CUTTING OR REMOVING TIMBER, ETC., IN OR FROM CERTAIN LANDS IN THE PARISH OF BECKWORTH PROHIBITED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Brigadier-General GEORGE JACKSON CAREY, Companion of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Commanding Her Majesty's Troops in the Australian Colonies, and Officer administering the Government of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted that notwithstanding anything therein before contained the Governor in Council may by Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut or remove live or dead timber or bark, or stone or gravel, from such portions of Crown lands as are named in such Proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of the third part of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Officer administering the Government of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut or remove live or dead timber or bark, from the portion of Crown lands hereinafter named and described, viz.:—One thousand and sixty acres, more or less, county of Talbot: Commencing on the west side of the road forming the west boundary of section 4, in the parish of Clunes, at a point thereon bearing west one chain from the north-west angle of allotment 8 of the said section; bounded thence by a line bearing west to the east side of the road forming the east

boundary of allotment 7, in the parish of Beckworth; thence by that road bearing south seventy-six chains, more or less, to the north-west angle of lands leased under the 42nd section of *The Amending Land Act 1865*; thence by those lands bearing east ten chains, south twenty chains, east forty-one chains, and south twenty chains, to the north side of the road forming the north boundary of allotment 123, in the parish of Glendaruel; thence by that road bearing east to the first-named road; and thence by that road bearing north to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(66.N.5245.)

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this sixteenth day of July, in the year of our Lord, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, and in the thirtieth year of Her Majesty's reign.

ACCOUNTS AND FEES IN THE OFFICE OF TITLES.

HIS Excellency the Officer administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, has approved of the subjoined Regulations under Act 22 Vict. No. 86, section 2, relating to Accounts and the Collection of Fees in the Office of Titles, viz.:

1. The Registrar of Titles is hereby appointed Collector of Imposts; and it will be his duty in such capacity to collect, at the Office of Titles, all sums of money receivable under the provisions of the Transfer of Land Statute on account of the consolidated revenue, as well as all contributions to the assurance fund, and in both cases to pay the same to the receiver of revenue at Melbourne, who, for the purposes of the Statute, shall act for and on behalf of the Treasurer of Victoria.

2. In the collection of such monies the registrar will be assisted by a fee clerk, and no other officer of the department is on any pretence to collect any monies for the department; and, generally, no officer of the department is to transact business with the office as agent for another person (save as mentioned in Regulation 13).

3. The books of account to be kept are receipt-books, a fee-book, and a cash-book.

4. The registrar is not to receive fees from the public in the office, but the fee clerk is in the first instance to receive all fees paid at the office, and is to issue fee-tickets from the receipt-books; he is also to keep the fee-book, which he is to make up daily from the counterparts, and to balance his cash daily in time for the bank.

5. The registrar is to keep the cash-book.

6. Where, as in the case of applications to bring land under the Act, the fees have first to be estimated before being received by the fee clerk, the duty is to be performed by the registrar, who is to state on a printed slip the fees to be paid, and it will be the fee clerk's duty to collect the fees so estimated.

7. The business for which fees are paid is to be transacted by the assistant registrar or registrars, by the clerk in charge of the registration of crown grants, or other officer not allowed to receive fees. It will be the express duty of such officers to require the fee-tickets before transacting the business, to see that the fee-tickets represent the proper fees (reporting immediately to the registrar if any error has occurred), and to sort the fee-tickets at 2.30 p.m., compare them with the fee clerk's counterparts, and hand them to the registrar.

8. On the same day, in time for the bank, the registrar is to compare the fee-tickets with the fee-book, as made up by the fee clerk, and to check the additions of the fee-book, setting down the amount of the day's collections for fees and for the assurance fund respectively in one sum in the cash-book. The fee-tickets are then to be returned to the various branches of the office as vouchers for the work done.

9. The fee clerk is to pay the amount of the day's collections so checked into the bank on the same day, and immediately afterwards to produce to the registrar a bank-slip marked, which the registrar is to retain. The banking account is to be in the name of the registrar, as collector of impost.

10. In the absence, through illness or on leave, of the registrar or fee clerk, the duty of the former is to be performed by an assistant registrar, and of the latter by some officer other than the registrar or assistant registrar.

