AMENDING LAND ACT 1865. (Section 42.)

REFERRING to the notice published in the *Government Gazette* of the 25th May, 1866, that no individual will be permitted to hold licenses for occupation of portions of land in different localities, it is hereby further notified that the said notice is not intended to prohibit individuals who have obtained licenses to occupy twenty (20) acres or any less area of land under the provisions of the 42nd section of *The Amending Land Act 1865* from obtaining, under the regulations made and ordered on the 12th February, 1866, any number of additional licenses not exceeding three (3) to occupy portions of land not exceeding in extent twenty (20) acres each non-adjacent to any site held by them as aforesaid in cases where there is no land contiguous to such first-mentioned site suitable for occupation under such additional license, and provided that the conditions of the license obtained under the original regulations have been duly fulfilled.

METHOD OF ASCERTAINING THE STRENGTH OF CORDIALS, LIQUEURS, STRONG WATERS, ETC., EXCEEDING THE STRENGTH OF PROOF.*

IT is hereby notified for general information, that His Excellency the Officer administering the Government in Council has been pleased, in accordance with the 14th section of the Customs Duties Act, 29 Vic. No. 293, to approve of the following method of ascertaining the proportion of spirits, according to the standard of proof, contained in spirits, cordials, liqueurs, strong waters, or other liquids, holding in solution any article which prevents the true strength from being ascertained by means of Sykes' Hydrometer ("if the strength of any such spirits, cordials, liqueurs, strong waters, or other liquids, shall exceed the strength of proof")—A liquid quantity of any of them may be taken for examination and the spirit extracted therefrom; that such extract shall then be mixed with pure water until it becomes in volume equal to the original quantity operated upon; and that the strength of such volume, when tested by means of Sykes' Hydrometer, shall be deemed to be the true alcoholic strength of such cordial, liqueur, strong water, or other liquid, as the case may be.

ROAD DISTRICT OF STRATHFIELDSAYE.
BYE-LAW No. 1.—To regulate by Standing Orders the
PROCEEDINGS AND AFFAIRS OF THE BOARD OF THE DIS-
DISTRICT OF STRATHFIELDSAYE.

THE business of the board shall be conducted with open doors, except on special occasions; and if at any time interruption be caused by persons present, who are not members of the board, the chairman shall require them to withdraw.

2. The ordinary meetings of the board shall be held at the board-room on the first and third Thursday of every month, at Two o'clock p.m., and the business shall commence as soon after that hour as a quorum of five members shall be in attendance; but should a quorum not be present at the expiration of one hour after the time appointed for the meetings, the same shall be entered with the names of the members present in the minute book, and such meeting shall be adjourned.

3. Special meetings of the board shall, on the requisition of three or more members, be convened by the clerk, the object of such meetings being set forth in the requisition. Four clear days' notice at least shall be given to each member.

4. The first business at all ordinary meetings of the board shall be reading the minutes of any preceding meeting or meetings, in order to their confirmation; and no discussion shall be permitted thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record.

5. At all ordinary meetings of the board, after the confirmation of the minutes, the following shall be the order of business:—

1. Reading, considering, and ordering upon correspondence.
2. Receiving and reading petitions and memorials.
3. Reading and ordering on reports of committees and officers, and clerk's financial report.
4. Orders of the day.
5. Examination and passing of accounts for payment.
6. Reading notices of motion for future meetings.

6. Every petition or memorial addressed to the board shall be presented by a member, who shall be responsible for its being respectfully worded.

7. The orders of the day shall include all business incomplete at a former meeting, all matters of which due notice has been given, and any business which the chairman, or any member, or the clerk may introduce, and in the ordering of which a verbal instruction to an officer may be deemed sufficient.

8. Notices of motion for the next ordinary meeting of the board, signed by the mover, shall be read aloud and handed to the clerk to be entered in a book to be kept for that purpose.

9. Any motion, of which notice has been given, being brought forward, and the member giving the notice not being present, or some member having a written authority to proceed therewith, shall be struck out.

10. The chairman of the board shall in no case be chairman of any committee.

11. The chairman's ruling shall be final on all matters of order or practice, and shall be given without comment or argument.

12. Every member, including the chairman, shall stand while addressing the board.

13. Any member when speaking to a motion or amendment shall address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted except by a call to order, when the member calling to order shall be heard, and the point of order decided before the business shall be resumed or other matters brought forward.

14. Any motion or amendment not seconded will not be entertained.

15. When two or more members rise to speak, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to pre-audience.

16. No member shall speak twice on the same motion or amendment, except by way of explanation, or in reply upon any original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as mover of the amendment last proposed; and the chairman shall call to order any member proceeding to speak a second time on the same motion or amendment.

17. Any member moving or seconding any motion or amendment shall be held to have spoken upon that motion or amendment.

18. As soon as the debate on any question shall be concluded, the chairman shall put the question distinctly and audibly, first in the affirmative and then in the negative, as often as he may think necessary; and no member shall speak to any question after the same shall have been put by the chairman.

19. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but if lost, another may be moved before the original question is put to the vote; but upon any amendment being carried, it shall be competent for any member to move one other amendment upon it, but no more.

20. The board shall vote in all cases by show of hands, and if there be an equal division of votes on any question, the chairman or acting chairman shall, in addition to his own vote as member, have a second or casting vote.

21. The adoption of any amendment by the board shall be held to have quashed the original motion.

22. No motion involving the expenditure of a sum over £10, or any important business, shall be entertained by the board, unless notice of the same has been given at a previous meeting.

