RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT OF VICTORIA.

THE subjoined Rules are published for general information.

*In the Supreme Court of the
Colony of Victoria.*

Saturday, the twenty-third day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five.

REGULE GENERALES.

WHEREAS it is expedient to repeal Chapter II. of the Rules of the said Court and to substitute others in lieu thereof, it is therefore ordered as follows, that is to say:—

1. *Repeal of Chapter II.*—The said chapter of the rules of the said Court shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

PART I.

ADMISSION OF BARRISTERS TO PRACTISE IN THE SAID COURT.

2. *Qualification.*—No person shall be admitted to practise as a Barrister in the said Court unless he shall be qualified as hereinafter provided.

3. *Board of Examiners for Barristers.*—There shall be a Board of Examiners in the said Court which shall be called the Board of Examiners for Barristers, and shall consist of Her Majesty's Attorney and Solicitor General, and Her Majesty's Counsel in the said Colony, and three practising Barristers of the said Court, who shall be elected in the month of December in each year by the practising Barristers of the said Court, and in default of such election it shall be competent for the Judges of the said Court to appoint such practising Barristers. Provided that the Board for the year 1866 may be elected at any time before the 10th day of February in that year, and provided further that should any vacancy in the said Board at any time occur by the removal, death, or resignation of any elected member or otherwise howsoever, the same may be filled up by the election or appointment (as the case may be) of any other practising Barrister.

4. *Elected Members to serve one year.*—The elected members of the said Board shall enter upon the duties of their office on the 10th day of February in the year 1866, and on the 1st day of January in every subsequent year, and not before, and shall continue in office until the last day of December in such year.

5. *Election of Practising Barrister.*—Every practising Barrister of the said Court desirous to vote, shall on or before the 5th day of February next, as respects the election of the Board for the year 1866, and as respects the election of all other Boards, on or before the 10th day of December in each year, signify in writing, signed by him and addressed to the said Board, the names of the practising Barristers whom he proposes shall act for the year 1866, or each ensuing year, as members of the Board, and those for whom the highest number of votes shall be given, shall be members of the Board, but in case of an equality of votes, the Board shall determine the matter by lot.

6. *Meetings and Quorum of the Board.*—The Board shall meet as occasion may require and may adjourn its meetings if deemed necessary, and three members shall form a quorum for the transaction of business, and the majority of members present shall decide all questions which may arise, and in case of an equality of votes at any such meeting or adjournment, the chairman shall have a casting as well as a deliberative vote.

7. *Board may examine candidates.*—The said Board may either by all or any of its members, or by any competent person or persons appointed by it, conduct the examination of every person applying to be admitted to practise as a Barrister in the said Court.

8. *Persons called to the Bar in the United Kingdom.*—Every person who shall have been duly called to the Bar in England, No. 8.—JANUARY 19, 1866.—1.

Scotland, or Ireland, shall be qualified to be admitted to practise as a Barrister in the said Court.

9. *Persons not so called to the Bar must be Students.*—Every person not so called to the Bar, who shall have become and continued a Student-at-Law in the manner and for the time hereinafter mentioned, and shall have complied with the regulations in that behalf hereinafter contained, shall be qualified to be admitted to practise as a Barrister in the said Court.

10. *Intending Students to give notice.*—Every person desirous of becoming a Student-at-Law shall, before the term next preceding that in which he proposes to be admitted, give to the Secretary of the said Board, in the form "A" to these rules annexed, written notice of his intention to apply to be admitted as a Student-at-Law, and the Secretary to the said Board shall reduce all such notices into an alphabetical list under convenient heads, and shall forthwith affix such list on some conspicuous place in the Library of the Supreme Court, and such list shall remain so affixed until the commencement of the next following term.

11. *Intending Students to procure certificate.*—No person shall be admitted as a Student-at-Law, unless at the foot of such notice at the time of the delivery thereof to the Secretary of the Board of Examiners, there shall be a certificate in the form "B" to these rules annexed, signed by two practising Barristers of the said Court of at least five years' standing.

12. *Fees on admission as a Student.*—Every person applying to be admitted as a Student-at-Law, shall, at the time of giving such notice, pay the sum of five guineas to the Secretary of the Board of Examiners, and the Secretary shall, upon payment thereof, deliver to the applicant a receipt for the said notice and certificate, and for the said sum.

13. *Students to be British subjects.*—Every person applying to become a Student-at-Law must be a natural-born or naturalized British subject of good fame and character, and must make his application in person to the said Board on such day in term as the Board shall appoint for that purpose.

