AMENDING LAND ACT 1865.—(SECTION 42.)

REGULATIONS RELATING TO APPLICATIONS FOR, AND ISSUE OF, LICENSES ENTITLING THE HOLDERS THEREOF TO RESIDE ON OR TO CULTIVATE LANDS ON GOLD FIELDS, OR LANDS ADJACENT THERE TO, NOT EXCEEDING IN EXTENT TWENTY (20) ACRES.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, Monday, the twelfth day of February, 1866.

WHEREAS by the 42nd section of *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is enacted that the Governor in Council shall have power from time to time to issue licenses for any period not exceeding one year, which shall entitle the holders thereof respectively to reside on or to cultivate any lands on any "gold field" within the meaning of any Act now or hereafter to be in force relative to the gold fields or lands adjacent thereto, not exceeding in extent twenty (20) acres, subject to the payment of such license fee, and upon such terms and conditions as shall be approved of by the Governor in Council, and be set forth in such licenses: And whereas by the 70th clause of *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council shall have power from time to time to make and alter or rescind rules, regulations, and orders for prescribing the form of and the conditions and mode of applying for leases and licenses to be issued under the Act before mentioned, and the conditions on which the same shall be issued: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth by this present Order rescind the several rules and regulations heretofore made and ordered relating to applications for, and the granting of, licenses entitling the holders thereof to reside on or to cultivate lands on gold fields or lands adjacent thereto, not exceeding in extent twenty (20) acres, and doth by this present Order make the rules and regulations following for applying for and granting licenses for any of the purposes hereinbefore mentioned:—

1. *Intending applicants to define on the ground the land they desire to occupy, and to cause the same to be surveyed.*—Every person desiring to obtain land under the provisions of the 42nd section of *The Amending Land Act 1865* shall fix in the ground, at a depth of not less than eighteen inches, a post, painted white, three inches square, and three feet high from the surface of the ground, at, as nearly as possible, each of the angles of the land he desires to occupy, and he shall forthwith employ the Government contract surveyor authorised to effect surveys for applicants for licenses to occupy land in the district in which the land is situated, to survey and mark out the land, and such surveyor shall fix the said posts at each of the surveyed angles of the land applied for, and shall also, from the foot of each post, cut trenches on the ground, three feet in length, to indicate the direction of the lines which would intersect at such post.

2. *Notice of application to be exhibited on the land, and to be published in local newspaper.*—The applicant for the license shall affix to one of these corner posts a notice in writing, setting forth that he has applied for a license to occupy the land as marked out in the manner aforesaid; and shall insert in the nearest local newspaper a notice that he has made application for such land; the situation and area of which, together with the name and address of the applicant, the name of the Government contract surveyor employed to survey the same, must be specified in such notice.

3. *Government contract surveyors' districts.*—The Board of Land and Works shall assign to Government contract surveyors

districts within which they shall be eligible to effect surveys for applicants for licenses, and the operations of such surveyors, so far as regards the survey of land for applicants for such licenses, shall be restricted to the districts so assigned to them.

4. *Allotments to be rectangular in form.*—Allotments applied for in unsurveyed localities should be of a rectangular form, and must in every instance contain at least two right angles; the boundary lines should conform either to the true meridian or to the magnetic meridian; and the meridian adopted should be specified on the plan. The boundaries of a site comprised in a surveyed allotment must conform to the lines of the prior survey.

5. *Certain lands not available for occupation under licenses.*—Licenses will not issue in ordinary cases for occupation of lands situated as under:—

- Lands comprised within proclaimed reserves or townships.
- Lands situated at a greater distance from the nearest gold workings than ten (10) miles.
- Lands in such positions that the occupation thereof would tend to obstruct the access to homesteads, woolsheds, or other buildings, or to dams or reservoirs, or the access of holders of miners' rights, sawmill licenses, wood or other licenses, to timber and water.
- Lands comprising two or more detached portions, or including portions of two or more surveyed allotments.
- Land comprising a greater extent of frontage to a river or creek than 10 chains measured in a straight line from point to point.
- Lands situated on both banks of a river or creek, or on both sides of a roadway or frequented track.
- Lands included in any mining claim or held under mining lease, unless with the consent in writing of the claim-holders or lessees first had and obtained.
- Lands comprising any dwellings, improvements, or crops not the property of the applicant for a license.
- Lands proclaimed open for selection in agricultural areas.

