ACTS OF PARLIAMENT LEFT TO THEIR OPERATION.

THE Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies has, in a Despatch bearing date the 10th day of January, 1866, intimated to the Governor that Her Majesty will not be advised to exercise Her power of disallowance in respect of the Acts of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the 28th and 29th years of Her Majesty's reign, the numbers, titles, and dates of which are hereto subjoined, viz. :-