14. *Students must have matriculated or be graduates.*—No person shall be admitted as a Student-at-Law, unless he shall have matriculated or

Been admitted as an undergraduate of some other University *ad eundem statum* in the University of Melbourne, or
Have taken a degree at some University recognised by the University of Melbourne.

15. *Students not to be Attorneys, &c.*—No person who shall be

an Attorney, Solicitor, Proctor, Conveyancer, or Notary Public in any part of the British dominions, Writer to the Signet, or Writer to any Scotch Court, Parliamentary Agent, or Clerk to any such person, or to any Barrister, or Clerk in any Court of Law or Equity, or to any Bench of Magistrates, shall be admitted as a Student-at-Law.

16. *Board to meet every Term.*—The Board shall meet once in every term for the purpose of considering the application of every person desirous of becoming a Student-at-Law, and if it shall appear to the Board that such person is a fit and proper person to be admitted, and has complied with the regulations in that behalf hereinafter contained, they shall give to him under their hands a "certificate of admission," and every such certificate shall be dated on the first day of the term in which it is given.

17. *Students to sign Roll Book.*—The Secretary of the Board of Examiners shall keep a book to be called the "Students' Roll Book," and every person to whom any certificate of admission shall have been given shall make and sign in such book a declaration in the form "C" to these rules annexed, and from the time

of signing the same shall be deemed to have become a Student-at-Law.

18. *Students to attend in Court.*—Every Student-at-Law shall, for at least eight days in the term immediately preceding that in which he applies to be admitted to practise as a Barrister in the said Court, attend the sittings of the said Court in banco, and during such attendance shall wear an undergraduate's gown and shall occupy such seat in the said Court as shall be set apart for that purpose.

19. *Record of Attendance.*—The Secretary of the said Board shall, every day during the time of term, enter in a book to be kept for that purpose, a memorandum denoting the attendance of every Student-at-Law who on such day shall attend the sittings of the said Court in banco, and be present within one half hour after the Court shall have commenced sitting.

20. *Students not to practise during Studentship.*—No Student-at-Law shall be admitted to practise as a Barrister in the said Court if, during any part of his Studentship, he shall have become an

Attorney, Solicitor, Proctor, or Notary Public in any part of the British dominions,
 Writer to the Signet, or Writer in any Scotch Court,
 Parliamentary Agent, or
 Clerk to any such person or to any Barrister, or
 Clerk in any Court of Law or Equity or to any Bench of Magistrates.

21. *Period of Studentship.*—No Student-at-Law shall be admitted to practise as a Barrister in the said Court until the expiration of four years from the date of his signing the declaration in the Students' Roll Book, unless

He shall have taken the degree of Bachelor of Laws in the University of Melbourne, or in some University recognised by the University of Melbourne, in which case he may be admitted at the expiration of one year from the date of such signing; or

Unless he shall have taken the degree of Bachelor of Arts in the University of Melbourne, or any such University, or

Have passed four examinations in law in the University of Melbourne, with an interval of at least one year between each, in the subjects of law and history prescribed by the Statutes and Regulations for the time being for the degree of Bachelor of Laws.

In either of which last mentioned cases he may be admitted at the expiration of two years from the date of such signing.

22. *Absence of Students from the Colony.*—No Student-at-Law shall be admitted to practise as a Barrister in the said Court, if during any part of his Studentship he shall have ceased to reside in Victoria; but if any such Student be compelled or desire to leave Victoria in consequence of ill health, or for any other urgent cause, he shall give notice, in writing, to the Secretary of the Board of Examiners, which notice shall specify

1. The time of his projected departure,
2. The country to which he intends to proceed,
3. The true cause of his intended absence,
4. The probable duration thereof;

and the time of his absence from Victoria shall not be included in the period of his Studentship; unless the Board shall think proper to allow the same or some part thereof.

23. *Certain Students to be examined as to Legal Attainments.*—No Student-at-Law who shall not have taken the degree of Bachelor of Laws or Bachelor of Arts in the University of Melbourne, or in some University recognised by such University, or

Have passed four examinations in law in the University of Melbourne, shall be admitted to practise as a Barrister in the said Court unless he shall have undergone an examination touching his capacity to practise as a Barrister, and if the Board shall be satisfied thereof they shall give him a certificate under their hands, testifying such capacity, and no such Student-at-Law shall be so examined until he shall have paid to the Secretary of the said Board a fee of Ten guineas.