6. *Description of land, plan, and report to be supplied by the Government contract surveyor.*—The surveyor of the land shall insert in the form of application set forth in schedule A herewith, a correct technical description of the land applied for, showing its connection with a fixed point of a Government survey; and shall supply a plan of the land on a scale of eight chains to one inch, showing the position within its boundaries of any watercourses, waterholes, dams, races, roads, tracks, huts, fences, gardens, old gold-workings, boundaries of any existing mining claims, and any topographical information that may be necessary to be known when dealing with the application, and shall inscribe on such plan the name in full of the applicant for the land indicated thereby.

He shall state in the report the particulars of all claims to prior occupancy, respecting which he shall make enquiries whilst the survey is in progress. He shall also state on the plan whether the bearings of the boundary lines have reference to the true or to the magnetic meridian.

7. *Applications to be consecutively dealt with by the Government contract surveyor and district surveyor.*—The form of application, and plan when ready, shall be forthwith transmitted by the Government contract surveyor to the District Surveyor of the district within which the land applied for shall be situated; and the District Surveyor shall, with the least possible delay, plot, or cause to be plotted, on a plan to be kept in his office and called the "Locality Plan," the boundaries of the land applied for, and shall report whether there are any valid claims to prior occupancy of the land, and whether the granting of the application would interfere with any residence sites, or access of miners or others to timber or water. He shall then transmit the application to Melbourne for the consideration of the Mining Department and the Board of Land and Works.

8. The Government contract surveyor shall insert on the application the amount claimed by him within the limits hereinafter prescribed for survey and fees in connection therewith.

9. *Fees to be charged by the Surveyors.*—The Government contract surveyor who shall survey the land shall, if he comply with these regulations, be entitled to the fees hereinafter mentioned, viz.:—

Marking out block, and furnishing description, plan, and report relative thereto...	£2 5 0
Allowance for every mile beyond four that the block is distant from the surveyor's office, or survey camp ...	0 2 0

10. *Objections to be forwarded to district surveyor.*—Persons who may object to the occupation of land set forth in any such application, must communicate in writing to the district surveyor full particulars of their objections, within seven (7) days after the date of publication in the local newspaper of the notice required to be given as before mentioned.

The district surveyor shall record all such objections and attach the statement of same to the applications in respect to which they are made.

11. *Minors and married women ineligible to obtain licenses.*—No person under the age of twenty-one years, nor any married woman, unless she has obtained a decree for judicial separation binding according to the laws now in force in Victoria, will be allowed to hold a license under the 42nd section of *The Amending Land Act 1865*; and if a license should be obtained improperly by any person so disqualified, it will be rescinded, without any compensation for improvements that may be placed or made on the land by such licensee.

12. *Lands applied for not to be occupied before license is obtained.*—If during the interval between the publication of an application for a license and the consideration of the application by the Board of Land and Works, the applicant should, without authority, occupy the land applied for, the application will be liable to be refused.

13. *Form of license.*—The Governor in Council, upon being satisfied that no valid objection exists to the occupation of the land applied for, may issue, through the Department of Lands and Survey, a license, which shall be signed by the Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey, to occupy the same in the form in the schedule B hereunto annexed, and subject to the terms and conditions therein set forth.

14. *Fees payable.*—The fees to be paid for licenses to occupy land for residence and cultivation shall be as under:—

- For sites comprising any area not exceeding five (5) acres, Two pounds (£2) per annum.
- For sites comprising any area exceeding five (5) acres and not exceeding ten (10) acres, Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) per annum.
- For sites comprising any area exceeding ten (10) acres and not exceeding twenty (20) acres, Four pounds (£4) per annum.

Such fees shall be payable in advance to the receiver and paymaster (or other officer appointed to receive the same) whose office shall be nearest to the land held under such licenses; and every license shall bear date of the day on which it is granted by the Governor in Council, and shall continue in force for a period not exceeding one year from such date, and may be renewable.

15. If any person to whom a license shall have been granted shall fail to take out the same within one month after the date of the notification to him from the Crown Lands Office in Melbourne of the granting of the license, and the transmission thereof to the receiver and paymaster, or other officer authorised to issue the same, such license shall thereupon become forfeited, and the land described therein shall be and shall be deemed and taken to be available for other applicants.

