## GLEN THOMSON TEMPORARY COMMON.

### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted that when any Crown land remains unsold within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land a farmers' common; when one-eighth part of any agricultural area has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim any unselected and unleased portion of such agricultural area, not exceeding twice the quantity so selected and leased, to be a temporary common for the use of such selectors and lessees: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the area hereinafter mentioned to be a Temporary Common for the use of selectors in the agricultural area of Glen Thomson, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

1330 acres, more or less, county of Villiers, parish of Nannupdah:—Commencing at the south-east angle of the portion, being the point of intersection of the south boundary of the said parish by Reedy Creek; bounded thence by that boundary, bearing west to the road forming the east boundary of allotment 5 in the said parish; thence by that road, bearing N. 9° 57' E. seventy-two chains forty-three links, N. 47° 18' E. eighty-two chains eighty-one links, and N. 9° 30' E. thirty-one chains fifty links; thence by a road bearing east fifty-five chains, more or less, to a creek; thence by that creek bearing southerly to its uncton with Reedy Creek aforesaid; and thence by that creek bearing south-easterly to the point of commencement.—(66.M.2200.)

## TOWN COMMONS.

### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a town common: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the commons hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the above recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

HEALESVILLE TOWN COMMON.—The land comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, and containing an area of No. 31.—MARCH 13, 1866.—1.

2400 acres, more or less, is hereby proclaimed a Town Common for the use of all householders in the township of Healesville, viz.:—Commencing on the Watts River at a point thereon where it is intersected by the northern side of the road from Melbourne to Wood's Point (*vid* Eltham); thence by that road bearing north-westerly to the south east angle of allotment 3 in the parish of Tarrawarra; thence by the east, north, and west boundaries of that allotment to the south-west angle thereof; thence again by the aforesaid road bearing south-westerly, westerly, and north-westerly to the south-east angle of allotment 23; thence by the east boundary of that allotment and a line bearing N. 9° 29' E. eighty-nine chains, more or less; thence by a line bearing east one hundred and ninety-five chains, more or less; thence by a line bearing south fifty-four chains, more or less; thence by a line bearing east ten chains, more or less, to the Watts River aforesaid; and thence by that river bearing south-westerly to the point of commencement. The bearings are from the true meridian.—(65.L.10550.)

ROSDALE TOWN COMMON.—The unappropriated Crown lands within the boundaries hereafter described are hereby proclaimed a Town Common for the use of all householders in the township of Rosedale: Commencing on the La Trobe River at a point thereon bearing south from the south-east angle of Reeve's pre-emptive section; thence by a line bearing south to Blind Joe's Creek; thence by that creek bearing south-easterly to the south boundary of the township of Rosedale; thence by the south boundary of that township bearing east to the south-east angle thereof; thence by the east boundary thereof and a line bearing north to the La Trobe River aforesaid; and thence by that river bearing westerly to the point of commencement. Area available for commonage 800 acres, more or less.—(66.M.1181.)