23. Every motion or amendment shall be in writing, and shall be signed by the mover, and shall be entered in a minute book; and upon a division, the names of the members for and against shall be recorded.

24. The mover of any motion or amendment may withdraw the same before it is seconded, by permission of the chairman; but if seconded, such leave can only be given by leave of the seconder.

25. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the board, and if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next in order shall be discussed before any other motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the business then undisposed of shall have precedence at the adjourned meeting of the board.

26. No member shall digress from the subject under discussion, or impute motives to others, and all personal reflection upon any member shall be considered as highly disorderly, and the member making use of such offensive expressions shall withdraw the same, and make an apology if required to do so by the board.

27. The clerk may be required to take down, in writing, any particular words used by a member immediately upon the same being used.

28. It shall be competent for any member, without previous notice, to move that a call be made of all the members of the board for the next ordinary meeting, for the consideration of any subject which shall be stated in the motion, provided that such meeting be not held sooner than ten days from the day on which the motion is made; and if the motion of call be passed, the clerk shall give due notice to each member of the object of the call, and the time and place of the meeting.

29. Any member may of right require the production of any of the documents of the board that may bear on the subject under discussion.

30. Any member may enter his protest against any resolution of the board, provided that such protest is not inconsistent with truth or disrespectful to the board; notice of intention to protest must however be given in every case on the adoption of the resolution protested against, and the protest signed by the member or members protesting, and specifying the reasons for protesting, must be entered before the next ordinary meeting of the board by the protesting member in a book kept for that purpose at the board-room and duly referred to in the minutes of the board, the same to be considered part of such minutes.

31. All contracts over £10 shall be made by tender, unless the board shall otherwise direct. All tenders shall be written on the board's printed forms, and addressed to the chairman, and only opened at the time of their consideration by the board, or a committee appointed for that purpose; and a preliminary cash deposit of ten per cent. on the bulked sum, or a responsible personal security shall be enclosed in, and accompany each tender, which deposit shall, in the case of unsuccessful tenderers, be returned after the board meeting. All tenders not in accordance with these conditions shall be rejected as informal; the respective amounts, together with the names of the parties tendering, to be entered on the minutes of the board.

32. Any contractor whose tender shall be accepted by the board who fails or refuses to sign the contract within seven days and proceed with the work within ten days from the date of the acceptance of the tender, shall forfeit the amount of his deposit, and be disqualified for six months from tendering directly or indirectly under the board.

33. The preliminary deposit of the successful tenderer shall be retained by the board as security for the due fulfilment of his contract, such amount to be refunded to the contractor by the board, together with the balance due to him, within one month from the date of the engineer's certificate of the due fulfilment of the contract.

34. Advances may be made to contractors at a rate not exceeding seventy-five per cent. on the engineer's estimate of the value of the work then done.

35. When any tender shall have been accepted by the board, a contract bond shall be entered into, signed by the contractor, and also two members of the board appointed for that purpose, and the contractor shall also be required to sign the plan and specification of the work for which his tender has been accepted.

36. All payments shall be made by cheque, and signed by the chairman and one other member, and countersigned by the clerk; and no cheque shall be given unless the account for which it is payable shall have been passed at a meeting of the board.

37. The board-room shall be open every Wednesday (unless on days excepted by *The Local Government Act*, and the days proclaimed as holidays under *The Civil Service Act*) between the hours of Ten and Four o'clock, during which hours the clerk shall attend to transact the ordinary business of the board. The surveyor shall attend during the hours of business at every meeting of the board, and at such committee meetings as he may be required.

38. The valuer or valuers appointed by the board shall visit and examine every rateable property within the district, and after having valued such property, shall deliver or cause to be delivered to the owner or occupier thereof, or if such owner or occupier cannot be found, the same to be left on the premises, a notice setting forth the amount at which the property is valued, together with other particulars sufficient to describe such property; and every such notice shall be signed by the valuer.

39. The clerk and surveyor, and every other officer and servant, shall, whenever called on to do so, furnish official reports to the board.

40. The clerk shall have the custody of the common seal of the corporation, and shall be empowered to affix the same to any corporate document requiring such affixture.

41. In all cases it shall be sufficient for the collector to call once for any sum due on the rate roll, and in the event of any such sum not being paid to him when he calls for it, he shall leave a notice bearing the date upon which he calls, demanding payment of such sum within fourteen days from the date of such notice, wherein shall be stated that in default of such payment, legal proceedings for the recovery of such sum may be taken. Every seven days all moneys received by the collector for rates shall be paid to the district treasurer, and the collector shall take a receipt for the same.

42. No election to any office at the disposal of the board shall take place until ten clear days' notice shall have been given in some local newspaper inviting applications for the same, nor until the salary or allowance attaching to such office shall have been fixed before proceeding to such election.

43. The district surveyor shall be the custodian of all plans and specifications of works executed, and hereafter to be executed, under the orders of the board, and all such plans and

specifications shall be the property of the board, and the district surveyor shall be responsible for the safe custody of the same.

44. Any section or sections of this bye-law may be suspended *pro tem.*, in case of emergency, with the unanimous consent of the members present at any meeting, except the purport of such suspension be the rescinding of any motion previously adopted by the board.

45. Any member, officer, or servant disobeying any order of the chairman made in conformity with this bye-law shall be subject to a fine of forty shillings.