24. *Subjects for Examination.*—Every such examination as last aforesaid shall be conducted by questions and answers in writing in the presence of the Board or of some person appointed by them for that purpose, and shall embrace the following subjects, that is to say:

1. Real Property;
2. Conveyancing;
3. Common Law;
4. Pleading and Practice;
5. Equity and Bankruptcy;
6. Insolvency;
7. Criminal Law;
8. Evidence, and
9. The Law of Contracts.

25. *All Students to be examined by the Board.*—No Student-at-Law shall be admitted to practise as a Barrister in the said Court until he shall have attained the full age of twenty-one years and undergone an examination touching his compliance with these regulations and his fitness to practise as a Barrister; and if the Board shall be satisfied thereof, they shall give him a certificate under their hands testifying such compliance and fitness, and such certificate shall be in force until the end of the term next but one following the date thereof, and no longer.

26. *Examination of Persons called to the Bar in the United Kingdom.*—No person who shall have been called to the Bar in England, Scotland, or Ireland shall be admitted to practise as a Barrister in the said Court unless he shall have undergone an examination touching his compliance with these rules, and his call to such Bar, and his fitness to practise as a Barrister; and if the Board shall be satisfied thereof they shall give him a certificate testifying such compliance, call, and fitness, and such certificate shall continue in force until the end of the term next following the date thereof, and no longer.

27. *Appeal to Judges.*—In case any person shall be dissatisfied with the refusal of the Board to grant him a certificate he shall be at liberty to appeal against such refusal by petition to the Judges of the said Court, and such petition shall be heard by the said Judges, or any three of them, at such time as they shall appoint, and the said Judges may upon the hearing thereof dismiss the same, or grant their fiat allowing such appeal, or make such other order as to them may seem fit.

28. *Applicants for admission to give notice.*—Every person desirous of being admitted to practise as a Barrister in the said Court, shall before the term next preceding that in which he proposes to be admitted give to the Secretary of the said Board, in such form as the Board shall require, written notice of his intention to apply to be so admitted, and such Secretary shall reduce all such notices into an alphabetical list under convenient heads and shall forthwith affix such list in some conspicuous place in the Library of the Supreme Court, and such list shall remain so affixed until the commencement of the next following term.

29. *Fees on admission.*—Before a certificate shall be granted to any person for the purpose of his being admitted to practise as a Barrister in the said Court, he shall pay to the Secretary of the said Board the sums following (that is to say), if such person shall have been called to the bar in England, Scotland, or Ireland the sum of Ten guineas, or

If such person shall have been a Student-at-Law as hereinbefore provided the sum of Fifty guineas, and the said Secretary shall endorse on such certificate a receipt for the sum so paid.

30. *Fee on re-examination.*—No Student-at-Law to whom a certificate shall have been refused by the Board of Examiners on a first examination under these rules, shall be entitled to undergo any further examination by such Board, unless he shall first pay to the Secretary of the said Board the sum of Five guineas for every such further examination.

31. *Admission to the Bar.*—No person shall be admitted to practise as a Barrister in the said Court except upon reading the proper certificate or the fiat of three or more Judges, and no motion shall be made for any such admission on any other but the last day of such term.

32. *Rules not to apply to previous Applicants.*—Nothing hereinbefore contained shall affect any person who has already delivered to the Secretary of the Board of Examiners a certificate in the form or to the effect of that in the schedule to the rules hereby repealed and marked "A." And every such person may be admitted as if these rules had not been promulgated, and the Board of Examiners for Barristers established by these rules; and the Secretary shall have the like powers and perform the like duties, in regard to every such person, as would have been had and performed by the Board and Secretary under the said rules, if the same had not been repealed.

PART II.

ADMISSION OF ATTORNEYS, SOLICITORS, AND PROCTORS TO PRACTISE IN THE SAID COURT.

33. *Who are to be admitted Attorneys.*—No person shall be admitted as an Attorney, Solicitor, and Proctor of the said Supreme Court, unless he shall have been duly admitted as an Attorney or Solicitor in some one of the Queen's superior courts of record in England or Ireland, or as a Writer to the Signet in Scotland, or unless he shall have submitted to be examined in the manner hereinafter provided.

