THE SUBDIVISIONS OF THE SHIRE, OF YACK-ANDANDAH!

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melhourne, the twelfth day of March, 1866.

WHEREAS by The Local Government Act 1863 it is amongst other things enacted that at any time after the first annual election or general election, as the case may be, or first appointment of members of the listrict board, for any original or proclaimed district thereinsfter sometimes called "single district," the Governor in Council, if it seem fit, may, and if he shall have received a potition to that effect signed by twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said district, shall within three months after the receipt of the same divide the district into two, or, if the Governor in Council hall see fit, into three separate electoral subdivisions, thereinafter called subdivisions, by such names as shall by such Order in Council the boundaries of the same, and in and by such Order in Council the boundaries of the same, and in and by such Order in Council that no such divisions shall be made within three months before any day appointed for holding any election of members of, the district board in or for such district; and it is also enacted that every shire shall after the proclamation thereof as such be and be deemed to be and have been such and the same district as such shire was at the time of such proclamation, and save as aloresaid and save where therein otherwise expressly provided all, the provisions of the said Act relating to districts shall continue and be of full force and effect with regard to such shire ard be read accordingly: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council made on the twenty-eighth day of December, 1864, the Shire of Yackandaudh was constituted: And whereas the Governor in Council has received a petition signed by not less than twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said shire, praying for the division of the said shire into two subdivisions. Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Ord

NORTH-WEST RIDING—Commencing at the junction of the Sandy Creek with the Mitta-mitta River; thence north-westerly by the Mitta-mitta River and the Murray River to the north-west angle of the Shire of Yackandandah; thence southerly by the western boundary of the said shire to the head of the Yackandandah Gap; thence by a direct line north-easterly to the commencing point.

SOUTH-EAST RIDING—Commencing at the junction of the Sandy Creek with the Mitta-mitta River; thence south-easterly and north-westerly by the eastern and southern boundaries of the shire to the head of the Yaokandandah Gap; thence by a direct line north-easterly to the commencing point.

And the Honorable James Porrester Sullivan shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
