Several cases of scarlet fever are reported at Branswick, and low faver and diarrhea are stated to be prevalent in Collingwood. Maeteen out of the twenty-seven deaths recorded in South Melbourne occurred in public institutions. Scarlatina is reported at Frahran, and typhns in South Yarra. On the whole there is a marked improvement in the rate of mortality throughout the districts.

### REGISTRAR GENERAL'S REPORT ON THE VITAL STATISTICS OF MELBOURNE AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF FEBRUARY, 1866.

The deaths in February were less numerous by 86 than those in January. They were also fewer by 2 than in February, 1865, but more numerous than in the same month of any of the five previous years. They outnumbered by 46 the average of February during seven years.

The mean temperature was more than 2 degrees above the average.

Deaths of males contributed 51 per cent. and deaths of females 49 per cent. to the mortality returns. Fifty-eight per cent. of the deaths were of children under five years of age. This proportion is low for the season of the year. In January it was much higher, viz., 65½ per cent. In February, 1865, it was 64 per cent.; in February, 1864, it was 62 per cent.; in February, 1863, it was 65 per cent.; in February, 1862, it was 64 per cent.; in February, 1863, it was 65 per cent.; and in February, 1860, it was 64 per cent.

The days of highest mortality were the 8th and 11th, on which respectively 25 and 22 deaths occurred. The days of the lowest mortality were the 2nd, 4th, 6th, and 18th. On the first of these only five deaths, and on each of the remainder only

The deaths of persons over 75 years of age were as follow:—A male aged 83 of icterus, a female aged 82 of rheumatic gout, and two males aged respectively 78 and 77 of old age.

Seventeen violent deaths occurred during the month. The following are the particulars:—A boy aged 11 died of the effects of a kick from a horse, a boy aged 15 of injury to the spine, a midshipman aged 18 of tetanus arising from his hand being accidentally crushed, a stockman aged 35 of injuries arising from a fall into a drain, a stockman aged 35 of injuries arising from a fall from his horse when drunk, a quarryman aged 39 in consequence of being accidentally crushed in a quarry, a pawnbroker aged 42 of injuries caused by jumping from the parapet of a house whilst insane, a brickmaker aged 61 of injuries caused by clay falling on him, and a female aged 33 of extravasation of blood on the brain caused by a fall when drunk. A butcher aged 43 died of the effects of having accidentally set himself on fire; a boy aged 10 and a miner aged 46 were drowned in the Yarra; a seaman aged 35 was drowned at Williamstown; a male infant was accidentally sufficated at isirth; a surgery man aged 36 and a working jeweller aged 62 committed suicide by poison, the latter while suffering from delirium tremens; a female aged 31 committed suicide by cutting her throat.

The deaths in public institutions numbered 70, or 17 per cent. of the whole. Of these, 37 took place in the Melbourne Hospital, 3 in the Lying-in Hospital, 4 in the Benevolent Asylum, 6 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 11 in the Industrial Schools, 4 in the Immigrants' Home, 4 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 1 in the Collingwood Stockade.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 223, of which 115, or nearly 52 per cent., were of males, and 108, or about 48 per cent., were of females. Of those dying, 124 were under one year of age, 66 were between one and two years, 21 were between two and three, 6 were between three and four, and 6 were between four and five.

The persons dying at a more advanced age than five years numbered 161, of which 82, or 51 per cent, were males, and 79, or 49 per cent, were females; 16 were between five and ten, 6 were between ten and fifteen, 5 were between fifteen and twenty, 14 were between twenty and twenty-five, 7 were between thirty, 26 were between thirty, and thirty-five, 2 were between thirty-five and forty, 18 were between forty and forty-five, 9 were between fifty, 7 were between fifty and fifty-five, 7 were between fifty-five and sixty, 9 were between sixty and sixty-five, 6 were between sixty-five and seventy, 5 were between seventy and seventy-five, 2 were between seventy and seventy.

The proportions of deaths from each class of diseases to the total mortality, as shown in the last column of the disease table, differ but slightly from those given in the report for January. Deaths from scarlatina and diphtheria fell off from 20 to 14, and those from diarrhea and dysentery from 185 to 89. Whooping-cough caused 11 deaths in both months. Deaths from phthisis fell from 28 to 24. Violent deaths fell from 20 to 17; but both these numbers are above the average.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE MAJORCA GENERAL CREETERY.

A LL charges must be paid when orders are given for interment.

2. Applications for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery to be made to the trustees; permission, in the form contained in schedule A, will be granted to applicants on payment of the proper charges.

3. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in the cemetery, on evidence to the satisfaction of the trustees that the deceased was without means, and that his relatives or friends are unable to pay the charges.

4. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but should a brick grave or vault be required, it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees or of some person appointed by them; no grave to be less than six feet deep.

5. Orders for interment to be given to the sexton or other person appointed by the trustees on the day preceding the interment, between the hours of Eight o'clock a.m. and Six o'clock p.m.; the particulars required in schedule B must be stated when giving the order.

6. The time fixed for the funeral must be the time of arrival at the cemetery.

7. The hours envolved for interment are from Eight circles.

7. The hours appointed for interment are from Eight o'clock a.m. until Six o'clock p.m. from 1st September to 30th April, and from Eight o'clock a.m. until Four o'clock p.m. during the remaining months.

8. The plans of all monuments, tablets, and fences to be erected, must first be submitted to the trustees for approval.

9. Monuments, tablets, and fences are to be kept in proper condition and repair at the expense of the owners, or they may be removed by order of the trustees.

10. Every coffin in a vault must be bricked in and cemented.

11. If any interment is to be made in any private vault or grave, the written consent of the owner must be left with the order.

12. A plan of the cemetery and register will be kept.

13. No person employed by the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge of his duties.

14. All persons injuring the cemetery, or its fences or monuments, will be prosecuted as the law directs.

15. The trustees reserve the right to alter these regulations and charges from time to time, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Governor.

The foregoing rules and regulations were agreed to by us, at a meeting of the trustees, held at Majorca, on the fifth day of March, 1866.