34. *Attorneys previously admitted to file affidavits before the first day of Term.*—Every person applying to be admitted to practise as an Attorney, Solicitor, and Proctor in the said Court, previously admitted as an Attorney or Solicitor in any of the Queen's superior courts of record in England or Ireland, or Writer to the Signet in Scotland, shall lodge with the Prothonotary, for the satisfaction of the Court, his original or annual certificate, which shall be returned to him after the hearing or granting of such application; and shall file with the Prothonotary the affidavit on which he seeks admission, together with a copy of his original or annual certificate, which affidavit shall be in the form or to the effect of that in the schedule to these rules annexed, marked D, and contain the following allegations:—

1. That the deponent has been admitted in one of the aforesaid Courts.
2. That he has not done or committed any act or thing which would cause his name to be struck off the roll of the said Court.
3. That to the best of his knowledge and belief his name still remains on the said roll.
4. That the copy of the certificate annexed to his said affidavit is a true copy of his certificate.
5. That he is the person named therein.
6. The time when he ceased to practise.
7. The time of his arrival in the colony.
8. The name of the ship in which he arrived.
9. The mode of his employment from the time he ceased to practise; and
10. A reference to two or more respectable householders resident within the colony to whom he is known; and every such certificate shall be lodged and affidavit filed with the Prothonotary, on or before the first day of the term in which any such person shall so apply.

35. *Examination of candidates for admission as Attorneys.*—Every person applying to be admitted to practise as an Attorney, Solicitor, and Proctor in the said Court, not previously admitted as an Attorney or Solicitor in England or Ireland, or Writer to the Signet in Scotland, must be a natural-born or naturalized British subject of the full age of twenty-one years, of good fame and character, and

shall have been articled to an Attorney or Solicitor of any one of the Queen's superior courts of record in England or

Ireland, or to a Writer to the Signet in Scotland, or to some practising Attorney or Solicitor in this or any other Colony of Great Britain, and shall have served the full term of five years under such articles: or

Who, having been so articulated to one, and having served for any period of time, shall complete the residue of the full term of five years, either as articulated clerk to another Attorney, Solicitor, or Writer to the Signet: or

Who, having been articulated, and having served as aforesaid in England, Scotland, or Ireland, or in this or any other Colony of Great Britain, shall complete the residue of the full term of five years, as articulated clerk to any Attorney or Solicitor in this or any other Colony of Great Britain: or

Who shall have served the full term of five years as Associate to any one of the Judges.

36. *Candidates not previously admitted.*—Every such person must, before he enters into articles, produce to the Board of Examiners for Attorneys a certificate of his having passed at some matriculation examination in the University of Melbourne, in six at least of the subjects fixed for the time being by the statutes and regulations of the said University for the matriculation examination, of which subjects Greek or Latin must be one; and must lodge with the said Board a copy of such certificate; and must also, after he enter into his articles of clerkship, pass two other examinations, with an interval of at least one year between each, in the subjects of law and history, included in the subjects of the second and third examination, as prescribed by the statutes and regulations for the time being of the said University for the degree of Bachelor of Laws.

37. *Residence and Certificates required.*—Every such person shall reside for one year at the least in Victoria before he shall be entitled to be examined as a candidate for admission to practise in the said Supreme Court; and one year before he gives notice of his desire to be examined he shall cause to be delivered to the Board of Examiners for Attorneys a certificate in the form or to the effect of that in the schedule to these rules annexed, marked "E"; and one month before he proposes to be examined he shall cause to be delivered to the said Board a certificate in the form or to the effect of that in the said schedule marked "F"; and before he apply to be admitted to practise he shall procure a report in the form or to the effect of that in the said schedule marked "G."

38. *Board of Examiners for Attorneys.*—The Board of Examiners of the Supreme Court for Attorneys shall consist of three practising Attorneys of the said Court, to be named by the Judges thereof in the month of December in each year to act during the ensuing year.

39. *Examination of Candidates.*—The examination of every candidate desirous to be admitted to practise as an Attorney, Solicitor, and Proctor in the said Court shall be conducted by the said Board of Examiners of the Supreme Court for Attorneys, at such places, days, and hours as they may appoint, and the said Board shall report the result of their examination to the said Judges, who shall determine as to the admission or rejection of such candidate, or direct that he submit to a new or additional examination on some future day. And in case any person shall be dissatisfied with the report of such Board, he shall be at liberty to appeal against such report to the Judges of the said Court, and such petition shall be heard by the said Judges, or any three of them, at such time as they shall appoint, and the said Judges may, upon the hearing thereof, dismiss the same, or grant their fiat allowing such appeal, or make such other order as to them shall seem fit. If approved of, or if such appeal be granted, he shall file with the Prothonotary a copy of the certificate, duly authenticated by the Board of Examiners of the Supreme Court for Attorneys, or a copy of such fiat or order, and give notice by advertisement and otherwise, and in other respects comply with these rules as required.

