#### THE SHIRE OF BULLA.

#### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Local Government Act 1863 it is amongst other things enacted that if at any time in any district, whether single or united, which shall contain an area of not less than one hundred square miles, the total amount actually paid in respect of the general rate then last made shall have amounted to One thousand pounds, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to proclaim, if it shall seem fit, such district, by such name as in and by such Order in Council may be assigned thereto, to be a shire within the meaning of the said Act, and such district shall thereupon be and be called such shire accordingly; and no district, after the proclamation thereof as such shire, save as therein provided with regard to the adjustment of boundaries to those of electoral districts, shall be united with any other shire or district, or with any borough or municipal district: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the first day of September, 1862, a Road District was proclaimed under the designation of "The Bulla Road District:" And whereas by another Proclamation bearing date, the twentieth day of April, 1863, the said Road District was altered as therein mentioned: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council made on the twenty-third day of January, 1865, the said Road District was divided into the two electoral subdivisions therein described: And whereas the area of the said district and the amount of the last general rate therein are not less than the area and amount in the said Act mentioned, and it seemed fit to make an Order in Council this day to proclaim the said district to be a shire accordingly: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the district be a Shire within the meaning of the said Act, by the name in and by such Order in Council assigned thereto, that is to say:—

# GRANT GAOL. PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIE CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the twenty-seventh year of Her Majesty's reign (No. 219), intituled, An Act to consolidate, the Law relating to Gaole, it is amongst other things enacted that all buildings, erections, houses, enclosed places, and premises hereafter to be erected, built, enclosed, purchased, enlarged, or maintained at the public expense as and for public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments within Victoria, which are from time to time proclaimed by the Governor in Council, by notice in the Government Gazette, as such public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, or penal establishments, shall, from and after the publication of such notice, be goverally deemed and taken to be the public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments.

called "gaols"), respectively, of the place or district where the same are situated, and shall be subject to the several provisions made for the regulation, discipline, management, and care of the public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments already erected (also thereinafter called "gaols"), and of the prisoners confined within the same; and it is also enacted that, except where it is otherwise proclaimed by the Governor in Council, every gaol shall be and be taken for all purposes as being equally a house of correction and a prison for debtors, and also every house of correction shall be taken to be a prison. And whereas it is expedient to proclaim the premises hereinafter mentioned in accordance with the provisions of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, in exercise of the power and authority conferred by the said Act and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim, declare, and notify that the Police Lock-up situate at Grant is a public gaol, prison, and house of correction, within the meaning and in accordance with the provisions of the said Act.

THE business of the Board at all ordinary meetings shall be conducted with open doors, unless it may become necessary to exclude strangers on account of their disorderly conduct.

Clause 2. The ordinary meetings of the board shall be held on the first Monday of every month at Two o'clock p.m.

Clause 3. Should a quorum not be present within one hour after the time appointed, the names of the members present shall be entered in the minute book.

Clause 4. The first business of all meetings of the board shall be the reading and confirmation of the minutes of the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall take place thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; after confirmation such minutes shall be signed by the chairman.

Clause 5. Special meetings of the board shall, ou the requisition of three or more members, be convened by the clerk; the object of such meeting being set forth in the requisition.

Clause 6. At the ordinary meetings of the board after the confirmation of the minutes, the following shall be the order of business, viz:—

Reading and ordering on correspondence.

 Reading and ordering on reports of committees and officers.

Orders of the day arising out of former minutes, and any business the chairman may bring before the meeting.
