MANAGER OF COMMON-TOLL ROADS.

THE Governor in Council has, by Order of the 19th of February, 1866, made the following appointment and arrangement with reference to the Common-toll Roads herein-after mentioned, under the provisions of the Act 27 Victoria No. 176, § 256, &c., viz.:

JOHN CRAVEN

to be Manager (*vice* E. T. Bradshaw, whose term of office has expired) of the portions of the Brighton, Gardiner's Creek, and Dandenong roads, proclaimed Common-toll Roads under Orders in Council of 28th December, 1863, and 8th February and 30th March, 1864; and that he shall, upon the last day but three of each calendar month, receive from the collectors and lessees of all tolls upon the said portions of roads so proclaimed, and upon the bridges thereon, all monies collected by them as and for such tolls or due by them as the rents thereof; and that he shall, within four days after the receipt thereof, distribute the tolls so collected amongst the local bodies interested therein, as directed by Order in Council of 18th July, 1864; such appointment to continue in force until 31st December, 1866.

THE SUBDIVISIONS OF THE CRANBOURNE ROAD DISTRICT.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the nineteenth day of February, 1866.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor

Mr. McCulloch Mr. Grant
Mr. Michie Mr. Sullivan
Mr. Francis

WHEREAS, by The Local Government Act 1863 it is amongst other things enacted that at any time after the first annual election or general election, as the case may be, or first appointment of members of the district board, for any original or proclaimed district thereafter sometimes called "single district," the Governor in Council, if it seem fit, may, and if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said district, shall within three months

after the receipt of the same divide the district into two, or, if the Governor in Council shall see fit, into three separate electoral subdivisions, thereafter called subdivisions, by such names as shall by such Order in Council be assigned to the same, and in and by such Order in Council the boundaries of the subdivisions shall be set forth; provided that no such division shall be made within three months before any day appointed for holding any election of members of the district board in or for such district: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the nineteenth day of June, 1860, a road district was proclaimed under the designation of "The Cranbourne Road District;" and the boundaries of the said road district as at present existing are defined in another Proclamation bearing date the twenty-ninth day of September, 1862: And whereas the Governor in Council has received a petition signed by not less than twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said road district, praying for the division of the same into three subdivisions: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order divide the Cranbourne Road District into three separate electoral subdivisions in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, by the names hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, and doth hereby set forth the boundaries of the said several subdivisions in manner following, that is to say:—

THE CRANBOURNE SUBDIVISION.—Commencing at the south-west angle of the parish of Cranbourne; thence north, east, south, and westerly by the west, north, east, and south boundaries of the said parish to the commencing point.

THE LYNDHURST SUBDIVISION.—Commencing at the south-east angle of the parish of Lyndhurst; thence west by the south boundary of the said parish, to the western boundary of the Cranbourne Road District; thence following the western, northern, and eastern boundary of the said road district, to the north-east angle of the parish of Lyndhurst; thence south by the eastern boundary of the abovenamed parish to the commencing point.

THE YALLOCK SUBDIVISION.—Commencing at the south-east angle of the parish of Lang Warrin; thence westerly and northerly by the south and west boundaries of that parish to its north-west angle; thence due east by the north boundaries of the parishes of Lang Warrin and Sherwin, and part of the south boundary of the parish of Cranbourne, to the eastern boundary of the Cranbourne Road District; thence easterly, southerly, and westerly by the said road district boundary to the commencing point.

And the Honorable James Forrester Sullivan, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

POLLING PLACES FOR CERTAIN ELECTORAL DISTRICTS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, Monday, the twelfth day of February, 1866.

WHEREAS by The Electoral Act 1865 it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council shall, as he shall see fit from time to time, appoint within and for each division of every province and district respectively one place and not more for taking the poll in such division at contested elections for the province or district, and every such appointment may revoke; provided that if the returning officer of the province or district and any police magistrate or superintendent of police acting in the locality shall by writing under their hands certify to the Governor that it is necessary so to do it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to appoint as aforesaid in and for such division one or more polling place or places, and the appointment of such place or places or any of them from time to time to revoke; provided also that no appointment of any polling place in or for any division of a province or district shall be revoked between the issue of any writ for election for the same and the return of such writ: And whereas the returning officers for the respective electoral districts and the police-magistrate or superintendent of police acting in the respective localities hereinafter mentioned, have, by writing under their hands, certified to the Governor that it is necessary to appoint additional polling places for certain divisions of such districts: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order appoint the polling places mentioned in the schedule hereunto annexed to be polling places for the divisions opposite to the names of which they are respectively placed, that is to say:—

THE accompanying Order of Her Majesty in Council, dated 5th December, 1865, allowing the Distilling Apparatus of Messrs. Chaplin and Company, as well as those of Dr. Normanby and Messrs. Winchester and Graveley, to be used on board passenger ships, is published for general information.

