OCCUPATION OF CROWN LANDS UNDER THE 42ND SECTION OF THE AMENDING LAND ACT 1865.

PERSONS desirous of obtaining licenses to occupy portions of Crown lands under the provisions of the 42nd section of *The Amending Land Act 1865*, are hereby cautioned that, as the marking out on the ground of the sites to be applied for is an indispensable preliminary, applications for licenses will not be entertained, unless, *prior* to application to the surveyor authorised to effect the required surveys, the sites shall have been defined on the ground in the manner prescribed in the regulations.

Applications for the granting of more than one license, under the 42nd section of *The Amending Land Act 1865* to the same individual, will only be entertained by the Board of Land and Works when made by persons intending, and who will undertake, on obtaining such licenses, to permanently occupy, for residence and cultivation, the land for which they apply.

Applicants must, in every instance, insert the required notice in the newspaper published in the town nearest to the land for occupation of which license is desired.

In those portions of the parishes of Warrenheip, Bungaree, Dean, and Kerit Bareet, formerly included in the State Forest, as recommended to be reserved by the commission at Ballarat, the licenses under the 42nd section, for residence and cultivation, will not exclude the right of cutting and removing live timber therefrom, by holders of timber licenses, upon such portions of land not cultivated; to remove the same, and the right of entry on the land at all reasonable times for those purposes. Neither the holder of any license under the 42nd section, nor any other person, will be allowed to bark or ring living timber upon the land included within any such license under the 42nd section.

THE NEXT CIRCUIT COURT AT SANDHURST.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the ninth day of April, 1866.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the fifteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled *An Act to make provision for the better Administration of Justice in the Colony of Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor of the said Colony, by any Orders to be by him, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, from time to time made and proclaimed, to define the limits of districts within and the times at which circuit courts shall be holden in the said colony, and the said limits and times to alter and vary as he shall, with the advice aforesaid, deem necessary: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council, made on the eleventh day of December, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, certain times were appointed for the holding of the several circuit courts of Victoria in the present year: And whereas it is deemed necessary to alter the time fixed as aforesaid for holding the next circuit court at Sandhurst: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order alter the time for holding the next Circuit Court at Sandhurst, and doth hereby direct and appoint that the said Court shall be holden at the time hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

On Friday, the twentieth day of April instant, instead of Tuesday, the seventeenth day of the same month.

And the Honorable George Higinbotham, Her Majesty's Attorney-General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

THE GENERAL SESSIONS DISTRICTS OF INGLEWOOD AND MARYBOROUGH ALTERED.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Justices of the Peace Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted that Courts of General Sessions of the Peace shall be holden in and for such places or districts within Victoria as the Governor in Council appoints; and the Governor in Council may from time to time define and appoint the limits and boundaries of the places or districts within which all such courts shall have jurisdiction respectively, and the places and times at which such courts shall be holden: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the eighteenth day of April, 1864, the districts within which the Courts of General Sessions for Inglewood and Maryborough respectively have jurisdiction were altered as therein mentioned: And whereas it is expedient again to alter the said districts: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as defines the boundaries of the districts within which the said Courts of General Sessions for Inglewood and Maryborough have jurisdiction, and with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby define and appoint the limits and boundaries of the places or districts within which the said courts shall have jurisdiction as hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

The Court of General Sessions of the Peace appointed to be holden at Inglewood, shall have jurisdiction within the district hereinafter defined, viz.:—Commencing at the north-east angle of Catto's pre-emptive section, being a point on the Loddon river; thence by that river bearing northerly to its junction with an ana-branch of the Murray River; thence by that ana-branch bearing north-westerly to the south-east angle of the township of Castle Donington; thence by the south boundary of that township bearing west to the south-west angle thereof; thence by a direct line bearing south-easterly to the Avoca River on the southern shore of lake Bael-bael; thence by that river bearing southerly to the junction of Fenton's Creek therewith; thence by a direct line bearing south-easterly to the north-west angle of the township of McNayre; thence by the north boundary of that township bearing east to the north-east angle thereof; thence by the east boundary thereof bearing south to Orville Creek; thence by that creek bearing north-easterly to its junction with Kangderar Creek; thence by that creek bearing easterly to its junction with Bullabul Creek; thence by that creek bearing north-easterly to a point thereon bearing west from the point of commencement; and thence to that point by a line and the north boundary of Catto's pre-emptive section aforesaid.

