## WORKS ON MAIN ROADS.

**HIS** Excellency the Officer administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power conferred by the *Local Government Act 1863*, has, by Orders severally made on the 28th day of May, 1866, directed that the undermentioned Shire Councils shall, within the times by the said respective Orders appointed, execute the works on Main Roads hereinafter named and described, as provided by the 220th section of the said Act, according to plans deposited with the Board of Land and Works, that is to say:—

The Council of the Shire of Avon shall, within twelve months from the 28th of May aforesaid, drain and form about one mile thirty-two chains and fifteen links, and drain about thirty-eight chains and fifty links of the Main Central road (Punt lane).

The Council of the Shire of Dundas shall, within twelve months from the 28th of May aforesaid, drain, form, and metal about thirty-six chains of the Main Hamilton to Dunkeld road.

The Council of the Shire of Newstead shall, within twelve months from the 28th of May aforesaid, drain, form, and metal about one mile ten chains and thirty links of the Main Newstead to Carisbrook road.

Ten out of the seventeen deaths in Collingwood were of children under three years of age, and fever, diarrhoea, influenza, and chest diseases, are reported in that district as having considerably increased during the past week, and nine out of the twenty-one deaths in South Melbourne occurred in public institutions. Fever in a mild form is reported as very prevalent in Williamstown. Although influenza is prevalent with other ailments in the districts generally, the rate of mortality has not increased.
