SECTIONS V. TO X. OF "THE POLICE OFFENCES STATUTE 1865" EXTENDED TO AVCCA.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight
Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath,
Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of
Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed
in the session held in the twenty-eighth year of Her
Majesty's reign (No. 265), called *The Police Offences Statute*
1865, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in
Council may by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend
all or any of the provisions contained in Part I. of the
said Statute to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, and
may define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place,
and vary and alter such limits, and may revoke any such Pro-
clamation; and upon any such Proclamation the provisions so
proclaimed shall extend to and be in force in such city, town,
district, or place: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling,
the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive
Council, by this my Proclamation extend the provisions con-
tained in sections V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X. of Part I.
of the said Statute to the

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight
Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath,
Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of
Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act* 1862 it is amongst other
things enacted that when any Crown land remains
unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon
or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles
of any town not contained in any municipal district, the
Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal
common, or a gold fields common, or a town common respec-
tively, as the case may be: And whereas by *The Amending Land*
Act 1865 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor
in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or
abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or
reproclaimed, and may from time to time reproclaim the whole
or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and
subject to the provisions of *The Land Act* 1862 and the now
recited Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the
Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council,
do hereby increase and proclaim (as the case may be) certain
commons as hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the pro-
visions of the above-recited Acts, that is to say:—

DUNKELD TOWN COMMON.—The Town Common of Dun-
keld, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 22nd of Sep-
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tember, 1862, is hereby increased by the addition thereto of the
unappropriated Crown Lands within the township of Dunkeld.
Area of extension, 560 acres, more or less.—(66.M.642.)

HAWKESDALE TOWN COMMON.—The unappropriated Crown
Lands within the township of Hawkesdale are hereby pro-
claimed a Town Common, for the use of all householders of
that township. Area, 600 acres, more or less.—(65.K.15735.)

KIRKSTALL TOWN COMMON.—The unappropriated Crown
Lands within the township of Kirkstall are hereby proclaimed
a Town Common for the use of all householders of that town-
ship. Area, 290 acres, more or less.—(65.K.15735.)

KOROIT TOWN COMMON.—The unappropriated Crown Lands
within the township of Koroit are hereby proclaimed a Town
Common for the use of all householders of that township.
Area, 30 acres, more or less.—(65.K.15735.)

MACARTHUR TOWN COMMON.—The unappropriated Crown
Lands within the township of Macarthur are hereby proclaimed
a Town Common for the use of all householders of that town-
ship. Area, 500 acres, more or less.—(65.K.15735.)

MOOROOLBARK FARMERS' COMMON.—The Mooroolbark
Farmers' Common, described amongst others in a Proclamation
bearing date 18th February, 1861, is hereby extended by the
addition thereto of the allotments hereinafter enumerated, and
comprising an area of 1314 acres 2 roods 36 perches, viz.:—
Allotments 28, 29, 29a, 30, and 31 in the parish of Mooroolbark.—
(66.N.159.)

ORFORD TOWN COMMON.—The unappropriated Crown Lands
within the township of Orford are hereby proclaimed a Town
Common for the use of all householders of that township. Area,
570 acres, more or less.—(65.K.15735.)

PENSHURST TOWN COMMON.—The unappropriated Crown
Lands within the boundaries hereinafter described, are hereby
proclaimed a Town Common for the use of all householders of
the township of Penshurst, viz.:—Commencing at the south-
west angle of the said township; thence by the west boundary
thereof, bearing north sixty-four chains seventy-two links;
thence by a line bearing east one hundred and thirty-seven
chains, more or less, to a point on the prolongation of the east
side of the road forming the east boundaries of sections 32, 33,
34, and 35; thence by the said prolongation and road being a
line bearing south sixty-four chains seventy-two links to the
south boundary of the township; and thence by that boundary
bearing west one hundred and thirty-seven chains, more or less,
to the point of commencement. The bearings are from the true
meridian. Area, 800 acres, more or less.—(66.M.642.)

WINSLOW TOWN COMMON.—The unappropriated Crown
Lands within the township of Winslow are hereby proclaimed
a Town Common for the use of all householders of that town-
ship. Area, 480 acres, more or less.—(66.N.318.)

