THE SHIRE OF HUNTLY.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Brigadier-General GEORGE JACKSON CAREY, Companion of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Commanding Her Majesty's Troops in the Australian Colonies, and Officer administering the Government of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1863* it is amongst other things enacted that if at any time in any district, whether single or united, which shall contain an area of not less than one hundred square miles, the total amount actually paid in respect of the general rate then last made shall have amounted to One thousand pounds, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to proclaim, if it shall seem fit, such district, by such name as in and by such Order in Council may be assigned thereto, to be a shire within the meaning of the said Act, and such district shall thereupon be and be called such shire accordingly; and no district, after the proclamation thereof as such shire, save as therein provided with regard to the adjustment of boundaries to those of electoral districts, shall be united with any other shire or district, or with any borough or municipal district: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the eleventh day of March, 1861, a Road District was proclaimed under the designation of "The Campaspe Road District." And whereas the area of the said district and the amount of the last general rate therein are not less than the area and amount in the said Act mentioned, and it seemed fit to make an Order in Council this day to proclaim the said district to be a shire accordingly: Now therefore I, the Officer administering the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the district heretofore proclaimed and called the Campaspe Road District to be a Shire within the meaning of the said Act, by the name in and by such Order in Council assigned thereto, that is to say:—

THE SHIRE OF HUNTLY.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this third day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, and in the thirtieth year of Her Majesty's reign.

SPECIAL NOTICE TO HOLDERS OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

It is hereby notified that holders of Electors' Rights, issued on or before the 1st day of September, 1865, must obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names placed upon the General Lists to be made up on the 1st day of September next.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from the new list to be made up as aforesaid.

Every renewed right will bear the same number and will be in the like form and tenor as that in lieu of which it is issued, and will be equally available for any election that may take place before the completion of the new roll in October next.

**BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS.
BYE-LAWS.**

MELBOURNE SEWERS AND WATER SUPPLY.

THE Board of Land and Works doth hereby, pursuant to, and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on such Board by *The Public Works Statute 1865*, make the Bye-laws following:—

1. All bye-laws heretofore made relating to the Melbourne Sewers and Water Supply shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

2. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the board otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, that is to say:—

- I. On every house or tenement of £10 annual value and under, Ten shillings per annum.
- II. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £10 and not exceeding £100, a rate of Five pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.
- III. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £100 and not exceeding £300, a rate of Four pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation.
- IV. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £300 and not exceeding £500, a rate of Four pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.
- V. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £500, a rate of Three pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.
- VI. Warehouses and stores not being domiciles shall be subject to a rate of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation.
- VII. Water-troughs will be charged for at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each.

3. The following scale of charges are those which persons shall pay for water supplied by the board by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the board:—

Exceeding Gallons.	Not exceeding Gallons per Quarter.	Per 1000 Gallons.
...	500,000	1 0
500,000	1,000,000	1 0 for 1st 500,000 gallons. 0 6 for excess of that quantity.
1,000,000	...	0 9 for 1st 1,000,000 gallons. 0 4½ for excess of that quantity.

For pumping cellars (for sanitary purposes only) 2d. per 1000 gallons.

4. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be (1), if for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity of which the charge at 1s. per 1000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure; and (2) if for other than domestic purposes only, 25,000 gallons per quarter.

5. Any person receiving water from the board who shall take and carry away such water from his premises to any person not having agreed to be supplied by the board with water, or who shall allow such person to take and carry away the same, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

6. Any person receiving water from the board who shall sell the same to any other person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

7. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the board who shall take or carry away water from any drinking-tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

8. Any person who shall offend by opening any ground, so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the board, without giving two days' notice to the board of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with, or alter any pipe of the property of the board, without the permission in writing of the board being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine the property of the board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

9. Any person who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the board without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the board, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the board, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipe of the board of a strength and material not sanctioned by the board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board. Lead-piping of the following weights only will be allowed to be fixed for either internal or external services:—

Diameter of Pipe.	Weight of Pipe per Yard.
½ inch	5 lbs.
¾ "	6 "
1 "	7 ½ "
1 ¼ "	9 "
1 ½ "	12 "
1 ¾ "	16 "
2 "	20 "

No service of a larger bore than ¾ inch will be permitted unless by special consent of the board.

10. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the board into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the board that such service-pipe requires repairing, the board may

stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise, as to the said board may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier (if any), and if none, the owner shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board.

11. Any person supplied with water by the board who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board.

12. No meter shall be allowed to be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering (1,000,000) one million gallons, except by special consent of the board.

13. If any meter should cease registering, and during the time it is undergoing repairs, the board shall estimate and charge for the water consumed by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the preceding year.

14. Any person connecting any service-pipe, or branch service-pipe, with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board.

15. In the construction of these bye-laws, the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole.

The foregoing bye-laws were made and passed by the Board of Land and Works and the seal of the said Board of Land and Works was hereto affixed the fourth day of July, 1866, in the presence of