11. The registrar is to make arrangements so that all public letters received at the office containing money be opened by himself; and it will be his duty to pay monies so received forthwith to the fee clerk, obtaining the usual fee-ticket, and presenting it to that branch of the office where the business has to be transacted for which the fees are remitted.

12. Should remittances be received by any other officer of the department in payment of fees, &c., the same are to be forthwith handed to the registrar, and to be dealt with by him in the same manner as if the fees had been received in a public letter. In such cases, however, a printed circular should be used, acknowledging the fees, &c., and acquainting the remitter, for future guidance, that such monies should be forwarded to the registrar only.

13. The hours for the receipt of fees, &c., are to be from 9.30 a.m. to 2.30 p.m.

Scarlatina exists in Boroondara, but no fatal cases are recorded. Scarlat fever is prevalent at Brunswick, and two deaths resulted therefrom during the past week. Eleven out of the nineteen deaths registered at South Melbourne occurred in public institutions. North Melbourne is reported as in a remarkably healthy condition; and the districts generally are described most favorably both in regard to sickness and mortality.

INFANTICIDE.

FIFTY POUNDS REWARD.

WHEREAS on Wednesday, the 27th of June last, the Body of a Female Child was found in a water-course running from William's road to Gardiner's Creek road, Prahran, sewn up in pieces of old bed-ticking and sacking, and weighted with half a brick and a piece of bluestone: And whereas the death of the deceased appeared to have taken place about two days previously to the finding of the body, and to have resulted from suffocation, either from drowning or other cause, previous to its being placed where it was found: And whereas at an inquest held over the said body, the jury returned a verdict of wilful murder against some person or persons unknown: Notice is hereby given that a Reward of Fifty pounds will be paid by the Government for such information as will lead to the conviction of the person or persons guilty of causing the death of the deceased.

DRAINAGE BYE-LAW.

At a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Sandhurst begun and holden at Sandhurst, in the said district, on the nineteenth (19th) day of June, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-six (1866), it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

1. The owner or occupier of any machine which is employed in draining water from any line of reef may claim drainage rates from adjacent claimholders and lessees, by giving fourteen days' notice of his intention so to do in any newspaper circulating in the division in which such line of reef is situated, and also to the warden of the division; and in the event of no valid objection being raised, such claimant shall be entitled to a drainage area (as defined by this bye-law), and shall be entitled to all drainage rates derivable from the same for a period of six months.

2. Should the right to drainage rates of any such claimant as aforesaid be objected to by any other machine-owner, or should two or more machine-owners claim drainage rates from the same portion of any line of reef, or in the same area, the drainage rates to be given to the machine-owner whose machine drains the most effectually.

3. The lineal extent of any drainage area awarded under this bye-law shall not exceed 1,500 yards—750 yards on each side of drainer's engine-shaft—the same to be measured along the course which the reef is known or supposed to traverse, starting from the engine-shaft, by a width of 100 yards on each side of said known or supposed line. And if it can be shown that any claim or gold-mining lease outside the end boundaries of any such drainage area is drained, and that the owners of such claims or leases are working below the datum water-level, they shall be liable to pay drainage rates, the same as if their claims or leases were included within the limits thereof.

4. The owner or lessee of any quartz claim or gold-mining lease which is being worked below the datum water-level shall pay the sum of threepence per lineal yard per week, and the owner of any claim exempted from the labor basis shall, if the same be situated in any drainage area, pay to the clerk of the mining board, or such other person as may be appointed, the sum of twopence per lineal yard per week during the whole period of exemption, whether the working in such claim as aforesaid be down below datum water-level or not; and the owner of any gold-mining lease, in which mining is not being carried on, shall, if the same be situated within a drainage area, pay as aforesaid the sum of twopence per lineal yard per week.

5. The owner of any claim or gold-mining lease which is being worked above the datum water-level, and no work being carried on below said level, shall be exempted from paying any drainage rates. And any claim or gold-mining lease shall be deemed at work below the datum water-level in which work shall have been done below said water-level at any time during the month for which a drainage rate is claimed.

