UNITED COMMON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Brigadier-General George Jackson Carey, Companion of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Commanding Her Majesty's Troops in the Australian Colonies, and Officer administering the Government of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Land Act 1862 it is amongst other things enacted, that where there are two or more neighboring commons the Governor in Council may proclaim that the same shall be a common under the name of "The United Town and Gold-field [or, as the case may be] Common of "for the benefit of all persons entitled to commonage on either: Now therefore I, the Officer administering the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the neighboring commons hereinafter mentioned to be a United Common, under the following name, that is to say:—

THE UNITED TOWN AND FARMERS' COMMON OF ROKEWOOD, comprising the Rokewood Town Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the eighteenth day of June, 1866; and the Rokewood Farmers' Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the fourth day of March, 1861. And the said United Common shall be for the benefit of all persons entitled to commonage on either of the abovementioned commons.—(66.M.6706.)

BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS. BYE-LAWS.

MELBOURNE SEWERS AND WATER SUPPLY.

MKLBOURNE SEWERS AND WATER SUPPLY.

THE Board of Land and Works doth hereby, pursuant to, and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on such Board by The Public Works Statute 1865, make the Bye-laws following:

1. All bye-laws heretofore made relating to the McIbourne Sewers and Water Supply shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

2. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the board otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, that is to say:

I. On every house or tenement of £10 annual value and under, Ten shillings per annum.

II. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £10 and not exceeding £100, a rate of Five pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.

III. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £100 and not exceeding £300, a rate of Four pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation.

IV. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £100 and not exceeding £300, a rate of Four pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation.

1V. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £300 and not exceeding £500, a rate of Four pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.

V. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £500, a rate of Three pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.

VI. Warehouses and stores not being domiciles shall be subject to a rate of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation.

VII. Water-troughs will be charged for at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each.

3. The following scale of charges are those which persons shall pay for water supplied by the board by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the board:

gallons.

4. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be (1), if for domestic and other than domestic purposes the quantity of which the charge at 1s. per 1000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied it supplied otherwise than by measure; and (2) if for other than domestic purposes only, 25,000 gallons per quarter. per quarter.

5. Any person receiving water from the board who shall take and carry away such water from his premises to any person not having agreed to be supplied by the board with water, or who shall allow such person to take and carry away the same, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five

6. Any person receiving water from the board who shall sell the same to any other person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

7. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the board who shall take or carry away water from any drinking-tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

8. Any person who shall offend by opening any ground, so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the board, without giving two days notice to the board of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with, or alter any pipe the property of the board, without the permission in writing of the board being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, in jure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine the property of the board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

9. Any person who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the board without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the board, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the board, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipe of the board of a strength and material not sanctioned by the board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board. Lead-piping of the following weights only will be allowed to be fixed for either internal or external services:

No service of a larger bore than a inch will be permitted unless by special consent of the board.

10. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the board into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the board that such service-pipe requires repairing the board may

stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise, as to the said board may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier (if any), and if none, the owner shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board.

11. Any person supplied with water by the board who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the

12. No meter shall be allowed to be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering (1,000,000) one million gallons, except by special consent of the board.

13. If any meter should cease registering, and during the time it is undergoing repairs, the board shall estimate and charge for the water consumed by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the preceding year.

14. Any person connecting any service-pipe, or branch service-pipe, with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board.

15. In the construction of these bye-laws, the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole.