16. *Renewal of licenses.*—If the holder of a license shall, within fourteen (14) days before the expiry of the term of such license, or of any license renewed as hereinbefore provided, notify to such receiver and paymaster, or other officer as hereinbefore mentioned, that he desires to renew his right of occupation under such license, and if he forward with such notification the amount payable thereunder, and if he adduce evidence (on being required so to do) sufficient to show that he has complied with the conditions of the license then in force, the license may be renewed subject to all the terms and conditions thereof, and the licensee shall not be required to erect posts, publish notices, or make application as hereinbefore directed. If the holder of any such license fail to forward such notice and fee within the period before mentioned, he will, on the expiration of the term of the license, be liable to forfeit his right to occupy the land described in such license, and if he continue thereafter to occupy the land he will be liable to prosecution for unauthorised occupation of Crown lands, and no compensation will be given for any improvements on the land, which will thereupon be deemed to be available for occupation by other persons, or to be otherwise appropriated.

17. The interest of the licensee in the event of his death shall pass to his personal representatives; but no assignment of the licensee's interest under execution or order of sequestration will be recognised.

18. Surveys must not be undertaken for persons ineligible under these regulations to obtain licenses, or for more than one applicant for the same land.

19. No surveys shall be made of land not available for occupation under license.

20. Every Government contract surveyor shall keep a record of the dates of any orders received by him to survey sites,

and shall, as far as practicable, consecutively execute personally, or by an assistant duly qualified under these regulations, the surveys in accordance with the relative priority of the dates of those orders, and shall keep a record of the date of completion of every such survey.

21. Any Government contract surveyor who shall wilfully or carelessly disregard the foregoing regulations and restrictions, or knowingly mark out any lot in such a manner as to overlap part of any other lot previously marked out by some other duly qualified Government contract surveyor for an applicant for a license under the 42nd section of *The Amending Land Act 1865*, will be liable to be disqualified from making surveys under that section of the Act, and from tendering for any public surveys.

22. If any doubt should occur with reference to the priority of two or more applications for the same ground, the Board of Land and Works shall have power to decide which application shall have precedence.

23. The Board of Land and Works may, on the application of the licensee at any time after the expiration of one (1) year from the date of the first license, and on being satisfied that the land applied for is not auriferous, cause the land held under any license under the 42nd section of the said Act to be sold by auction, subject to valuation for the improvements of the licensee thereon, provided such land be not within any reserve for agricultural areas, in which case valuation for improvements will be allowed whenever the area in which the same are included shall be proclaimed open for selection.

And the Honorable James Macpherson Grant, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

SCHEDULE B.

KNOW ALL MEN, That His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the provisions of *The Amending Land Act 1865*, and in consideration of the sum of pounds shillings to be paid by of to the Receiver and Paymaster at or other officer authorised to receive the same, and subject to the terms and conditions hereunder specified, doth hereby give to the said full license and authority to reside on and to cultivate All that piece or parcel of Crown land situate on a Gold Field, or adjacent thereto, more particularly described in the schedule hereto, for one year from the date hereof, unless the same be cancelled, forfeited, rendered void, or rescinded, in accordance with the terms and conditions hereunder specified.

CONDITIONS.

1. The above license only gives to the licensee the right to use the land for the purpose for which the license has been granted, and for no other purpose whatsoever.

2. The licensee will not be permitted to assign or sublet the land, or any part thereof, or to part with the possession thereof, or of his interest therein, without the consent of the Board of Land and Works first had and obtained.

3. The licensee is required to reside on the land during the continuance of this license, or within a period of four months from the date hereof to enclose the same with a proper fence, and cultivate at least one-fifth portion thereof.

4. If any portion of the land the subject of this license shall be required for mining purposes, or for the erection of machinery or other works in connection with mining or for shafts, the warden of the district in which the land is included may give permission to persons to occupy the same, on condition that they pay or tender to the licensee such sum as compensation for surface and other damages as the said warden may think right; and in such case this license as regards the land so occupied shall be from and after the date of the payment or tender of the sum hereinbefore mentioned null and void.

Or, in lieu of, or in addition to, the foregoing condition, numbered 4, a condition as under, numbered 5, to be imposed at the discretion of the Board of Land and Works:—

5. Any holder of a miner's right shall be allowed to enter upon the land and search for gold thereon, without making compensation to the licensee for surface or other damage; provided

always that such portions of the land as shall be used for a garden or orchard, or shall be under crop, or occupied by buildings, shall be secure from such intrusion unless with the consent of the licensee.