The Court of General Sessions of the Peace appointed to be holden at Maryborough, shall have jurisdiction within the district hereinafter defined, viz.:—Commencing at a point on the Tullaroop or Deep Creek, the said point bearing east from the north-east angle of the parish of Maryborough; thence by a line the north boundary of the said parish, and a line bearing

west to the east boundary of Joyce's pre-emptive section "Norwood," thence by the eastern, south, and west boundaries of that pre-emptive section bearing southerly, west, and north to Bet-bet Creek; thence by that creek bearing southerly to the telegraph line of road from Avoca to Maryborough; thence by that road bearing easterly to the junction therewith of the road from Amherst to Avoca; thence by a direct line bearing easterly to the junction of the road from Maryborough to Amherst with the road from Carisbrook to Amherst; thence by the last-named road bearing north-easterly to the north boundary of the parish of Craigie; thence by the said boundary of that parish and a line bearing east to the Tullaroop Creek aforesaid; and thence by that creek bearing northerly to the point of commencement.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this ninth day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, and in the twenty-ninth year of Her Majesty's reign.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase certain commons and abolish portion of one other common as hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, that is to say:—

CROWLANDS TOWN COMMON, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 10th day of April, 1865, is hereby increased by the addition thereto of the land comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, viz: Commencing at the south-east angle of the township reserve of Crowlands; thence by the south boundary thereof and a line bearing west ninety-five chains, more or less, to the south-west angle of the existing common, being a point on a wire fence; thence by that fence bearing south-easterly thirty-five chains, more or less; thence by a line bearing east to the Wimmera River; and thence by that river bearing north-westerly to the point of commencement. Area, 340 acres.—(66.N.3252.)

GLENBURNIE FARMERS' COMMON, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 18th day of March, 1861, is hereby increased by the addition thereto of allotments 21 and 22 A, in the parish of Glenburnie, comprising an area of 457 acres 1 rood 25 perches.—(65.K9207.)

LILLICUR AND YALONG FARMERS' COMMON, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 4th day of May, 1863, is hereby increased by the addition thereto of the unappropriated Crown Lands comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, and containing an area of 2126 acres, more or less: Commencing at the north-west angle of the existing common, being a point on the east boundary of allotment 11 of section 2, in the parish of Lillicur; thence by the east boundaries of sections 2 and 1, bearing north 107 chains 40 links to the north-east angle of allotment 11 of section 1; thence by a line bearing east 193 chains, more or less, to the west boundary of the Amherst Gold Field Common; thence by the said boundary of that common, bearing south 107 chains forty links to the north-east angle of the aforesaid existing common; and thence by the north boundary of that common bearing west 193 chains, more or less, to the point of commencement.—(66.M.1893.)

LOCKWOOD, RAVENSWOOD, SHELBOURNE, AND BRADFORD UNITED FARMERS' COMMON.—So much of a Proclamation bearing date the eighteenth day of December, 1865, as increased the United Farmers' Common of Lockwood, Ravenswood, Shelbourne, and Bradford, by adding thereto 2757 acres, is hereby revoked, and such addition is hereby abolished accordingly.—(66.M.1187.)

GENERAL RULES FOR COURTS OF MINES.

WHEREAS by *The Mining Statute of 1865*, section 233, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Chief Judge of Courts of Mines and any two or more of the Judges of the Courts of Mines, from time to time, but subject to the said Act, to frame such general rules as to them shall seem expedient for and concerning, and so far as not therein provided, for the pleadings, practice, and proceedings of the court holden under the said Act, either in their original or appellate jurisdiction, and for the execution of the process of such courts, and in relation to any of the provisions of the said Act which relate to the courts to be holden thereunder, as to which there may arise any doubts; and also to frame forms for every matter or proceedings in the said courts for which they shall think it necessary for a form to be provided and not therein already provided for; and for and concerning the fees to be paid to barristers-at-law, attorneys practising in the said courts, and the expenses to be paid to witnesses in said court: Now we, the undersigned, the said Chief Judge and Judges of the Courts of Mines, in pursuance of the said power, do make and declare the rules following, and declare that the schedule thereunto annexed shall be read in connection therewith, and as part thereof, and that the same shall commence and come into operation from the first day of May next.

