THE SUBDIVISIONS OF THE CRANBOURNE ROAD DISTRICT.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the nineteenth day of February, 1866.

WHEREAS. by The Local-Government Act 1863 it is
amongst other things enacted that at any time after
the first annual election or general election, as the case may be,
or first appointment of members of the district board, for any
original or proclaimed district thereinafter sometimes called
"single district," the Governor in Council, if it seem fit, may,
and if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by
twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect
of rateable property in the said district, shall within three months

after the receipt of the same divide the district into two, or, if the Governor in Council shall see fit, into three separate electoral subdivisions, thereinafter called subdivisions, by such names as shall by such Order in Council be assigned to the same, and in and by such Order in Council be assigned to the same, and in and by such Order in Council the boundaries of the subdivisions shall be made within three months before any day appointed for holding any election of members of the district board in or for such district: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the nineteenth day of June, 1860, a road district was proclaimed under the designation of "The Oranbourne Road District," and the boundaries of the said road district as at present existing are defined in another Proclamation bearing date the twenty-ninh day of September, 1862: And whereas the Governor in Council has received a petition signed by not less than twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said road district, praying for the division of the same into three subdivisions: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order divide the Cranbourne Road District into three separate electoral subdivisions in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, by the names hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, and doth hereby set forth the boundaries of the said several subdivisions in manner following, that is to say:—

THE CRANDOURNE SUBDIVISION—Commencing at the southwest angle of the parish of Cranbourne: thence north, east.

THE CRANBOURNI SUBDIVISION—Commencing at the southwest angle of the parish of Cranbourne; thence north, east, south, and westerly by the west, north, east, and south boundaries of the said parish to the commencing point.

THE LYNDHURST SUBDIVISION—Commencing at the southeast angle of the parish of Lyndhurst; thence west by the south boundary of the said parish, to the western boundary of the Cranbourne Road District; thence following the western, northern, and eastern boundary of the said road district, to the north-east angle of the parish of Lyndhurst; thence south by the eastern boundary of the abovenamed parish to the commencing point.

WHERAS by The Electoral Act 1865 it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council shall, as he shall see fit from time to time, appoint within and for each division of every province and district respectively one place and not more for taking the poll in such division at contested elections for the province or district, and every such appointment may revoke; provided that if the returning officer of the province or district and any police magistrate or superintendent of police acting in the locality shall by writing under their hands certify to the Governor that it is necessary so to do it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to appoint as aforesaid in and for such division one or more polling place or places, and the appointment of such place or places or any of them from time to time to revoke; provided also that no appointment of any polling place in or for any division of a province or district shall be revoked between the issue of any writ for election for the same and the return of such writ: And whereas the returning officers for the respective electoral districts and the police magistrate or superintendent of police acting in the respective localities bereinafter mentioned have, by writing under their hands, certified to the Governor that it is necessary to appoint additional polling places for certain divisions of such districts: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order appoint the polling places mentioned in the schedule hereunto annexed to be polling places for the divisions opposite to the names of which they are respectively placed, that is to say:

Whereas by The Passengers Act 1855, it's is amongst other things enacted, that before any passenger ship shall be cleared out, the emigration officer at the port of clearance shall satisfy himself that there is on board a sufficient quantity of pure water, carried in tanks or casks, to secure throughout the intended voyage the issue of three quarts daily to each statute adult, for the use of the passengers, exclusive of the quantity required for cooking:

And whereas it is also enacted that it shall be barful for the Mose.

And whereas it is also enacted, that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by any Order in Council, to prescribe such rules and regulations as to Her Majesty may seem fit, for permitting the use on board passenger ships of an apparatus for distilling water, and for defining in such case the quantity of fresh water to be carried in tanks or casks for the passengers, and such Order in Council from time to time to alter, amend, and revoke, as occasion may require: sion may require:

And whereas Her Majesty, by an Order in Council dated the ninth day of January, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, prescribed certain rules for permitting the use on board passenger ships propelled by steam-engines offless than a certain power, and on board passenger ships propelled by sails, of a certain apparatus for distilling fresh water from salt water:

And whereas it is expedient to repeal the said Order in Coun-cil, and to issue in lieu thereof the Order hereinafter contained:

Now therefore Her Majesty doth, by and with the advice of
Her Privy Council, and in pursuance and in exercise of the

in so far as the same repeals a certain Order in Council of the
thirteenth day of May, One thousand eight hundred and fiftynine, and doth hereby order as follows:

Any passenger ship propelled by sails only, or by steamengines of less power than is sufficient, without the aid of sails, to propel the ship at the rate of five statute miles an hour, may be cleared out and proceed on her voyage, having on board, in tanks or casks, only half of the quantity of pure water required by the said Act to be carried for the use of the passengers, provided the following conditions be observed, that is to say:—

- 1. That there be on board such ship an efficient apparatus for distilling fresh water from salt water, of the description commonly known either as Normandy's patent, as Winchester and Graveley's patent, or as Chaplin and Company's patent.
- 2. That the owners, charterers, or master of such ship, before clearance, lodge with such emigration officer a certificate from the engineer or surveyor of the Board of Trade, or from some other competent person to be named by such emigration officer, declaring that within seven days immediately preceding the date of such

certificate, the apparatus has been examined by him, and is then certineate, the apparatus has been examined by him, and is then in good working condition, and stating the number of imperial gallons of pure fresh water which it is capable of producing in every twenty-four hours, and further declaring that the apparatus on board is either Normandy's, Winchester and Graveley's, or Chaplin and Company's patent, as the case may be.

3. That in every case such emigration officer shall be satisfied that the number of gallons of pure water which the apparatus is so certified to be capable of producing is not less than the whole number of persons about to proceed on the intended voyage of such ship, that is to say, the whole number of cabin passengers, passengers, and crew.

4. That there is rated on the ship's articles, and that there is on board the ship, some person or persons who to the satisfaction of the said emigration officer, shall be competent for the proper management and repair of such distilling apparatus:

And to prevent all doubts on the construction of this Order in Council, it is hereby further ordered, that the terms "passenger ship," "emigration officer," "statute adult," and "master" shall herein have the same significations as are assigned to them respectively in the said Passengers Act 1855.

And the Right Honorable Edward Cardwell, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

PARTICULARS TO AID DETECTION.

A mare, the joint property of the deceased men, was found dead, saddled and bridled, about fifty yards from the hut with three punctured wounds in the neck.
