and one shilling per day for each beast until it is found.

14. Should the fees collected be insufficient to pay the herdsman's salary and other expenses connected with the management, an additional charge will be made on each commoner in fair proportion to the number of cattle depastured by him; and each commoner will be under the conditions that he can besued for the same, and the amount recoverable as a common debt.

15. The herdsman shall be accountable to the commoners for any loss sustained by having their cattle impounded if strayed off the common, the amount in each case not to exceed the impounding expenses; and the herdsman shall receive as an equivalent sixpence per head from the managers for all cattle found trespassing on said common.

16. Should the managers at any time consider the herdsman incompetent or neglectful of his duties, they can remove or displace him without a written notice, and he can have no claim upon them for compensation whatever.

17. The managers do not hold themselves responsible for any neglect or irregularity of the herdsman.

18. All diseased cattle found tresspassing will be immediately destroyed at the expense of the owner, if known; if owner not known, the managers may cause same to be destroyed, the cost to be out of the funds of the common.

19. No pigs allowed on the common. Managers to have power to prosecute owner of pigs trespassing on common, or for any damage sustained by them.

20. The managers reserve to themselves the power, in exceptional cases where considered necessary, to allow more stock on the common, or withdraw them in fair proportion from each commoner as they may think necessary, as the case may be.