VENUE.

1. Every suit in a Court of Mines shall be commenced in the district and division where the subject-matter of dispute, if land, or an interest in land, lies, or where a sole defendant resides; but if there are several defendants, the suit may proceed in the district and division in which any of them reside, with power, however, in the latter case, for the judge to stay proceedings, with or without costs, in order that proceedings may be taken in a district or division more convenient regarding the residence of the defendants and witnesses, or to direct that any suit or proceeding may be heard, transferred, or adjourned to some other division in the same district.

SERVICE OF SUMMONS.

2. Summonses may generally be served under the 111th section of the Act, personally or at the dwelling of the defendant, upon any inmate of years of discretion, or at the place of business of the defendant upon his servant or agent there employed.

3. An affidavit of service by the person making the same must be endorsed upon, or written under, a copy of the plaint and summons served, describing how the same has been served, and no cause shall be set down for hearing, or if set down, called on without such affidavit, unless service be admitted.

4. If any dispute shall arise, or the judge shall entertain any doubt as to the due service of any summons, the judge shall be at liberty to examine witnesses, and to decide whether such service has been good or otherwise, and either to proceed to hear or defer the hearing as he shall think fit; or under special circumstances, to order that a person insufficiently served shall be deemed a defendant under such terms as he shall think fit.

PARTICULARS OF DEMAND.

5. If a defendant shall require further particulars of the demand or of the relief sought under the plaint, he may take out a judge's summons calling on the plaintiff for such further particulars, and the judge shall thereon make such order as he shall see fit.

PAYMENT IN AND OUT OF COURT.

6. Payment into court, under the 113th and 114th sections, in suits without written pleadings, must be made six days before the summons is returnable, and the blank in the form in the 10th schedule to the Act shall be filled accordingly; but the judge may, under special circumstances, before or after the proper time is expired, at his discretion, enlarge the time for payment into court for any definite time.

7. Payment into court, under the 113th and 114th sections, in suits with written pleadings, must be made six days before the time for answering is expired, and the blank in the form of the 11th schedule to the Act shall be filled accordingly.

8. Payment into court shall in no case be taken to admit the cause of complaint.

9. A defendant after payment of money into court, under the 114th section, may cause notice thereof to be given to the plaintiff in person, or at his usual, or last known, place of abode or business.

10. A plaintiff drawing money out of court, paid in under the 114th section, shall be required, before receiving the same, to leave with the clerk a memorandum signed by himself or his attorney, stating whether he does or does not elect to proceed.

11. A plaintiff not leaving such memorandum with the clerk within three days after he has received notice of payment into court, either from the defendant, or the clerk, and afterwards electing not to proceed, shall be liable for all costs properly incurred by the defendant preparing for his defence; after such payment into court.

AMENDING PLAINT.

12. The plaintiff may, under the 135th section, at any time before an answer shall be delivered, amend his plaint as he may be advised (subject as to all such amendments after the first to a power in the judge to set aside the same as unnecessarily causing delay or expense), and shall thereupon, at his own expense, deliver a copy of the same to the defendant defending in person, to be served in the same manner as the original plaint, or to his attorney, where the defendant defends by attorney; and the defendant shall have the same time to object or answer, after the service of such copy, as he had from the

service of the original plaint; and in cases where the defendant shall amend his answer, the plaintiff shall have the same time to proceed to the hearing of the cause as after the delivery of the original answer.

TIME FOR ANSWERING AND OBJECTING.

13. That the time for notice of objection under the 116th section, and for answering under the 117th section, shall be twenty-one days, and the blank in the form in the 11th schedule to the Act shall be filled accordingly; but the judge may, under special circumstances, before or after the proper time is expired, at his discretion, enlarge the time for any definite time.