6. Nothing contained in this license shall prevent the person or persons seized of the right, title, and interest in any claim or claims which were taken up under miners' rights prior to the date of this license from entering upon any portion of the land the subject of this license, and holding and occupying the same for mining purposes, without paying any compensation whatsoever, and all such claimholders and their workmen shall at all times have free ingress, egress, and regress to, into, and upon the said land.

7. Notwithstanding anything contained in this license, it shall be competent for the Governor in Council to resume the whole or any portion of the land hereby licensed, without paying compensation, if the same shall be required for railways, roads, telegraph lines, dams, reservoirs, races, catchwater drains, pipe tracks, stone quarries, or any other public purpose.

8. The license will be forfeited if the licensee commits a breach of or neglects to comply with any of the above conditions.

A surveyor shall not entertain applications for more than four (4) contiguous allotments from the same individual, and shall charge for the survey of each additional block at one-half the prescribed fee for one, and shall only be entitled to make one mileage charge in respect to the whole.

The Board of Land and Works reserves to itself the power of subdividing any of the districts above mentioned, and of adding to the number of surveys 2 to be authorised to effect surveys for applicants for licenses under the 42nd section of *The Amending Land Act 1865*, whenever it may be necessary so to do.

The following Circular of Instructions addressed to authorised Surveyors is published for general information.

Office of Lands and Survey,
Melbourne, 16th March, 1866.

SIR,—

I forward herewith copy of the Amended Regulations prescribing the manner in which application shall be made for licenses under the 42nd section of *The Amending Land Act 1865*, to which is appended a list of the Government Contract Surveyors authorised to effect surveys within the districts assigned to them by the Board of Land and Works for intending applicants for licenses under the above section of the Land Act, by which you will ascertain the district within the boundaries of which, as indicated on the accompanying plan, you are authorised by the board, in pursuance of the 3rd clause of the regulations, to effect such surveys.

1st. Your attention is particularly directed to the 4th clause of the regulations, requiring that the boundaries of allotments

so applied for shall conform to the lines of any Government survey within which such site may be comprised; and to the necessity in such cases of so arranging the survey lines that no allotment, part of which may be applied for, is unnecessarily deteriorated in value by the site proposed to be held under license being marked out so as to comprise an *undue proportion of the creek or road frontage of that allotment*, or so as to render access to the remainder of the same difficult or impracticable.

2nd. In marking out groups of allotments on previously unsurveyed lands, *uniformity of design in the survey, and the requirements of the locality for roads, access to water, &c., must be carefully observed*; and in effecting these surveys, the interests of this department must, in all respects, be as much studied as if the survey undertaken were a departmental, instead of a private one. Should you be in doubt, in any case, as to the proper course to pursue in connection with a proposed survey, you are requested to confer with the District Surveyor in reference thereto prior to the execution thereof.

3rd. When an applicant desires to obtain licenses for occupation of more than one site, the several blocks for which application is to be made must adjoin each other, and must be all contained within four lines in a rectangular form.

4th. The plans of survey accompanying applications must be drawn on sheets of foolscap paper.

5th. Where a long traverse survey has been found necessary to connect the site applied for with "a fixed point in a Government survey," the connection may be shown on a reduced scale and on a separate sheet, if more convenient; but *each* application must be accompanied by *all* the information necessary for accurately defining on the original plans in this office the site applied for.

6th. When a site is comprised in a surveyed allotment, the whole of that allotment, and the direction of the immediately abutting lines, must be shown on the plan.

7th. Should you at any time be uncertain whether a site for the survey of which application is made to you, is so situated as to be excluded by the 5th regulation from occupation under the 42nd section of the Amending Land Act, it will be incumbent on you, before taking fees for the survey of the site, to ascertain from the district surveyor whether, in his opinion, the site is available for such occupation; and if he considers the site is not so available, the application for its survey must be declined.

8th. As applications for licenses under the 42nd section will not be granted for the occupation of sites in allotments, for the selection of which, under the 27th section of the Amending Land Act, applications have been favorably reported on by the district surveyor, that officer will supply you with a schedule of all allotments so circumstanced, and within which you will abstain from making any surveys.

9th. In cases in which, under rural store or other similar licenses granted before the passing of *The Amending Land Act 1865* for occupation of sites on *unsurveyed land*, the survey lines of blocks for intending applicants under the 42nd section should not be carried within ten (10) chains of any part of the site so licensed, as the Board of Land and Works will not favorably recommend applications for blocks encroaching within that distance of sites so held.

