PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Brigadier-General **GEORGE JACKSON CAREY**, Companion of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Commanding Her Majesty's troops in the Australian Colonies, and Officer administering the Government of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or reproclaimed, and may from time to time reproclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, the Officer administering the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter the temporary common for the use of selectors and lessees in the agricultural area of Westgarth, described in a Proclamation bearing date the fourteenth day of May, 1866, by taking therefrom allotments 37, 38, and 39, in the parish of Langi Logan, and substituting instead thereof allotments 55, 56, and 57, in the said parish.—(66.N.8350.)