WOOLSTHORPE TOWN COMMON.—The unappropriated
Crown Lands within the township of Woolsthorpe, are hereby
proclaimed a Town Common, for the use of all householders of
that township. Area, 1070 acres, more or less.—(65.K.15735.)

CONDITIONS.

1. The hay to be eaten, good, sound, and sweet; the straw to be wheaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (colonial grown) and bran to be sound and sweet and of the best description.

2. The supplies are for police and telegraph horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximative, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed or additional horses be required to be stationed in any of the districts tendered for, the supplies required may be drawn from the contractor. The excess over the estimate will not, however, exceed during the whole year 50 per cent. of the estimated quarterly consumption.

3. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being infringed or vitiated by any contracts made by the military commissariat.

4. 5. 6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

8. If the board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. SHIRE OF MARONG.

BYE-LAW No. 1.—TO REGULATE BY STANDING ORDERS THE PROCEEDINGS AND AFFAIRS OF THE COUNCIL OF THE SHIRE OF MARONG.

THE business of the council shall be conducted with open doors, except on special occasions; and if at any time interruption be caused by persons present who are not members of the council, the president shall require them to withdraw.

2. The ordinary meetings of the council shall be held at the Council Chambers, on the first and third Thursday in every month, at Eleven o'clock a.m., and the business shall commence as soon after that hour as a quorum of five councillors shall be in attendance; but should a quorum not be present at the expiration of one hour after the time appointed for the meetings the same shall be entered with the names of the councillors present in the minute-book, and such meeting shall be adjourned.

3. Special meetings of the council shall, on the requisition of three or more councillors, be convened by the secretary, the object of such meeting being set forth in the requisition. Four clear days' notice, at least, shall be given to each councillor.

4. The first business at all ordinary meetings of the council shall be the reading the minutes of any preceding meeting (or meetings, if any special) in order to their confirmation; and no discussion shall be permitted thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record.

5. At all ordinary meetings of the council, after the confirmation of the minutes, the following shall be the order of business:—

1. Reading, considering, and ordering upon correspondence.
2. Receiving and reading petitions and memorials.
3. Reading and ordering on reports of committees and officers.
4. Orders of the day.
5. Examination and passing of accounts for payment.
6. Reading notices of motion for future meetings.

6. Every petition or memorial addressed to the council shall be presented by a councillor, who shall be responsible for its being respectfully worded.

7. The orders of the day shall include all business incomplete at a former meeting, all matters of which due notice has been given, and any business which the president, or any councillor, or the secretary, may introduce, and in the ordering of which a verbal instruction to an officer may be deemed sufficient.

8. Notices of motion for the next ordinary meeting of the council, signed by the mover, shall be read aloud and handed to the secretary, to be entered in a book to be kept for that purpose.

11. Every councillor, including the president, shall stand while addressing the council.

by a call to order, when the member calling to order shall be heard and the point of order decided before the business shall be resumed or other matters brought forward.

14. When two or more councillors rise to speak, the president shall call upon the councillor who, in his opinion, first rose in his place.

16. Any councillor moving or seconding any motion or amendment shall be held to have spoken upon that motion or amendment.

18. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but if lost, another may be moved before the original question is put

19. The council shall vote in all cases by show of hands, and if there be an equal division of votes on any question, the president or acting president shall, in addition to his own vote as

20. The adoption of any amendment by the council shall be held to have quashed the original motion.

22. Every motion or amendment shall be in writing, and shall be signed by the mover and seconder and shall be entered in a minute book, and upon a division the names of the councillors for and against shall be recorded.

24. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the council; and if on the question being put the

25. No councillor shall digress from the subject under discussion, or impute motive to others, and all personal reflection upon any councillor shall be considered as highly disorderly.

26. The secretary may be required to take down, in writing, any particular words used by a councillor immediately upon the same being used.

28. It shall be competent for any councillor, without previous notice, to move that a call be made of all the members of the council for the next ordinary meeting, for the consideration of

29. Any councillor may, of right, require the production of any of the documents of the council that may bear on the subject under discussion.

