DRAFT OF BY-LAW NO. 1 TO REGULATE THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE BOARD.

OF THE BOARS.

THE ordinary meetings of the board shall be be held on every second Friday in the mouth throughout the year, at Twelve o'clock in the forenoon, or on such other day as the board may from time to time appoint.

2. The first business at each meeting of the board shall be to read and confirm the minutes of the previous meeting, and no discussion shall be allowed thereon, except as to the accuracy of such minutes as a record of the proceedings. The minutes, when confirmed, shall be signed by the chairman of the meeting.

3. The order of the proceedings at each meeting shall be as follows:—

I. Reading and ordering on correspondence, petitions, and

s. The order of the proceedings at each meeting shall be as follows:

1. Reading and ordering on correspondence, petitions, and memorials.

11. Reading reports of committees and officers.

111. Orders of the day, comprising all business not completed at any former meeting; business of which due notice has been given, and any matter which the chairman may think fit to introduce.

11. Instructions to officers.

12. Examination of accounts for payment.

13. Notices of motion to be given at future meetings.

14. All notices of motion must be given to the clerk in writing, and be signed by the proposer, and shall be read aloud at the meeting at which they are given. No motion of which notice has been given shall be considered unless the member who gave such notice, or some other member duly authorised by him in writing, shall be present when the business is called on, and notices not so proceeded with shall be struck out.

15. The mover of any motion which shall be referred to a committee shall be a member of such committee.

16. Any member speaking on any matter before the board, or asking any question, must rise and address the chairman for the time being; and the chairman must also rise when addressing the board. No member shall be interrupted, except by a call to order, when he shall sit down until the question of order be decided. The chairman shall put each question, first in the affirmative and then in the negative, and shall then and there decide which has the majority of votes.

17. The ruling of the chairman of each meeting shall be final on all points of order, and shall be given without argument or comment, except by way of citing a precedent, If two or more members rise at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is first entitled to be heard.

18. Every motion, together with the names of the mover and advision thereon the votes shall be entertained until it has been seconded and every motion or amendment shall be put in

seconder thereof, shall be entered on the minutes, and on a division thereon the votes shall be recorded if so required by any member.

9. No motion or amendment shall be entertained until it has been seconded, and every motion or amendment shall be put in an affirmative form. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, and if lost, another amendment may be moved before the original question is put by the chairman; but if any amendment be carried, it shall take the place of the original motion, and one amendment may be moved thereon, but no more. No motion or amendment once before the board shall be withdrawn without leave.

10. Any member desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the board thereon.

11. Any member moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon; but a member merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

12. Any question may be set aside by the motion, "That the board do now adjourn," or by the previous question being moved, viz., "That that question be now put;" but on neither of these motions shall any discussion be allowed.

13. Any one or more of the rules or regulations contained in this by-law may be suspended for a special purpose, on notice of motion being duly given, and not otherwise, except by the unanimous vote of the members present.

14. Any member may protest respectfully against any resolution of the board at the time of such resolution being adopted; and such protest shall at the request of the member making it, and with the consent of the board, be entered in the minute-book.

Any member who shall refuse to obey when ruled out of order, or shall use any expression capable of being applied offensively, and who, if required by the chairman to withdraw such expression and apologise for the same, shall refuse or neglect to do so, shall be deemed guilty of an offence, and liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling, to be recovered before any two justices of the peace.
