By His Excellency Brigadier-General GEORGE JACKSON CARRY, Companion of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Companion ling Her Majesty's troops in the Australian Colonies, and Officer administering the Government of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Amending Land Act 1865 it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or reproclaimed, and may from time to time reproclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of The Land Act 1862 and the now reciting Act.
