PROCLAMATION

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Brigadier-General George Jackson Carey, Companion of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Commanding Her Majesty's Troops in the Australian Colonies, and Officer administering the Government of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Land Act 1862 it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown Land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any municipal district, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold fields common, or a town common respectively, as the case may be: And whereas by The Amending Land Act 1865 it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or reproclaimed, and may from time to time reproclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of The Land Act 1863 and the new reciting Act: Now therefore I, the Officer administering the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim, alter, or abolish (as the case may be) the commons hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Acts, that is to say:

Darlington Town Common for the use of all householders of the township of Darlington, viz.: Commencing at the southwest angle of the township of Darlington; thence by the west boundary thereof bearing north seventy chains; thence by the west boundary thereof bearing north-east angle of suburban allotment 1 of section 4; thence to the said angle being a point on the right bank of Mount Emu Creek; thence by that creek bearing easterly and southerly to the east boundary of that allotment by a line bearing south, the said angle being a point on the right bank of Mount Emu Creek; thence by the the north-west angle of suburban allotment 6 of section 1; bearing west thi

WAHGUNYAH GOLD FIELD COMMON.—The Gold Field Common of Wahgunyah, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 26th day of February, 1866, is hereby abolished; and in lieu thereof, the unappropriated Crown lands within the boundaries hereinafter described are hereby proclaimed a Gold Field Common for Wahgunyah, viz.: Commencing at the south-west

angle of allotment 1 of section T, in the parish of Gooramadda; angle of allotinent 1 of section T, in the parish of Gooramadda; thence by a line bearing south two hundred and fifty chains; thence by a line bearing north two hundred and fifty chains; thence by a line bearing north two hundred and fifty chains to a point on the south boundary of allotinent 3 of section F; and thence by the south boundaries of sections F, L, M, U, and T to the point of commencement. BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS. BYE-DAWS.

MELBOURNE SEWERS AND WATER SUPPLY.

MELBOURNE SEWERS AND WATER SUPPLY.

THE Board of Land and Works doth hereby, pursuant to, and in exercise and execution of, the powers and authorities conferred on such Board by The Public Works Statute 1865, make the Bye-laws following:

1. All bye-laws heretofore made relating to the Melbourne Sewers and Water Supply shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

2. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the board otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, that is to say:

1. On every house or tenement above the annual value and under, Ten shillings per annum.

11. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £10 and not exceeding £100, a rate of Five pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.

12. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £100 and not exceeding £300, a rate of Four pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation.

1. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £300 and not exceeding £500, a rate of Four pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.

On every house or tenement above the annual value of £500, a rate of Three pounds per centum on the amount

of the valuation.
Warehouses and stores not being domiciles shall be subject to a rate of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation. vii. Water-troughs will be charged for at the rate of Twenty

shillings per annum each.

The following scale of charges are those which persons shall pay for water supplied by the board by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the board:—

4. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be (1), if for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity of which the charge at 1s. per 1000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied it supplied otherwise than by measure; and (2) if for other than domestic purposes only, 25,000 gallons per quarter.

5. Any person receiving water from the board who shall take and carry away such water from his premises to any person not having agreed to be supplied by the board with water, or who shall allow such person to take and carry away the same, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

6. Any person receiving water from the board who shall sell the same to any other person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

7. Any person not subject to the payment of a water-rate, who shall take or carry away water from any drinking-tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, without written permission from the board so to do, shall be liable to a penalty not receding the property of the penalty not receding the penalty not recedi

mission from the board so to do, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

8. Any person who shall offend by opening any ground, so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the board, without giving two days notice to the board of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with, or after any pipe the property of the board, without the permission in writing of the board being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or careles-ly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipework, or engine the property of the board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

9. Any person who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the board without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the board, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to

the directions of some officer of the board, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipe of the board of a strength and material not sanctioned by the board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding. Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board. Lead-piping of the following weights only will be allowed to be fixed for either internal or external services.

no service of a larger bore than \(\frac{1}{2} \) inch will be permitted unless by special consent of the board.

10. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the board into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the board that such service-pipe requires repairing, the board may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise, as to the said board may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier (if any), and if none, the owner shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board.

11. Any person supplied with water by the board who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board.

12. No meter shall be allowed to be affixed unless the dial of

and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board.

12. No meter shall be allowed to be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering (1,000,000) one million gallons, except by special consent of the board.

13. If any meter should cease registering, and during the time it is undergoing repairs, the board shall estimate and charge for the water consumed by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the preceding year.

14. Any person connecting any service-pipe, or branch service-pipe, with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board.

15. In the construction of these bye-laws, the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole.
