## OCCUPATION OF CROWN LANDS UNDER THE 42ND SECTION OF THE AMENDING LAND ACT 1865.

PERSONS desirous of obtaining licenses to occupy portions of Crown lands under the provisions of the 42nd section of *The Amending Land Act 1865*, are hereby cautioned that, as the marking out on the ground of the sites to be applied for is an indispensable preliminary, applications for licenses will not be entertained, unless, prior to application to the surveyor authorised to effect the required surveys, the sites shall have been defined on the ground in the manner prescribed in the regulations.

Applications for the granting of more than one license, under the 42nd section of *The Amending Land Act 1865* to the same individual, will only be entertained by the Board of Land and Works when made by persons intending, and who will undertake, on obtaining such licenses, to permanently occupy, for residence and cultivation, the land for which they apply.

Applicants must, in every instance, insert the required notice in the newspaper published in the town nearest to the land for occupation of which license is desired.

In those portions of the parishes of Warrenheip, Bungaree, Dean, and Kerit Bareet, formerly included in the State Forest, as recommended to be reserved by the commission at Ballarat, the licenses under the 42nd section, for residence and cultivation, will not exclude the right of cutting and removing live timber therefrom, by holders of timber licenses, upon such portions of land not cultivated; to remove the same, and the right of entry on the land at all reasonable times for those purposes. Neither the holder of any license under the 42nd section, nor any other person, will be allowed to bark or ring living timber upon the land included within any such license under the 42nd section.

## CONTROL OF CERTAIN COMMONS.

IN pursuance of the provisions of *The Amending Land Act 1865*, § 53, the Governor in Council has, by Orders made on the 26th of March, 1866, directed as follows, viz.:-

That the portion of the Natto Yallock Farmers' Common lying within the Shire of Bet-bet be, and be deemed to be, included in that shire; and that the portion of the said Common lying within the Shire of Avoca be, and be deemed to be, included within the Shire of Avoca.

That the whole of the Warranook Farmer's Common, as described in a Proclamation bearing date the 17th of October, 1865, be, and be deemed to be, included in the Shire of Stawell.

Draining, forming, and metalling about one mile seventy-one chains and thirty-six links of the Main Geelong to Warrnambool road.

## WORKS ON MAIN ROADS.

THE Governor in Council, in exercise of the power conferred by *The Local Government Act 1863*, has, by Order severally made on the 9th day of April, 1866, directed that the under-mentioned Shire Councils shall, within the times by the said respective Orders appointed, execute the works on Main Roads hereinafter named and described, as provided by the 220th section of the said Act, according to plans deposited with the Board of Land and Works, that is to say:—

The Council of the Shire of Ararat shall, within twelve months from the 9th of April aforesaid, drain, form, and metal about thirty-nine chains of the Main Wickliffe to Streatham road.

The Council of the Shire of Ararat shall, within twelve months from the 9th of April aforesaid, drain, form, and metal about fifty-seven chains of the Main Ararat to Wickliffe road.

The Council of the Shire of Ballarat shall, within twelve months from the 9th of April aforesaid, drain, form, and metal about one mile of the Main Ballarat to Creswick and Clunes road.

The Council of the Shire of Ballarat shall, within twelve months from the 9th of April aforesaid, drain, form, and metal about one mile seventy-nine chains and fifty links of the Main Ballarat to Amherst (direct) road.

The Council of the Shire of Dundas shall, within twelve months from the 9th of April aforesaid, drain, form, and metal about twenty-five chains of the Main Hamilton to Portland road.

The Council of the Shire of Glenelg shall, within twelve months from the 9th of April aforesaid, drain, form, and metal about one mile thirty chains and thirty-three links of the Main Casterton to Digby road.

The Council of the Shire of Glenelg shall, within twelve months from the 9th of April aforesaid, drain, form, and metal about one mile and thirty-four chains of the Main Casterton to Coleraine road.

# AGRICULTURAL STATISTICS FOR THE YEAR ENDING 31ST MARCH, 1886.—APPROXIMATE RETURNS.

\*\*\* The collector for South Bourke has not sent in his returns. In consequence of this, the extent of land under each description of crop, in that district, has been taken from the returns of last year, and the produce of the various crops has been calculated at the same acreable rate as the yield of the remainder of the county, as ascertained by present returns. The collector for Mornington has only supplied particulars respecting agriculture: the figures relating to the land in occupation, and the land enclosed in that county, have therefore been taken from last year's returns. The other returns have been taken from the collector's summaries, which have only been partially checked. It is not likely, however, that the totals when finally revised will differ much from those now given.