10th. Survey should not be made of a site comprising, wholly or partially, any area for which application, in accordance with the original regulations and subsequent departmental orders, had been received by the district surveyor prior to the date of the promulgation of the present regulations, but which had not been dealt with at that date (13th February, 1866).

11th. As it is understood that many persons have gone through the preliminary requirements of the original regulations in making application for land, by placing pegs in the ground, and publishing notices of their applications in local newspapers, such persons, on giving proof that they have so marked out the land they desire to occupy, and that before the publication of the amended regulations they had notified their intention to apply for the same, are to be considered as having a prior claim over other persons who may apply subsequently for survey of the same land. No person is to be considered as entitled to this concession unless he can show that he has published the required notices in three consecutive issues of the nearest local newspaper.

12th. The district surveyor will, on your application, afford full particulars relative to the outstanding applications alluded to; and as numerous applications have been granted for sites which are not yet fenced in, it will be necessary for you carefully to inspect the district office plans for the purpose of ascertaining the lands for which licenses have been already granted.

13th. It must be understood that mileage will only be allowed to be charged from the centres specified in the list before mentioned. Whenever in pursuance of your instructions, you refuse applications to effect surveys, it will be well to inform the applicants of the reasons for such refusal.

14th. The Board of Land and Works will hold Government Contract Surveyors responsible to the department of Lands and Survey for any expenses occasioned through inaccurate or defective surveys effected by them.

15th. Forms of application, which will be supplied without charge to the applicants for surveys, may be obtained by the authorised surveyors from the District Survey, and from the Office of Lands and Survey, Melbourne.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight

WHEREAS by *The Wines, Beer, and Spirit Sale Statute 1864*, it is amongst other things enacted that a beer license shall authorise the licensee to sell and dispose of, not earlier than Six o'clock in the morning nor later than Eight o'clock in the evening, any ale or beer to be drunk in the house or on the premises described in such license, except in the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or in any borough, and if the premises described in such license be subsequently to the granting of such license brought within any borough, such license shall expire at the end of the then current year; provided that upon the application by the council of any borough the Governor in Council may by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare the whole or any part of such borough a

district wherein beer licenses may be granted, and may on a like application revoke any such proclamation: And whereas the council of the borough of Wangaratta has made application that the whole of the said borough may be declared a district under the proviso of the Act above recited: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do by this my Proclamation declare the whole of the borough of Wangaratta to be a district wherein Beer Licenses may be granted.

MANSFIELD DISTRICT ROAD BOARD.

BYE-LAW No. 1.

THE business of the Board at all ordinary meetings shall be conducted with open doors, unless it may become necessary to exclude strangers on account of their disorderly conduct.

Clause 2. The ordinary meetings of the board shall be held on the first Monday of every month at Two o'clock p.m.

Clause 3. Should a quorum not be present within one hour after the time appointed, the names of the members present shall be entered in the minute book.

Clause 4. The first business of all meetings of the board shall be the reading and confirmation of the minutes of the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall take place thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; after confirmation such minutes shall be signed by the chairman.

Clause 5. Special meetings of the board shall, on the requisition of three or more members, be convened by the clerk; the object of such meeting being set forth in the requisition.

Clause 6. At the ordinary meetings of the board after the confirmation of the minutes, the following shall be the order of business, viz.:—

1. Reading and ordering on correspondence.
2. Reading and considering petitions and memorials.
3. Reading and ordering on reports of committees and officers.
- Orders of the day arising out of former minutes, and any business the chairman may bring before the meeting.
5. Motions of which notice shall have been given in writing.
6. Examination and passing of accounts.
7. Notices of motion.

Clause 7. Every petition addressed to the board shall be presented by one of the members, who shall be responsible for its being properly and respectfully worded.

Clause 8. No motion shall be proceeded with unless the member who gave notice thereof, or some other member duly authorised by him in writing, be present when called upon to proceed with the same. Notices of motion not so proceeded with shall be considered as having lapsed.

Clause 9. The mover of any motion which may be referred to a committee shall, for that occasion, be a member of such committee.

Clause 10. No motion or amendment shall be entertained or discussed until it has been seconded, and one amendment only shall be discussed at one time; but if lost any other may be moved before the original motion is put to the vote.

Clause 11. No person, not being a member, shall be permitted to address the board without the consent of the majority of the board then present, and without giving notice in writing to the clerk of the board seven days previously, stating the subject matter of his address.

Clause 12. Every member, including the chairman, shall stand while addressing the board.

