SECTIONS V. TO X. OF "THE POLICE OFFENCES STATUTE 1865" EXTENDED TO THE GARDINER ROAD DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Brigadier-General GEORGE JACKSON CAREY, Companion of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Commanding Her Majesty's Troops in the Australian Colonies, and Officer administering the Government of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign (No. 265), called *The Police Offences Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend all or any of the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, and may define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place, and vary and alter such limits, and may revoke any such Proclamation; and upon any such Proclamation the provisions so proclaimed shall extend to and be in force in such city, town, district, or place: Now therefore I, the Officer administering the Government of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Proclamation extend the provisions contained in sections V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X. of Part I. of the said Statute to

GLEN THOMSON FARMERS' COMMON CHANGED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Brigadier-General GEORGE JACKSON CAREY, Companion of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Commanding Her Majesty's troops in the Australian Colonies, and Officer administering the Government of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, the Officer administering the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby abolish the temporary common for the use of selectors in the agricultural area of Glen Thomson, described in a Proclamation bearing date the fifth day of March, 1866; and with the advice aforesaid I do hereby proclaim another area, being the land comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, to be a temporary common for the use of the selectors in the said area, viz.: Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 106, in the parish of Nanupindah; thence by a road bearing west three hundred and ten chains ninety-nine links to the road forming the eastern boundary of allotment 5; thence by that road bearing N. 9° 57' E. seventy-two chains forty-three links; thence by a line bearing easterly to the north-west angle of allotment 105; and thence by the west boundaries of allotments 105 and 106, bearing south seventy chains to the point of commencement. The bearings are from the true meridian. Area, 1787 acres, more or less.—(66.N.7062.)

Tenderers must state the security proposed, whether in debentures, bank deposit-receipt, cash deposit, guarantee society's bond, or sureties; if the latter, the tender must be accompanied by a certificate from two responsible persons that they are willing to become bound as sureties; and in either case the bond must be executed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, failing which, the contract may be again advertised at the risk of the tenderer, or another tender accepted. BYE-LAWS TO REGULATE THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE COUNCIL OF THE SHIRE OF BALLAN.

GENERAL meetings of the council shall be held every third Friday, at 11 a.m.

2. During the sittings of the council, the office shall be open to the public.

3. Special meetings may be summoned by the secretary upon his receiving a written requisition signed by three members of the council, stating the matter to be brought forward at such meeting; the secretary to give at least four days' notice by letter to each member of the council.

4. The first business at each meeting of the council shall be the confirmation of the minutes of the previous meeting; and no discussion shall take place thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; the minutes then confirmed shall be signed by the president for the time being.

5. After the confirmation of the minutes, the order of business shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable; but for the greater convenience of the council, at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

1. Reading copies of letters sent.
2. Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
3. Reception of, and reading petitions and memorials.
4. Reading and ordering on reports of permanent committees.
5. Reading and ordering on reports of special committees.

6. Every petition addressed to the council shall be in proper form, and presented by one of its councillors, who shall be responsible for the petition being respectfully worded; and on the presentation of the same, no debate shall take place thereon, unless notice shall have been given in the usual manner; and the only question that shall be entertained shall be that the petition be received, and, if necessary, that it be referred to a committee.

7. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the council, and any business which the president may think fit to bring under consideration. Any member of the council may, however, bring forward such business as he may consider advisable, in the form of notice of motion, such notice to be given, in writing, to the secretary by the councillor bringing it forward, at the meeting previous to that at which the same shall be taken into consideration.

8. No motion shall be proceeded with unless the councillor who has given such notice, or one of the council authorized by him in writing, be present to proceed with the same when called upon.

9. Any member shall have power to move for a call of the whole council to rescind any motion previously passed; and on such motion being carried, the secretary shall give notice thereof to each member not then present.

10. *Points of Order.*—1st. Every councillor, including the president, shall stand while addressing the council. 2nd. The decisions of the president shall be final on all questions of order or practice, and he shall state the same without comment or argument. 3rd. No councillor shall digress from the subject under discussion, nor impute motives, and personal reflections shall be deemed highly disorderly. 4th. Any councillor who shall use an expression capable of being applied offensively to any other councillor shall, if required by the president, withdraw such expression, and make a satisfactory apology to the council. 5th. That the president call to order any one out of order (whether he be a councillor or a ratepayer), and if the person deemed out of order refuse to sit down and be still the president shall order him by name to leave the room; and if he still persist in his interruptions the president shall order his removal, or give him in charge and prosecute him as the law directs.

11. Every motion and amendment, whether carried or lost, shall be entered on the minutes, with the name of the mover and seconder, and on a division thereon the votes shall be recorded.

12. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time; but if lost, one other may be moved before the other amendment and original question are put to the vote.

13. All questions to be decided by open voting, unless the council shall otherwise determine.

14. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for the adjournment of the council; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under discussion and the next on the notice paper shall be discussed before the question of adjournment be again entertained. But if the motion of adjournment be carried, the business then undiscussed shall have precedence at the next meeting of the council.

15. Any member may require that the secretary take down the particular words used by a member, immediately on the same being used.

16. Any member of the council may enter his protest against any resolution of the council, provided that such protest is not inconsistent with truth or disrespectful to the council; notice of intention to protest must, however, in every case be given on the adoption of the resolution protested against, and the protest signed by the member or members protesting, and specifying the reasons for protesting, must be recorded on the minutes.

17. The mover of any motion which may be referred to a committee shall be a member of such committee.

18. Any member of the council proposing a motion or amendment, or discussing any matter, must rise and address the president, and no member while speaking shall be interrupted, unless called to order, when he shall sit down, and the member calling to order shall be heard thereon, and the question of order decided before the subject is resumed, or any other business entered upon.

19. No member shall speak twice on the same question, except by way of explanation, or in reply as the mover of any motion or amendment; and after such explanation or reply, the question shall be put to the vote.

20. If more than one member rise at one time to address the council, the president shall decide which is entitled to precedence.

21. No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the council shall take place until six clear days' notice shall have been given in some newspaper circulating in the locality, inviting applications from candidates.

22. No member or officer of the council shall be received as surety for any officer appointed by the council, or for any contract or work to be performed or done for the council; and in all cases in which surety for the due and faithful performance of any duty, contract, or work is required, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the person or persons giving the same.

23. All works to be done by the council over £20 shall be let by tenders, fourteen days' notice of which shall be given by written or printed notices placed in the most conspicuous position in each division of the shire; and by advertisements if thought necessary. All tenders must be endorsed, "Tender for —" as the case may be, and addressed to the president of the council, and be opened only at the time of their consideration. The names of the tenderers, together with the amount of tender, shall be entered on the minutes of the council.

24. No member or officer of the council shall have any pecuniary interest, directly or indirectly, in any contract let by the council.

25. Payments will be made at every general meeting by cheque, signed by two members of the council and countersigned by the treasurer.

26. In all cases it shall be considered sufficient for the collector to call once for any assessment, and in the event of its not being paid, either when called for, or at the office of the council before the expiration of fourteen days, legal proceedings may be taken for its recovery.

27. The collector shall, at intervals of not more than three days, pay into the hands of the treasurer, all moneys received by him on account of the council.

28. The treasurer and collector shall present their accounts at each general meeting of the council.

29. When any tender is accepted, the tenderer shall, with two sufficient sureties, enter into a bond, or pay the sum of ten per cent. on the amount of the contract, at the option of the council, as security for the due and faithful performance of the work contracted for by him or them. And in either case, seventy per cent. only will be paid on the work done while in progress,
