## THE PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA FURTHER PROROGUED.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Brigadier-General GEORGE JACKSON CAREY, Companion of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Commanding Her Majesty's Troops in the Australian Colonies, and Officer administering the Government of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

**WHEREAS** the Parliament of Victoria has been and now stands prorogued to Thursday; the twelfth day of July instant: And whereas it is expedient further to prorogue the same: Now therefore I, the Officer administering the Government of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation further, prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria from Thursday, the twelfth day of July instant, to Tuesday, the twenty-first day of August now next ensuing.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this ninth day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, and in the thirtieth year of Her Majesty's reign.

## UNITED COMMON.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Brigadier-General GEORGE JACKSON CAREY, Companion of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Commanding Her Majesty's Troops in the Australian Colonies, and Officer administering the Government of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

**WHEREAS** by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted, that where there are two or more neighboring commons the Governor in Council may proclaim that the same shall be a common under the name of "The United Town and Gold-field [or, as the case may be] Common of \_\_\_\_\_" for the benefit of all persons entitled to commonage on either: Now therefore I, the Officer administering the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the neighboring commons herein-after mentioned to be a United Common, under the following name, that is to say:—

THE UNITED TOWN AND FARMERS' COMMON OF ROKEWOOD, comprising the Rokewood Town Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the eighteenth day of June, 1866; and the Rokewood Farmers' Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the fourth day of March, 1861. And the said United Common shall be for the benefit of all persons entitled to commonage on either of the abovementioned commons.—(66.M.6706.)

### RULE 7 AMENDED.

Rule 7. Upon the report of the inspector that the above regulations and conditions have been complied with, Common Schools will be qualified to receive aid, but not in any case to an amount exceeding £2 for every £1 raised by fees and local contributions.

In the interpretation of the above rule, the same shall not be held to affect the payment of fixed salaries and augmentations made under the rules of the Board.

## BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS.

## BYE-LAWS.

## MELBOURNE SEWERS AND WATER SUPPLY.

THE Board of Land and Works doth hereby, pursuant to, and in exercise and execution of, the powers and authorities conferred on such Board by *The Public Works Statute 1863*, make the Bye-laws following:—

1. All bye-laws heretofore made relating to the Melbourne Sewers and Water Supply shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

2. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the board otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, that is to say:—

- I. On every house or tenement of £10 annual value and under, Ten shillings per annum.
- II. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £10 and not exceeding £100, a rate of Five pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.
- III. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £100 and not exceeding £300, a rate of four pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation.
- IV. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £300 and not exceeding £500, a rate of Four pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.
- V. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £500, a rate of Three pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.
- VI. Warehouses and stores not being domiciles shall be subject to a rate of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation.
- VII. Water-troughs will be charged for at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each.

3. The following scale of charges are those which persons shall pay for water supplied by the board by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the board:—

For pumping cellars (for sanitary purposes only) 2d. per 1000 gallons.

4. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be (1), if for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity of which the charge at 1s. per 1000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure; and (2) if for other than domestic purposes only, 25,000 gallons per quarter.

5. Any person receiving water from the board who shall take and carry away such water from his premises to any person not having agreed to be supplied by the board with water, or who shall allow such person to take and carry away the same, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

6. Any person receiving water from the board who shall sell the same to any other person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

7. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the board who shall take or carry away water from any drinking-tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

8. Any person who shall offend by opening any ground, so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the board, without giving two days' notice to the board of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with, or alter any pipe the property of the board, without the permission in writing of the board being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine the property of the board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

9. Any person who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the board without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the board, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the board, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipe of the board of a strength and material not sanctioned by the board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board. Lead-piping of the following weights only will be allowed to be fixed for either internal or external services:—

1 1/2 "	12 "
1 3/4 "	16 "
2 "	20 "

No service of a larger bore than 2 inch will be permitted unless by special consent of the board.

10. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the board into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the board that such service-pipe requires repairing, the board may

stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise, as to the said board may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier (if any), and if none, the owner shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board.

11. Any person supplied with water by the board who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board.

12. No meter shall be allowed to be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering (1,000,000) one million gallons, except by special consent of the board.

13. If any meter should cease registering, and during the time it is undergoing repairs, the board shall estimate and charge for the water consumed by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the preceding year.

14. Any person connecting any service-pipe, or branch service-pipe, with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board.

15. In the construction of these bye-laws, the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole.

The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in schedule, will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c.

Tenderers must state the security proposed, whether in debentures, bank deposit-receipt, cash deposit, guarantee society's bond, or sureties; if the latter, the tender must be accompanied by a certificate from two responsible persons that they are willing to become bound as sureties; and in either case the bond must be executed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, failing which, the contract may be again advertised at the risk of the tenderer, or another tender accepted. The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender, and may elect to require money surety. Persons failing to take up their contract will be disqualified as future contractors.

The names of the tenderers and their proposed sureties, together with their addresses, must be stated at full length.

All tenders must be enclosed in a separate envelope, marked, "Tender for —" (as the case may be), and addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Stores and Transport Office, King street, Melbourne, where samples may be seen, and further particulars obtained.

## CONDITIONS.

1. The whole of the articles required for the service of the Victorian Railways are to be in accordance with the samples and specifications, and in every respect to be of the very best description, quality, and manufacture, subject to the approval of the Engineer-in-Chief and the Traffic Superintendent. The goods will also have to prove satisfactory to the examination and tests of the Locomotive Superintendent, as the inspecting officer appointed by the Engineer-in-Chief; and should articles of any particular manufacture be ordered, the same are to be furnished at the rates set forth in the contract.

2. All orders for supplies under these contracts must issue from the Secretary for Railways, and all goods must be delivered free of charge to the Railway Stores, Williamstown, unless otherwise directed by the secretary.

3. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being infringed or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service of the Victorian Railways, or by the purchase of articles manufactured in the penal establishments, or the manufacture of articles by the department.

4. The Government will not be bound to issue orders upon the contractors for all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only for such articles, and such quantities of those articles as the Government may order from time to time; neither will the Government be bound to take from the contractors any larger supply of any of the articles than may be shown upon the orders which have been issued during the year, nor will they be bound to take any of the articles enumerated in the schedules for which orders have not been issued. Should the Government require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will be bound to supply the same at the contract rate.

5. Delivery, as a rule, is to be of the full quantity ordered at one time; but all deliveries must be accompanied with detailed invoices or bills of parcels in duplicate, showing quantity, rate, and value, also the number of the order for the goods, otherwise the goods will not be received.

6. In the event of supplies ordered under these contracts not being delivered within forty-eight hours, it will be competent for the railway storekeeper, on the order of the secretary, to cancel the order and purchase the same, or such articles as may be suitable for the service, at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price will be deducted.

7. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account monthly, in the prescribed form, and render the same to the railway storekeeper for certification, previously to payment at the Treasury.

8. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the head of the department requiring the supply, as to the quality, the same is to be decided by a board of survey composed of persons named by the Government, and the decision of the board is to be considered final. Any expense incurred on account of the rejection of supplies by a board of survey will be charged to the contractor.

9. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged to the contractor.

10. The railway storekeeper will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior character, or not in accordance with the specification, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged to him.

11. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the railway storekeeper, to such mulct, not exceeding one-fourth the amount of the monthly account, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.