ENTRY AND NOTICE OF HEARING.

14. That the plaintiff may enter a cause for hearing under the 121st section, by delivering a written request for the same to the clerk of the judge or court, and procuring him to make an entry thereof, and of the day upon which the cause is to be heard in the book kept for that or that and other purposes.

15. That the service of notice of hearing required by the 122nd section shall be, as to defendant's pleading by attorney, on the attorney personally or at his office, and as to defendant's pleading in person, in like manner as provided by rule 2, as to the service of summons, and as to defendants who have omitted to plead by posting such notice in the office of the clerk of the court, such service to be proved by affidavit before making any order upon hearing against persons not appearing at the same.

NOTICE DISPUTING FACTS.

16. In suits without written pleadings against assignees of an insolvent, executors, or administrators, or trustees, or persons authorised by Act of Parliament or Council to be sued as nominal parties, the character in which the defendant is stated in the plaint to be sued shall be taken to be admitted unless denied by notice.

17. All such notices shall be given five days before the summons or the plaint is returnable. Where such notice is given by the post, as it may be, it shall be posted in such time as that by the ordinary course of the post it could reach its destination five days before such summons is returnable.

ASSESSORS DISAGREEING.

18. Where a majority of the assessors upon the trial of any issue shall not agree upon the verdict within six hours after the case is left to them, they may be discharged from giving any verdict, and another day shall thereupon be appointed for such trial, and in that case each party shall abide his own costs of the abortive trial, and the party, if any, who shall have required such issue, shall again pay the fee for assessors, but nothing in this rule shall prevent such party from waiving his right to such issue.

19. Whenever the assessors shall have been discharged under the preceding rule, and the issue shall be left to the determination of the judge alone, he shall decide such issue without any further evidence thereon, unless he shall think fit to require the same.

DISCONTINUANCE.

20. The plaintiff may at any time serve notice in writing of discontinuing his proceedings, and thereupon the defendant may proceed for his costs, or may, in proceedings which might entitle him to relief, issue a summons under which the judge may direct the continuance of the proceedings on such terms as he may think fit.

SUMMONS.

21. Any party may be summoned before the judge to show cause why the application contained or set out in the summons should not be granted.

AFFIDAVITS.

22. Every affidavit intended to be used before a court or before a judge shall be intituled in the cause, be made in the first person, and bear the number of the plaint, if any, and shall, before the same is used, be sealed or stamped by the clerk with the seal of such court.

23. Every affidavit used in court shall be delivered to and filed by the clerk, and every affidavit used before the judge out of court shall be delivered to and retained by the judge to the next court day, or transmitted to the clerk by the first opportunity, when it shall be deposited with and filed by the clerk.

24. The condition and true place of abode of every person making an affidavit shall be inserted therein, and in every affidavit made by two or more deponents, the names of the several persons making such affidavit shall be written in the jurat; and no affidavit shall be read or made use of in court or before the judge in the jurat of which there is any interlineation or erasure, or in the body of which there is any interlineation or erasure not initialed in the margin by the person taking it.

25. When any affidavit is sworn by any person who, from his or her signature, appears to be illiterate, the person taking such affidavit shall certify or state in the jurat that the affidavit was read in his presence to the party making the same, and that such party seemed perfectly to understand the same, and also that the said party wrote his or her mark or signature in the presence of the person taking such affidavit.

26. When objection is made to any act done by a judge upon affidavit in regard to non-compliance with any of the last four rules, it shall be at his discretion to determine whether the act should be avoided.

EXECUTION AFTER YEAR.

27. No execution shall be issued under any decree or order after the expiration of one year from its date, or the time, if any, of the act directed to be done, except upon a judge's summons to show cause or special order.

REGISTER.