40. *Subjects of Examination.*—Every such person must, after the expiration of his articles of clerkship and before he apply for admission to practise in the Supreme Court, also submit to be examined by the said Board of Examiners of the Supreme Court for Attorneys, and must pass in six at least of the following branches of the law:—

1. Real Property and Conveyancing.
2. Common and Statute Law.
3. Equity, Divorce and Matrimonial, and Ecclesiastical Law.
4. Bankruptcy or Insolvency, and Admiralty.
5. Criminal Law.
6. Practice of the Supreme Court in its various branches.
7. Practice of the Courts of Inferior Jurisdiction.
8. Constitutional Law, and Constitutional History.

Provided that if any such person shall produce to the said Board of Examiners of the Supreme Court for Attorneys a certificate of his having passed at any matriculation examination in either of the Universities of Oxford, Cambridge, Edinburgh, Dublin, London, or Sydney, or of his having passed the preliminary and any intermediate examination which clerks articulated in England, Scotland, or Ireland may be required to pass, and lodge with the Board a copy thereof, it shall not be necessary for him to submit to such examination a second time.

41. *Rules not to apply to Clerks previously articulated.*—Nothing hereinbefore contained shall affect any person who has already entered into articles of clerkship, but every such person may be admitted as if these rules had not been promulgated, and the Board of Examiners for Attorneys established by these rules, and the Secretary shall have the like powers and perform the like duties in regard to any such person as would have been had and performed by the Board and Secretary under the said rules, if the same had not been repealed.

42. *Fees.*—The following fees shall be paid by persons desirous of being admitted to practise in the said Court as Attorneys, Solicitors, and Proctors:—

PART III.

FEEs, ETC.

43. *Payment of Fees.*—All fees received by virtue of the foregoing rules shall be paid to the Secretary of the said Boards; and in any case in which any applicant be not admitted to practise in the said Supreme Court, the fee required to be paid by him, on his admission to practise, shall be returned to him at his request, on his giving up any certificates he may have received under these rules.

44. *Fees received to be lodged in Bank to the credit of the Chief Justice.*—All such fees received by the said Secretary shall be by him lodged in the bank to the credit of the Chief Justice of the said Court on account of the "Supreme Court Library Fund," and entries of such receipts, lodgments, and of all disbursements shall be duly made in a book to be called the "Supreme Court Library Fee Book," to be kept by such Secretary.

45. *Application of Fees.*—All such fees shall be applied to the purchase and maintenance of a Library for the use of the Supreme Court, and for the payment of such Examiners as may from time to time be appointed by the Boards of Examiners, and of the Secretary to the said Boards as the Library Committee may direct.

Provided that in no case shall the fee to be paid to any person so appointed as Examiner exceed the sum of Ten guineas for the examination of each student, or the fee to be paid to the Secretary exceed the sum of Five guineas in respect of any Student-at-Law, or the sum of Two guineas in respect of any Articled Clerk.

46. *Account of Fees to be published in Court on the first day of Term.*—The Secretary, or in his absence such other person as the Chief Justice may direct, shall, on the first day of each term, present an account of all fees received by such Secretary since the first day of the preceding term, and the mode of disbursement of the same, or any part thereof, and the amount remaining undisposed of, if any.

47. *Library Committee.*—The Library Committee shall consist of the Judges of the said Court, the Board of Examiners for Barristers, and the Board of Examiners for Attorneys, who shall have power to make Rules and Regulations for the management and good government of the Library; and all branches of the profession shall have free access to such Library, subject nevertheless to the rules to be made in that behalf.

48. *Secretary to the Boards.*—Such person as the Judges may from time to time appoint shall be and act as Secretary to the said respective Boards, and shall perform such duties as these rules and the said Boards respectively may require.

RULES OF THE AMHERST DISTRICT HOSPITAL (INCORPORATED).

OBJECTS.

THE objects of the institution are to afford surgical and medical aid to poor persons requiring it. That any person who shall be admitted, under any circumstances, and shall be found able to pay, will be required to do so, and will receive temporary relief only.

2. In the event of any person in a position to pay for surgical or medical advice elsewhere being detected in the receipt of the charity of the institution, such persons shall be charged at the rate of £2 per week for each week from the date of admission if an in-patient, or shall pay to the hospital the sum of 10s. for each occasion upon which advice may have been received at the hospital if an out-patient; but the committee may order the removal of any such persons from the hospital, provided the case is not one of emergency.

CONSTITUTION.