38. The valuer or valuers appointed by the council shall visit and examine every rateable property within the shire, and after having valued such property shall deliver, or cause to be de-

40. The secretary shall have the custody of the common seal of the corporation, and shall be empowered to affix the same to any corporate document requiring such affixture, and also in

41. In all cases it shall be sufficient for the collector to call once for any sum due on the rate roll, and in the event of any such sum not being paid to him when he calls for it he shall leave

Every seven days all moneys received by the collector for rates shall be paid to the shire treasurer, and the collector shall take a receipt for the same.

3. That all cattle sent to said common shall have the Bundalah Farmers' Common brand on them, in order that the herdsman may be able to discover any strange cattle that may be at any time upon said common.

4. All owners of stock depasturing cattle on said common shall muster their cattle upon receiving notice from managers or herdsman, and assist in branding them with the Common brand.

5. All fees must be paid quarterly in advance, on the 1st of day of January, 1st day of April, 1st day of July, and the 1st day of October in each year, and no cattle will be considered as registered unless such fees are paid at the time of entering the brand of such cattle by the herdsman.

6. The herdsman will attend at the branding yard during the first three days of each quarter to register and brand all cattle brought to him by the owners for registration, but after that time a fee of sixpence per head will be charged for all cattle which the herdsman shall receive and brand.

7. The fees for all cattle over 12 months old (horses excepted), will be eight shillings per head per annum; six months old and under twelve months, six shillings per head; and for horses twelve shillings per head per annum. All cattle under six months old free.

8. That in no case will either a bull or entire horse be permitted on the common without the written consent of the managers.

9. That in no case will sheep be permitted to graze on said common during the first year, at the end of which time, if the then commoners or a majority of them agree to depasture sheep, this rule will be altered or amended to suit their wishes.

10. The herdsman will have the authority of the managers to impound all sheep or cattle found trespassing on said common, an entry of which he shall make in a book kept for that purpose, so that damages and fees arising from the same may be properly accounted for.

11. The managers reserve the right to cause all cattle suspected of disease to be removed from the common, or to such part of the common as they may direct; and in the event of any animal or animals dying upon the common, the owner or owners shall, within six hours of receiving notice from the managers or herdsman so to do, completely destroy by fire, or cause to be destroyed, the carcass or carcasses of such animal or animals. If owner neglect to so destroy carcass or carcasses, the managers may have same destroyed at expense of owner, the cost recoverable as a common debt.

12. No person shall be allowed to remove cattle from the common without having previously given due notice to the herdsman.

13. It will be the herdsman's duty to see all the cattle under his charge once every 48 hours; should any be missing during that time, he is to inform or give notice to the owners thereof the day following, and make an entry in his book to that effect; failing to do so will subject him in each case to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings, and one shilling per day for each beast until it is found.

14. Should the fees collected be insufficient to pay the herdsman's salary and other expenses connected with the management, an additional charge will be made on each commoner in fair proportion to the number of cattle depastured by him; and each commoner will be under the conditions that he can be sued for the same, and the amount recoverable as a common debt.

15. The herdsman shall be accountable to the commoners for any loss sustained by having their cattle impounded if strayed off the common, the amount in each case not to exceed the impounding expenses; and the herdsman shall receive as an equivalent sixpence per head from the managers for all cattle found trespassing on said common.

16. Should the managers at any time consider the herdsman incompetent or neglectful of his duties, they can remove or displace him without a written notice, and he can have no claim upon them for compensation whatever.

17. The managers do not hold themselves responsible for any neglect or irregularity of the herdsman.

18. All diseased cattle found trespassing will be immediately destroyed at the expense of the owner, if known; if owner not known, the managers may cause same to be destroyed, the cost to be out of the funds of the common.

19. No pigs allowed on the common. Managers to have power to prosecute owner of pigs trespassing on common, or for any damage sustained by them.

20. The managers reserve to themselves the power, in exceptional cases where considered necessary, to allow more stock on the common, or withdraw them in fair proportion from each commoner as they may think necessary, as the case may be.


