COMMONS.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight
Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath,
Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted that when any Crown land remains unsold within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land a farmers' common; when one-eighth part of any agricultural area has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim any unselected and unleased portion of such agricultural area, not exceeding twice the quantity so selected and leased, to be a temporary common for the use of such selectors and lessees; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or reproclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim, increase, alter, or abolish (as the case may be) the commons hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:-

BOWMAN'S FOREST FARMERS' COMMON.—The Bowman's Forest Farmers' Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 10th day of April, 1865, is hereby abolished, and in lieu thereof the unappropriated Crown lands, comprising an area of 9500 acres, within the boundaries hereinafter defined, are hereby proclaimed as the Bowman's Forest Farmers' Common, viz.: Commencing at the north-west angle of allotment 8 of section 10, in the parish of Murrumbidgee, being a point on the Ovens River; thence by that river bearing westerly to the point where Dr. Mackay's fence abuts thereon, which point is distant in a direct line about one hundred and eight chains from the point of commencement; thence by the said fence bearing northerly about ninety chains to an angle thereon near the main road from Myrtleford to Wangaratta; thence by a line bearing N. 31° 10' E. one hundred chains, more or less, to the summit of a high range; thence by the said summit of that range, bearing north-easterly to a point thereon bearing west from the north-west angle of allotment 1 of section 4; thence by a line and the north boundary of that allotment, bearing east to the Burgoose Creek; thence by that creek bearing north-easterly and easterly to the junction of Stony Creek therewith; thence by Stony Creek, bearing south-easterly to the south-east angle of allotment 7 of section 3; thence by part of the east boundary of that allotment, bearing north to the Burgoose Creek aforesaid; thence by that creek bearing north-easterly to the surveyed main road three chains wide from Beechworth to Myrtleford; thence by that road bearing south-westerly to a point thereon bearing east from the south-east angle of allotment 2 of section 6; thence by lines bearing west twenty chains S. 23° 2' W. fifty-three chains ninety-four links to a point bearing east from the south-east angle of allotment 6 of section 6; thence by a line bearing east twenty chains to the surveyed main road aforesaid; thence by that road bearing south-westerly to a point on the summit of a range, said point bearing about twenty chains in a

south-easterly direction from the south-east angle of allotment 5 of section 9; thence by the summit of the last-mentioned range, bearing south-westerly and westerly to a point thereon bearing thirty chains in an easterly direction from the north-east angle of allotment 10 of section 10; thence by a line bearing south-westerly to the Ovens River aforesaid; and thence by that river bearing north-westerly to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(65.K.14334.)

BOWMAN'S FOREST GOLD FIELD COMMON.—The Bowman's Forest Gold Field Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 10th day of April, 1865, is hereby increased by adding thereto the area hereinafter mentioned and described, viz., 105 acres 3 roods 15 perches: Commencing at a point on the western side of the surveyed main road three chains wide from Beechworth to Myrtleford, the said point bearing east from the south-east angle of allotment 2 of section 6, in the parish of Murrumbidgee; bounded thence by lines bearing west twenty chains; S. 22° 2' W. fifty-three chains ninety-four links to a point bearing east from the south-east angle of allotment 6 of section 6; thence by a line bearing east twenty chains to the main road aforesaid; and thence by that road bearing north-easterly to the point of commencement.—(65.K.14335.)

SNAKE VALLEY GOLD FIELD COMMON.—The Snake Valley Gold Field Common, described amongst others in a Proclamation bearing date 28th day of January, 1861, is hereby extended by the addition thereto of the area hereinafter mentioned and described, viz., 2900 acres, more or less: Commencing at the south-west angle of the existing common; bounded thence by the south boundary thereof, bearing east two hundred and eighty chains to the south-east angle thereof; thence by a line bearing south one mile, more or less, to the summit of a range; thence westerly by that range to a point thereon south of the point of commencement; and thence to that point by a line bearing north one mile, more or less; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(65.L.8253.)

The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the gross weight, the tare, and the net weight, to be endorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the District, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

8. If the board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct not exceeding £20, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. It will be competent for the Inspector of Stores on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving in writing a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice only can be given from the first day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th June, 1866; and in the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.