3. The institution shall be governed by a board of management, consisting of a president, two vice-presidents, treasurer, three honorary medical officers, and nine ordinary members of committee, who shall be elected at the annual meeting of contributors, held on the second Thursday in the month of January, in each year, and shall retire in the following order, viz.—The president, vice-president, treasurer, and honorary medical officers annually, and one-third of the nine ordinary members lowest on the poll to retire the first year, and one-third next lowest on the poll to retire on the second year, and every succeeding year the one-third longest in office; the retiring members to be eligible for re-election.

4. If it shall happen that any member or members of the ordinary committee, whose retirement may require to be determined by lot, shall be absent from the meeting at which it shall be necessary to determine by lot who shall go out of office, then the chairman of the meeting, if need be, shall inscribe the name or names of him or them so absent on the paper, and shall do all that is necessary to be done on behalf of the absentee or absentees for determining the nine of the said lot; and the retirement or otherwise and the decision then arrived at, shall be valid and effectual as if such party or parties were present.

5. Should vacancies occur in the offices of ordinary members of committee, president, vice-president, treasurer, or honorary

medical officers, the board shall supply such vacancies for the remainder of the year.

6. It shall be lawful at meetings of contributors for any contributor duly qualified to vote either in person or by proxy, such proxy being a contributor duly qualified. Provided that such proxy shall hand the authority in writing, signed by the contributor; and such authority shall extend to the one meeting and the business specially named therein.

7. The annual general meeting shall elect two contributors, not members of the board, as auditors for that year. The auditors shall, at the end of each year, examine the treasurer's financial report and all accounts, vouchers and documents relating thereto, and shall report thereon to the annual general meeting. The treasurer's annual financial report to be made up to the 31st December in each year.

8. No new law, or repeal or alteration of these bye-laws, shall be entertained unless one month's previous notice has been given in committee, or by a requisition calling a special meeting of contributors, and the same shall not become valid unless approved of at a special general meeting of contributors called for that purpose.

9. It shall be competent at any time for three members of committee, or any 30 contributors by writing under their hands, to request the president to summon a special meeting of contributors—the occasion of calling such meeting being stated in the requisition; and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting except that for which it shall have been summoned; such meeting to be advertised in one or more local newspapers at least one clear week before the day of meeting.

GOVERNORS AND CONTRIBUTORS.

10. That every benefactor of £20 and upwards be eligible for life to be a member of committee, and have the privilege of recommending, in each year, two in-patients and four out-patients.

11. That a subscription of £1 a year constitute a contributor, who shall be allowed the privilege of recommending one in-door or two out-door patients annually. He shall be qualified to be elected a member of the board of management, and to vote at any special or annual general meeting of contributors, and for every additional £1 he may subscribe he shall be privileged to recommend one in-door or two out-door patients, and that these privileges continue in force for twelve months from the date of his contribution. But no new contributor shall be entitled to recommend a patient or vote at the annual or special meeting until fourteen days after the date of payment of his subscription.

12. Every benefactor of £10, or contributor of £1 per annum, shall be entitled to one vote; every benefactor of £20, or contributor of £3 per annum, shall be entitled to two votes; and every benefactor of £50, or contributor of £5 and upwards per annum, shall be entitled to three votes at all general and special meetings of contributors.

13. Every firm or partnership becoming contributors shall exercise their privilege through one member of the same only.

14. No salaried officer in the pay of the institution shall be eligible to be a member of committee or vote at the annual or special meetings.

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT.

15. The committee of management shall direct the general business of the institution, shall frame bye-laws for its internal regulations, the same not being contrary to the general rules, and appoint and discharge all paid officers and servants of the institution. They shall meet on the first Thursday in every month, and on such other days as they may appoint. The chairman of committee, in case the votes are equal, shall have an additional or casting vote.

16. The committee of management shall choose from among themselves a visiting committee of two, to be elected monthly, who shall meet on such days and at such hour in each week as they may appoint; and shall audit the house accounts, engage and discharge servants, and to regulate the internal management of the institution.

17. All accounts for payment shall be passed by the committee and signed by the chairman of the meeting.

18. No member of the board of management shall be allowed, either directly or indirectly, to enter into or derive any benefit from any contract with or for the hospital.

19. Any member of the "ordinary" committee neglecting his duty for four consecutive monthly meetings, without reasonable cause, shall cease to be a member of the committee, and another officer appointed in his stead.

TREASURER.

20. All monies received on account of the hospital shall be paid to the treasurer, and appropriated by him to the purpose of the institution, under the direction of the committee of management.