PRESENT:

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by *The Passengers Act 1855*, it is amongst other things enacted, that before any passenger ship shall be cleared out, the emigration officer at the port of clearance shall satisfy himself that there is on board a sufficient quantity of pure water, carried in tanks or casks, to secure throughout the intended voyage the issue of three quarts daily to each statute adult, for the use of the passengers, exclusive of the quantity required for cooking:

And whereas it is also enacted, that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by any Order in Council, to prescribe such rules and regulations as to Her Majesty may seem fit, for permitting the use on board passenger ships of an apparatus for distilling water, and for defining in such case the quantity of fresh water to be carried in tanks or casks for the passengers, and such Order in Council from time to time to alter, amend, and revoke, as occasion may require:

And whereas Her Majesty, by an Order in Council dated the ninth day of January, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, prescribed certain rules for permitting the use on board passenger ships propelled by steam-engines of less than a certain power, and on board passenger ships propelled by sails, of a certain apparatus for distilling fresh water from salt water:

And whereas it is expedient to repeal the said Order in Council, and to issue in lieu thereof the Order hereinafter contained:

Now therefore Her Majesty doth, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, and in pursuance and in exercise of the authority vested in Her by the said *Passengers Act 1855*, hereby repeal the said Order in Council of the ninth day of January, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, except in so far as the same repeals a certain Order in Council of the thirteenth day of May, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, and doth hereby order as follows:

Any passenger ship propelled by sails only, or by steam-engines of less power than is sufficient, without the aid of sails, to propel the ship at the rate of five statute miles an hour, may be cleared out and proceed on her voyage, having on board, in tanks or casks, only half of the quantity of pure water required by the said Act to be carried for the use of the passengers, provided the following conditions be observed, that is to say:—

1. That there be on board such ship an efficient apparatus for distilling fresh water from salt water, of the description commonly known either as Normandy's patent, as Winchester and Graveley's patent, or as Chaplin and Company's patent.

2. That the owners, charterers, or master of such ship, before clearance, lodge with such emigration officer a certificate from the engineer or surveyor of the Board of Trade, or from some other competent person to be named by such emigration officer, declaring that within seven days immediately preceding the date of such

certificate, the apparatus has been examined by him, and is then in good working condition, and stating the number of imperial gallons of pure fresh water which it is capable of producing in every twenty-four hours, and further declaring that the apparatus on board is either Normandy's, Winchester and Graveley's, or Chaplin and Company's patent, as the case may be.

3. That in every case such emigration officer shall be satisfied that the number of gallons of pure water which the apparatus is so certified to be capable of producing is not less than the whole number of persons about to proceed on the intended voyage of such ship, that is to say, the whole number of cabin passengers, passengers, and crew.

4. That there is rated on the ship's articles, and that there is on board the ship, some person or persons who, to the satisfaction of the said emigration officer, shall be competent for the proper management and repair of such distilling apparatus:

And to prevent all doubts on the construction of this Order in Council, it is hereby further ordered, that the terms "passenger ship," "emigration officer," "statute adult," and "master," shall herein have the same significations as are assigned to them respectively in the said *Passengers Act 1855*.

And the Right Honorable Edward Cardwell, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

MURDER.

TWO HUNDRED POUNDS REWARD.—FREE PARDON TO AN ACCOMPLICE.

PARTICULARS TO AID DETECTION.

A mare, the joint property of the deceased men, was found dead, saddled and bridled, about fifty yards from the hut with three punctured wounds in the neck. Outside the hut was found a bag containing a weanling sheep roughly skinned and subsequently identified as the property of Mr. Dalimore, a neighboring squatter. The belts belonging to the men were picked up 12 and 20 feet respectively from the hut, both stained with blood. Both men had been lately employed at Chirside's station, near Dunkeld, and were subsequently mining near the hut, having spent most of their earnings at the Jolly Waggoner's Hotel, near Glenlogie. On the night of 27th October shots were heard in the direction of the hut.

The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximative, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed or additional horses be required to be stationed in any of the districts tendered for, the supplies required may be drawn from the contractor. The excess over the estimate will not, however, exceed during the whole year 50 per cent. of the estimated quarterly consumption.

3. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being infringed or vitiated by any contracts made by the military commissariat.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the gross weight, the tare, and the net weight, to be endorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the District, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

8. If the board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct not exceeding £20, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. It will be competent for the Inspector of Stores on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving in writing a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice only can be given from the first day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th June, 1866; and in the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.