6. The owner of any claim or gold-mining lease situated within any drainage area, which has been sunk to water, and in which sinking cannot be continued, may give notice to the drainer that he requires further drainage, and that the engine-shaft must be sunk deeper, or that a cross-cut must be driven in order to improve the drainage; and should the drainer proceed to execute such work, then such owner shall pay twopence per lineal yard per week, until sinking can be and is resumed, and after that, threepence per lineal yard per week; but should the

drainor refuse to cross-cut or sink (as the case may be) then such owner to be exempted from paying any drainage rate unless he continues to work his claim or gold-mining lease below the datum water-level.

7. The owner of any claim or gold-mining lease within any drainage area who is compelled and who does, in order to effect complete drainage, employ a horse-whip, whip, or steam-engine every day to draw water from such claim or lease shall be exempted from paying drainage rates on account of such claim or lease.

8. Any drainor to whom a drainage area has been granted on any line of reef, and who is receiving drainage rates therefrom, shall, should it be his intention to discontinue drainage operations, give at least three months' notice to the drainees of his intention so to do; in the event of such notice not being given, said drainor shall be held liable for any damage that may accrue to the claims or leases of the drainees through any more sudden stoppage of the drainage machinery.

9. No drainor shall be held liable for any damage caused to any claim or gold-mining lease through the sudden stoppage of his machinery, if it can be shown that such stoppage was caused by an accident to the machinery, provided however that the necessary repairs are made and drainage resumed with the utmost despatch by the said drainor.

10. All rates imposed under this bye-law shall be come due once a month, and shall be paid to the clerk of the Sandhurst mining board, or to such other person as may from time to time be appointed to receive or collect the sums on his behalf.

11. In the event of any claim or gold-mining lease being so situated on the side line of any drainage area that the whole extent of such claim or lease is not included within the drainage area, they shall be deemed to be included for all the purposes of this bye-law; provided the underground workings or working shafts are within the said drainage area.

12. Whenever a break may occur in any claim or lease on a line of reef, obstructing the drainage of claims beyond, it shall be lawful for the drainors or the holders of claims adjoining, to sink or drive in any such claim or lease for the purpose of removing such obstruction, provided such work shall be perfectly secured as not to damage the claim or lease so worked, and no claim-owner or lease-owner may object to such work being done in his claim or lease.

13. All drainage areas shall be marked at each corner by a substantial post, standing at least three feet above the surface of the ground, and there shall also be a line of posts of the same height marking the centre of such area, at distances of one hundred yards apart, and following the line or supposed line of reef, and the drainor or drainors shall at all times keep such posts standing and in good order.

14. Should the drainor or drainors of any drainage area at any time wish to dispose of his or their right to or interest in any part of same, it shall be competent for him or them to transfer such right or interest to any person or persons, upon application to the registrar of the division in which such machinery may be situated, and upon payment to the registrar of a fee of two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.); and such registrar shall give to the transferee a ticket in the form of schedule one (I), bearing the names of the transferor and transferee, and the date and other particulars of the transfer; and shall keep a duplicate of such form in the office; and shall enter the full particulars of such transfer in a book to be kept for that purpose, which book shall at all times be kept in good preservation, as evidence in case of dispute thereafter; and this clause also provides, that such transferee shall be entitled to enjoy all the privileges enjoyed by the transferor under this bye-law, but shall, nevertheless, be subject to all and every the restrictions and obligations imposed upon drainors, as regards the efficient drainage of the area within which such machine is situated.

15. All monies received by the mining board as rates under this bye-law shall, after deducting the costs incurred in imposing and collecting the same, be handed over to the drainors entitled to receive it at least once every month.

16. Any drainor to whom a drainage area has been granted shall notify the same to the clerk of the mining board, accompanied with a list of the owners of the claims and leases from which he claims drainage rates under this bye-law; and the clerk shall thereupon serve or cause to be served upon the respective owners thereof a notice setting forth the amount of drainage rate imposed upon any such claim or gold-mining lease, and the rate so notified shall be the rate levied, charged or claimed on account of any such claim or lease, unless the same be varied or set aside on appeal as provided for in section 75 of *The Mining Statute 1865*.