Clause 13. The ruling of the chairman shall be final on all points of order or practice, and shall be given without comment or argument.

Clause 14. Every motion or amendment shall be committed to writing, with the signature of the mover and seconder, and no motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the consent of the board.

Clause 15. Any member may require the clerk to take down the particular words used by a member immediately on the same being uttered.

Clause 16. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment. If the motion be carried, the business undisturbed shall have precedence at the next ordinary meeting of the board; but if lost, the subject previously under consideration, or the next in order, shall be discussed before a subsequent motion for adjournment be entertained.

Clause 17. No member shall speak twice on the same question except in reply or personal explanation.

Clause 18. Any member who shall refuse to obey when called to order by the chairman, or shall use any expression capable of being applied offensively to any other member, and who shall refuse to withdraw such expression and make a satisfactory apology when required to do so by the chairman, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, to be recovered before any two justices of the peace.

Clause 19. The voting shall in every case be by show of hands for and against the motion or amendment. Every motion or amendment, with the name of the mover and seconder, shall be entered in the minutes, and the votes shall be recorded if required by any member.

Clause 20. The original manuscript of every motion or amendment shall, if required, be laid on the table at the meeting at which it is to be confirmed, and may be destroyed after the minutes containing the said motions or amendments are confirmed.

Clause 21. Any member may protest against any resolution of the board by delivering the said protest in writing to the clerk duly signed, stating his reason or reasons for protesting against such resolution, and the clerk shall make an entry of the same in the minute book.

Clause 22. Any member may, without previous notice, move a call of the board for the consideration of any subject; and upon such motion being carried, the clerk shall give notice thereof to each member six clear days at least before the meeting for which such call is made, such notice to state the subject for consideration and the date and hour of meeting; and any member not present at such call of the board shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, recoverable before any two justices of the peace, unless reasonable cause for such absence be shown to the satisfaction of the board.

Clause 23. No motion, the effect of which shall be to rescind a former resolution of the board, shall be entertained unless

notice thereof, in writing, be given at a preceding meeting, and a call of the board made for the purpose.

Clause 24. It shall be competent for a majority of the board to suspend at any meeting one or more of the standing orders herein contained, except the purport of such suspension be the rescinding of any motion previously adopted.

Clause 25. All contracts amounting to £20 shall be made by tender, and advertised not less than twice in some paper circulating in the district, and notices calling for tenders shall also be posted on the Police Court and Post Office.

Clause 26. Every tender must be accompanied by a deposit of a sum equal to ten per cent. of the gross amount of the tender, which sum shall be returned in the event of the tender not being accepted, but should the tender be accepted such sum to be absolutely forfeited to the board if the tenderer fails to take up his contract within ten days after receiving a notification from the clerk that his tender has been accepted, but to be refunded to the contractor upon the certificate of the engineer of the satisfactory completion of the contract. In the event of the non-performance of the works from any cause whatsoever the board shall be entitled absolutely to retain such deposit as liquidated damages for breach of contract and to appropriate the same.

Clause 27. When any tender shall have been accepted by the board, a contract bond shall be entered into, signed by the contractor and also by the chairman and one other member, and the contractor shall also be required to sign the plans and specifications of the work for which his tender has been accepted.

Clause 28. Every tender to be addressed to the chairman of the board, and endorsed "Tender for—," and to be placed in a box specially provided and affixed to the board room so that tenders may be dropped into it from the outside. This box to have "Tender-box" painted on it, and to be secured with a patent lock of approved quality, the key of which shall be kept by the chairman, and such box not to be opened except at a meeting of the board.

Clause 29. Every tender must be on the printed form to be obtained at the office of the board, and must be filled up in accordance with the schedule attached to the specification, and no tender will be recognised unless made out in compliance with these conditions.

Clause 30. In the event of the contractor not completing his contract within the term stipulated in the conditions thereof, the engineer shall immediately report thereon to the board.

Clause 31. All payments shall be made by cheque, signed by the chairman and one other member, and countersigned by the treasurer; and no cheque shall be given unless the account for which it is payable shall have been passed at a meeting of the board, or by a committee duly empowered to do so.

Clause 32. The clerk, engineer, and every other officer and servant shall, when called upon, furnish official reports to the board. The collector shall also furnish detailed monthly reports showing the amount of the rates received by him during the month immediately preceding, the moneys paid to the treasurer, and the amount of uncollected rates.