21. Previous to making any payment, the treasurer shall receive a warrant of the committee of management authorizing such payment, which shall be signed by the president or vice-president, and countersigned by the secretary.

SECRETARY.

22. The secretary shall keep the minutes and records of the institution, conduct the correspondence, call all meetings, and bring all business before the same and carry out their resolutions.

23. He shall by advertisement fourteen days previous to the meeting convene the annual general meeting in the month of January.

24. He shall convene special meetings when directed by the committee of management, and he shall give three days notice to the members of the committee of each monthly or special committee meeting.

25. He shall compile all reports that may be ordered by the committee, fill up all cheques, and perform the clerical duties connected with the office.

26. He shall have charge of the common seal of the corporation, but shall not affix the seal to any deed or other instrument except by order of the board of management.

COLLECTOR.

27. He shall canvass the district for subscriptions; he shall give a receipt for every sum he receives and keep a counter-part of such receipt; he shall hand over to the treasurer in the first week of every month the monies received by him during the preceding month; he shall also lay before the committee every month a statement of the contributions received during the last month; and that he find security satisfactory to the committee.

STOREKEEPER.

28. He shall receive and weigh previous to taking delivery of the stores, and shall weigh out the supplies, &c., according to the dietary scale. He shall in the month of December, in every year, assist the secretary in taking stock of the household property of the institution, medicines and surgical instruments excepted, and shall enter the same in the stock-book of the institution.

HONORARY MEDICAL OFFICERS.

29. The attendance of honorary medical officers shall be once a week for one month in rotation, and at such times as they may find it convenient, but in cases of emergency all may be requested to attend; the arrangement of the rotation of duty to be left to themselves.

30. The honorary medical officers shall have access to the institution at all times, irrespective of rotation of duty.

31. The honorary medical officers shall not interfere with the admission or discharge of patients.

32. No capital operation shall be performed without a previous consultation of the medical staff, except in cases of emergency, and they shall regularly consult in all cases of importance or protracted continuances in the house.

RESIDENT SURGEON.

33. The resident medical officer shall possess the certificate of qualification of the Medical Board of Victoria.

34. He shall live in the hospital and shall not be absent for more than three hours at any time without the consent of the visiting committee.

35. He shall at once report to the visiting committee any patient who may be disorderly. He shall make a special report of every patient who may have been two months in the hospital, and he shall report any case that may be considered incurable by the medical staff, to be dealt with as the committee see fit.

36. He shall have the immediate superintendence of the wardsmen, nurses, and servants, and direct them in their duties. He shall preserve order, sobriety, and in cases of insubordination or gross default of duty on the part of any nurse or wardman, he may discharge or suspend such servant, with the sanction of the visiting committee; and, if necessary, he may, provisionally, hire a substitute for such servant so discharged or suspended, and he shall report his having done so, with the cause of such discharge or suspension, to the committee of management at their next meeting.

37. He shall have the charge of and be accountable for the medicines, medical instruments, furniture, utensils, and stores in the hospital, and shall cause an inventory of the same to be made in a book to be kept for that purpose, in which shall regularly be entered the receipt, cost, issue, loss or breakage of each article; and he shall, on the last day of the month of March, June, September, and December of each year, cause to be prepared and submitted to the committee of management a list of medicines, medical instruments, furniture, utensils, and stores required for his department during the ensuing quarters.

38. He shall enter regularly in the medical registry the name of the patients as they are admitted and discharged, and note, if required, the nature and history of their diseases whilst in the hospital, and shall have such medical registry under the different heads, ready at all times for the inspection of the visiting committee.

39. He shall give all requisite information to the honorary medical officers on their visits to the hospital, and shall enter all prescriptions in a book to be kept for that purpose.

40. He shall also visit each patient every morning and evening, or oftener if necessary, and inquire if the treatment prescribed has been attended to.

41. He shall on his visits to the wards examine their condition with respect to cleanliness, temperature, and ventilation.

42. He shall affix to the bed of each patient his name, age, disease, religion, the date of his admission, how or by whose recommendation admitted, and the diet ordered by the medical officer, and as far as possible, the data required by the deputy registrar of the district in virtue of his office, and the name of the honorary medical officer by whom attended. Should any patient have any complaint to prefer, he shall enter the same in the patient complaint-book immediately, in the presence of the wardman or nurse, of the ward, and shall lay such book before the visiting committee at each meeting.

