DISTILLERY PREMISES.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed by the Parliament of Victoria, in the twenty-fifth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled *An Act to consolidate and amend the law relating to the distillation, rectifying, and compounding of Spirits, to the granting a duty upon Spirits distilled in Victoria, and to regulate the brewing of Beer, and the sale of Fermented and Spirituous Liquors in certain cases*, it is amongst other things enacted, that any person, except as thereinafter excepted, who shall carry on the business of a

distiller or rectifier and compounder of spirits, or who shall have in his possession, or who shall make use of any still or other utensil for distilling or rectifying and compounding spirits, except in such place as the Governor in Council shall by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* direct, shall be liable to a penalty of not less than One hundred pounds, nor more than Five hundred pounds: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the undermentioned place as a place wherein the business of a distiller or rectifier and compounder of spirits may be carried on, that is to say :—

Distillery premises, situated on the right bank of the Salt-water River, and which are bounded as follow, viz. : Commencing at a point on the bank of the said river, and extending north 167 feet, on the west 199 feet, on the south-west 10 feet, on the south 167 feet, and on the east 209 feet, be the same more or less, and being part of allotment 9, section 15, in the parish of Cut-paw-paw, colony of Victoria.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this nineteenth day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, and in the twenty-ninth year of Her Majesty's reign.

BURNEWANG FARMERS' COMMON.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act* 1865 it is amongst other things enacted that when any Crown land remains unsold within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected under *The Land Act* 1862, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land a farmers' common; when one-eighth part of any agricultural area has been selected under *The Land Act* 1862, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim any unselected and unleased portion of such agricultural area, not exceeding twice the quantity so selected and leased, to be a temporary common for the use of such selectors and lessees: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the area hereinafter mentioned to be a Farmers' Common for the use of selectors in the agricultural area of Burnewang, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say :—

The allotments and portions of land hereinafter enumerated, and comprising 15,787 acres, more or less, viz. :—Parish of Bonn, allotments 11, 12, 45 b, 46, and 50; parish of Burnewang, allotments 62, 63, 64, 65 b, 66, and 68; parish of Runnymede, allotments 41, 42, 44, 45, 46, 70, 72, 93, 94, 95, 98, 99, 101, 105, 106, 110, and 111; parish of Muskerry, allotments 1, 2 A, 2 Bb, 3 Ab, and 3 B; parish of Toolleen, allotments 8, 7, 11, 13, 14 a, 16, 17, 21, 22, 23, 25, 26, 28, 35, 36, 38, 41, 42 b, 44, 45, 46, and A and B; parish of Campaspe, allotments 9, 13, 24, 27, 28, 30, 34, 37, 38, 42 a, 68, 69, 70, 75, 76 b, 79, 84 b, 87, 88, 89, B, C, D, F, and G; and the portions of land described as follows, viz. : Commencing at the south angle of Robertson's pre-emptive section; bounded thence by the south-east and north-east boundaries of that section, bearing north-east and north-west to the road to Rochester; thence by that road bearing north-easterly 120

chains, more or less; thence by a road bearing east to the north-west angle of allotment 70, in the parish of Campaspe; thence by the west boundary of that allotment bearing south 40 chains; thence by the north boundary of allotment 68, bearing west 40 chains; thence by the west boundaries of allotments 68 B, and 43, to the south-west angle of the last-named allotment; thence by the north boundaries of allotments 51 and 52, bearing west to the north-west angle of the last-named allotment; and thence by a line bearing north to the point of commencement; also commencing at the north-east angle of 13 in the parish of Campaspe; bounded thence by the east boundaries of allotments 13, 12, 9, and 8, bearing south to the south-east angle of the last-named allotment; thence by a line bearing east 49 chains; thence by the west boundaries of allotments 47, 50, and 52, bearing north 100 chains; and thence by a line bearing west 49 chains to the point of commencement.—(66.M.2564.)

THE SUBDIVISIONS OF THE SHIRE OF ALBERTON.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the nineteenth day of March, 1866.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1863* it is amongst other things enacted that at any time after the first annual election or general election, as the case may be, or first appointment of members of the district board, for any original or proclaimed district thereafter sometimes called "single district," the Governor in Council, if it seem fit, may, and if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said district, shall within three months after the receipt of the same divide the district into two, or, if the Governor in Council shall see fit, into three separate electoral subdivisions, thereafter called subdivisions, by such names as shall by such Order in Council be assigned to the same, and in and by such Order in Council the boundaries of the subdivisions shall be set forth; provided that no such division shall be made within three months before any day appointed for holding any election of members of the district board in or for such district; and it is also enacted that every shire shall after the proclamation thereof as such be and be deemed to be and have been such and the same district as such shire was at the time of such proclamation, and save as aforesaid and save where therein otherwise expressly provided all the provisions of the said Act relating to districts shall continue and be of full force and effect with regard to such shire and be read accordingly: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council made on the twenty-fifth day of January, 1864, the Shire of Alberton was constituted: And whereas the Governor in Council has received a petition signed by not less than twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said shire, praying for the division of the said shire into ridings: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order divide the Shire of Alberton into three separate electoral subdivisions in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, by the names hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, and doth hereby set forth the boundaries of the said several subdivisions in manner following, that is to say:—

SOUTH RIDING.—Commencing at the north-west angle of section B, parish of Alberton; thence due east to the south boundary of the main road from Alberton to Tarraville; thence by that south boundary easterly to the River Tarra; thence southerly by the River Tarra to the sea-coast; thence westerly by the sea-coast to the Albert River; thence northerly by the Albert River to the commencing point.

EAST RIDING.—Commencing at the mouth of the Tarra River; thence following the Tarra River northerly to its source; thence northerly by the west boundary of the electoral district of Woodside to the northern boundary of the shire; thence easterly by the boundary of the shire to the sea-coast; thence following the sea-coast south-westerly to the commencing point.

WEST RIDING.—Commencing at the mouth of the Albert River; thence northerly by that river to the north-west angle of section B, parish of Alberton; thence due east to the south boundary of the main road from Alberton to Tarraville; thence by that south boundary easterly to the River Tarra; thence northerly by the River Tarra to its source; thence northerly by the west boundary of the electoral district of Woodside to the northern boundary of the shire; thence westerly, southerly, and easterly, by the northern, western, and southern boundaries of the shire, to the commencing point.

And the Honorable James Forrester Sullivan, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
