COMMONS INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase the commons hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

EURAMBEEN FARMERS' COMMON, described in a proclamation bearing date the 13th day of November, 1865, and diminished by another proclamation bearing date the 5th day of February, 1866, is hereby increased by the addition thereto of the unappropriated Crown lands in the allotments hereinafter enumerated,

ROADS IN HORSHAM.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE YAN YEAN RESERVOIR AND THE ADJACENT RESERVE.

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act 1865*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of the public reserves, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein; the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, have made the following Regulations to be observed and enforced in respect of the Yan Yeau Reservoir and the adjacent reserve:—

REGULATIONS.

1. No person will be allowed to bring into the reserve any vehicle or horse, unless with the permission of the Inspector-General of Public Works.

2. The following acts are strictly forbidden :

Boating on or bathing in the reservoir.
Throwing stones, sticks, or other missiles therein, or allowing dogs to enter the water, shooting ducks or other wild fowl thereon.

Lighting fires in the reserve.
Breaking glass bottles and leaving fragments on the ground.
Cutting or otherwise damaging any tree or shrub in the reserves.

Allowing cattle, sheep, pigs, or goats to enter the reserve, or shooting birds therein.

Damaging or removing fencing, gates, or notice boards.
Removing earth, gravel, sand, or soil from the reserve; cutting or removing grass without permission.

3. Fishing with rods and lines in the reservoir will be permitted during four hours only in each day (Sundays excepted), viz., from Four p.m. until Eight p.m., but no person will be allowed to enter the water or to use boats or rafts for the purpose of fishing; netting will not under any circumstances be allowed.

All persons are hereby cautioned that under the provisions of the 67th section of the Act before mentioned every person offending against these regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each offence, and that every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such rule or regulation, and who shall not after he shall have been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).
