## THE SUBDIVISIONS OF THE SHIRE OF WYNDHAM.

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the ninth day of April, 1866.*

PRESENT:

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1863* it is amongst other things enacted that at any time after the first annual election or general election, as the case may be, or first appointment of members of the district board, for any original or proclaimed district thereafter sometimes called "single district," the Governor in Council, if it seem fit, may, and if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said district, shall, within three months after the receipt of the same, divide the district into two, or, if the Governor in Council shall see fit, into three separate electoral subdivisions, thereafter called subdivisions by such names as shall by such Order in Council be assigned to the same, and in and by such Order in Council the boundaries of the subdivisions shall be set forth; provided that no such division shall be made within three months before any day appointed for holding any election of members of the district board in and for such district; and it is also enacted that every shire shall after the proclamation thereof as such be and be deemed to be and have been such and the same district as such shire was at the time of such proclamation, and save as aforesaid and save where therein otherwise expressly provided all the provisions of the said Act relating to districts shall continue and be of full force and effect with regard to such shire and be read accordingly: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council made on the seventh day of March, 1864, the Shire of Wyndham was constituted: And whereas the Governor in Council has received a petition signed by not less than twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said shire, praying for the division of the said shire into three subdivisions: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order divide the Shire of Wyndham into three separate electoral subdivisions in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, by the names hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, and doth hereby set forth the boundaries of the said several subdivisions in manner following, that is to say:—

**THE EAST RIDING**—Commencing at the north-west angle of section XXII., parish of Tarnnet; thence east by part of the northern boundary of the shire to its north-east angle; thence southerly and westerly by the boundary of the shire to the mouth of the Werribee River; thence north-westerly by the said river to the north-west angle of section XVI., parish of Deutgam; thence east to the road forming the east boundary of sections I., VII., IX., XIV., XX., and XXIII., parish of Tarnnet; thence north by that road to the commencing point.

**THE SOUTH RIDING**—Commencing at the intersection of the south boundary of the parish of Mouyong with the west boundary of the shire; thence east by the said south boundary and the south boundary of the parish of Werribee to the Werribee River; thence by that river south-easterly to the sea coast; thence southerly, westerly, and northerly by the shire boundary to the commencing point.

**THE NORTH RIDING**—Commencing at the intersection of the south boundary of the parish of Mouyong with the west boundary of the shire; thence east to a road forming the east

boundary of sections I., VII., IX., XIV., XX., and XXIII., parish of Tarnnet; thence north by that road to the northern boundary of the shire; thence westerly and southerly by the northern and western boundary of the shire to the commencing point.

And the Honorable James Forrester Sullivan shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

**OCCUPATION OF CROWN LANDS UNDER THE 42ND SECTION OF THE AMENDING LAND ACT 1865.**

**P**ERSONS desirous of obtaining licenses to occupy portions of Crown lands under the provisions of the 42nd section of *The Amending Land Act 1865*, are hereby cautioned that, as the marking out on the ground of the sites to be applied for is an indispensable preliminary, applications for licenses will not be entertained, unless, prior to application to the surveyor authorised to effect the required surveys, the sites shall have been defined on the ground in the manner prescribed in the regulations.

Applications for the granting of more than one license, under the 42nd section of *The Amending Land Act 1865* to the same individual, will only be entertained by the Board of Land and Works when made by persons intending, and who will undertake, on obtaining such licenses, to permanently occupy, for residence and cultivation, the land for which they apply.

Applicants must, in every instance, insert the required notice in the newspaper published in the town nearest to the land for occupation of which license is desired.

In those portions of the parishes of Warrenheip, Bungaree, Dean, and Kerit Barret, formerly included in the State Forest, as recommended to be reserved by the commission at Ballarat, the licenses under the 42nd section, for residence and cultivation, will not exclude the right of cutting and removing live timber therefrom, by holders of timber licenses, upon such portions of land not cultivated; to remove the same, and the right of entry on the land at all reasonable times for those purposes. Neither the holder of any license under the 42nd section, nor any other person, will be allowed to bark or ring living timber upon the land included within any such license under the 42nd section.

**BEECHWORTH MINING DISTRICT.**

**BYE-LAWS.—[6th March, 1866.]**

At a meeting of the Mining Board for the Mining District of Beechworth, begun and holden at Beechworth, in the said district, on 6th day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, it is ordained by the said Board as follows, that is to say:—

**BYE-LAW 37.—RESERVOIRS.**

Any person desirous of constructing a reservoir, shall take possession of the site or area thereof by erecting a post at each angle, and shall register the same with the registrar within forty-eight hours after taking such possession.

The embankments of all reservoirs, having a storage capacity of more than five hundred thousand gallons, constructed for the purpose of storing water, shall be formed of earth, with or without a facing of any other material, and shall be of the following dimensions, and according to the following scale, namely: The base of the embankment shall be four feet wide in addition to five feet for every foot it is in height. The front of the embankment shall have a slope of not less than three feet for every foot in height, and the back shall have a slope not less than two feet for every foot in height. The top of the embankment, when finished, shall not be less than four feet in

width. There shall also be a bye-wash formed at least three feet below the level of the top of the embankment, which shall not be less than four feet wide; and if the storage capacity of the reservoir exceeds one million gallons, then the width of the bye-wash shall not be less than six feet.

**BYE-LAW 38.—TAILING DAMS IN THE YACKANDANDAH DIVISION.**

The holder of any bank sluicing claim in the Yackandandah division, shall be entitled to occupy, for the purposes of a tailing dam, an area of ground not exceeding one acre, into which the tailings from such claim shall be run; always provided that, should any other claimholder wish to use such dam for the same purpose, he may do so by paying the owners thereof a fair share of the cost of construction, and also by contributing a fair share of the cost of keeping said dam in repair.

**BYE-LAW 39.—RESIDENCE AND BUSINESS SITES.**

When any residence or business site is occupied within fifty yards of any road, street, or thoroughfare existing at the time of such occupation, the frontage of such site towards such road, street, or thoroughfare shall not exceed sixty-six feet by a depth of one hundred and sixty-five feet.

No person shall occupy a residence or business site any portion of which is within thirty-three feet of the centre of any road, street, or thoroughfare, or within ten feet of any site previously occupied.

No person shall take up and occupy for residence or business purposes any ground within twelve feet of any race unless with the consent of the owner of such race.

Any person taking up land under this bye-law shall not be deemed to be in legal possession thereof unless the same shall have been registered within forty-eight hours after taking possession, and such person shall be compelled to occupy the same within twenty-one days after such registering, or in default the same shall be deemed to be forfeited.