28. The register to be kept by the Clerks of Courts of Mines, as directed by the 169th section, shall be in a book with columns, with the following headings:—

- 1st. Number of plaint.
- 2nd. Whether prosecuted with written pleadings.
- 3rd. Names and abode of parties as in plaint.
- 4th. Day of sealing of summons.
- 5th. Nature of relief sought generally.
- 6th. Sums claimed.
- 7th. Dates of pleadings.
- 8th. Orders and decrees, substance generally.
- 9th. Dates thereof.
- 10th. Other determinations of suit generally.
- 11th. Issues tried generally.
- 12th. Date of trial.
- 13th. Result of trial.
- 14th. Process to compel execution and date.
- 15th. Result or return.
- 16th. If special case sent to chief judge, date and result.
- 17th. If appeal to chief judge, date and result.

FEES TO BARRISTERS AND ATTORNEYS.

29. The fees to be paid to barristers and attorneys practising in the Courts of Mines, and the expenses to be paid to witnesses in the said courts, shall be those set down in the schedule hereunto annexed.

30. In calculating the said fees, the amount or value of the demand shall, where the defendant succeeds, regulate the amount, and where the plaintiff succeeds, the amount recovered shall regulate it.

31. Where a barrister shall travel in order to attend any one case away from his residence, he shall be allowed further Three guineas a day for every day after the first, and his travelling expenses according to the sums reasonably and actually paid.

JUDGE FIXING COSTS.

32. When the Act or these rules require or allow anything to be done upon payment of costs, or upon terms, whether as to payment of costs or otherwise, as the judge or court shall think fit, the amount of such costs shall be ascertained and fixed by the judge in each particular case, without any other taxation.

ATTORNEY'S ROLL.

33. No attorney shall be allowed to appear for any person in any Court of Mines until he has signed a roll or book to be kept by the clerk for the purpose.

SURVEYOR'S LIST.

34. The assistance, under section 140, of any surveyor shall not be obtained by any Court of Mines, unless such surveyor shall have been licensed by the Chief Secretary; and a list of all such licensed surveyors shall be affixed by the clerk of the court in some conspicuous part of the office.

FEES TO SURVEYORS, ETC.

35. The costs and expenses to be allowed to accountants, engineers, surveyors, and other scientific persons, whose assistance shall be obtained by the judge, shall be fixed by him, and shall be paid by the party or parties to the suit temporarily or finally, and in such manner and proportions as he shall direct.

POINTS ON APPEAL.

36. In every suit, appeal, matter, or proceeding before the Court of Mines, or any judge thereof, after the plaintiff, appellant, respondent, or applicant, his attorney or counsel, shall have stated his case or made his application, and before he shall have called any witness, the judge may, if he shall think proper, call upon the defendant, appellant, or respondent, or person called upon to answer, his attorney or counsel, to state the nature of his defence or answer; and neither party shall be permitted to depart from such opening statement, defence, or answer, without leave of the judge; and in no case shall such permission be given so as to enable any person to rely upon a purely technical defence or answer after he has stated a defence or answer upon the merits.

GENERAL PROVISIONS.

37. In any case for which a form is not provided by the said Act, any form which is so provided may, *mutatis mutandis*, be adapted to, and shall be sufficient for, such cause, or any form plainly showing its object.

38. In the construction of these rules, words importing the singular shall include the plural, and *vice versa*; words importing the masculine shall include the feminine gender, and words applicable to individuals shall include corporations and companies.

39. The time fixed by these rules in days shall be exclusive of the first and inclusive of the last day, unless the last day shall fall on a Sunday or holiday, in which case it shall be exclusive of that also.

BYE-LAW No. 35, OF MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF BALLARAT.

A BYE-LAW FOR THE PRESERVATION OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH, AND THE SUPPRESSION OF NUISANCES CAUSED BY THE OVERFLOW OR SOAKAGE OF WATER-CLOSETS AND CESS-POOLS.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, intituled *An Act for the Establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to make bye-laws for the preservation of the public health, and the suppression of nuisances: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the Municipal Council of the District of Ballarat, that the owner or occupier of any house or premises shall not allow the contents of any water-closet, privy, or cesspool to overflow or soak therefrom, so as to be a nuisance or injurious to the health of the inhabitants, after written notice from the local inspector of nuisances to such owner or occupier to abate the same.

Any person guilty of any neglect or breach of this bye-law shall forfeit and pay a penalty, on conviction before two or more justices of the peace, or sum not exceeding Twenty pounds.