43. He shall perform all the minor operations of surgery and the *post mortem* examinations not personally performed by the physicians or surgeons, and shall keep the registry of the dead house.

44. In the absence of the physicians or surgeons in all cases of emergency, he shall cause immediate notice of such emergency to be given to them, being authorized in the mean time to act to the best of his judgment, avoiding, as far as possible any unnecessary interference with the duties of those officers.

45. He shall give due notice to the honorary officers when a consultation is to be held, or when an operation is to be performed.

46. He shall carefully dispense the medicines prescribed, and write legibly the name of the patient on each bottle, and the manner in which the medicines are to be administered; and

shall keep a proper supply of medicines and utensils ready in cases of emergency.

47. He shall inspect the diet of the patients when necessary, and see that it is properly cooked and prepared and such as is ordered; and that the patients partake of no food, liquor, or medicine except that prescribed, and that the responsibility of the quantity and quality of the provisions supplied to the hospital and issued to the patients rests with the house surgeon.

48. He shall, in the month of December in every year, take stock of all the medicines and surgical instruments in the possession of the institution, and hand the list over to the secretary to be entered into the stock-book of the institution.

PATIENTS.

49. All applicants for admission must be provided with a recommendation ticket; the fitness of the applicant to be determined by the surgeon.

50. All patients shall be required to pay the actual expense of their maintenance as far as circumstances may enable them; and all property found on deceased patients shall be appropriated to the defraying of the expense of their maintenance and burial, and the residue (if any) to be handed to their legal representative.

51. Severe accidents and cases of decided emergency may be admitted at any time by the visiting committee, one of the honorary medical officers, or house surgeon.

52. No pregnant female for the purpose of confinement, no child under five years of age, no person insane or laboring under *deltirium tremens*, or syphilis, or infectious disorder, or subject to epilepsy; or any one who, in the opinion of the examining physician or surgeon, might receive equal benefit as an out-door patient, shall be admitted into the hospital.

53. Patients shall conduct themselves orderly, and shall strictly observe all the directions of the honorary medical officers, resident surgeon, house steward, wardsmen, and nurses.

54. They shall take their medicines at the time directed, and they shall not take any other medicines than those prescribed; and they shall not conceal nor put away any portion of the medicines or diet administered to themselves.

55. No one shall leave his or her ward and go into another ward or department, nor leave the house, nor remain out for a longer time than is granted, nor shall introduce visitors, nor receive medicines, victuals, liquor, or tobacco, or anything without the express leave of the resident surgeon.

56. They shall not gamble, or smoke, or spit on the floor, nor deface or injure any part of the ward, nor any furniture, bedding, or clothing therein; nor sing, blaspheme, nor use rude or indecent language, on pain of dismissal.

57. No patient shall give reward or gratuity to any of the wardsmen, nurses, or any of the other servants.

58. Any patient having any cause of complaint shall make the same known to the resident surgeon, whose duty it shall be to enter such complaint immediately, in the presence of the nurse or wardman of the ward, in a book kept for that purpose, which book shall be laid before the visiting committee at each meeting.

59. Patients considered by the resident surgeon sufficiently convalescent to be able to assist in the work of the institution, may, at the discretion of the resident surgeon, be so employed.

60. Patients shall not sit up after Eight o'clock in the winter, or after Nine o'clock in the summer; and all patients considered by the resident surgeon able to do so shall rise at Seven o'clock in the summer, and before Eight o'clock in the winter.

OUT-PATIENTS.

61. Out-patients holding a ticket of recommendation will receive out-door relief every morning between the hours of Ten and Twelve o'clock (Sundays excepted), except in cases of emergency.

62. Each out-door patient, having a recommendation from a subscriber will be entitled to receive medical relief for six weeks from the date of first advice, but should the disease from which the person is suffering require more than six weeks' attendance it will be necessary to obtain another ticket of recommendation.

63. Any person or persons imposing on the charity of the institution will render themselves liable to prosecution.

64. Ministers of religion shall have access to sick persons of their respective denominations, at such times as shall be appointed by the committee; and any minister may attend any patient at any time when requested by such patient; and that in cases of death of any patient, a notice shall be forwarded to the clergyman of the denomination the deceased patient is supposed to belong, stating the hour of burial.

VISITORS.

65. That Sunday, Monday, and Friday in each week, between the hours from Two to Five o'clock p.m., be the days and hours set apart for persons desirous of visiting the hospital, or any patient; but in cases of extreme danger, the friends of such patient may obtain admission to the hospital by an order signed by a member of the committee, or permission of the resident surgeon.
