REGULATIONS RELATING TO GOLD MINING LEASES UNDER "THE MINING STATUTE 1865."

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the sixth day of August, 1866.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Officer administering the Government in Council.

IN pursuance of the provisions of *The Mining Statute 1865*, and in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, His Excellency the Officer administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, has altered the regulations made on the nineteenth day of March in the present year, relating to Gold-mining Leases in manner hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

1. In the second clause of the Regulations, prescribing the time when the applicant shall advertise a notice, in the form of Schedule A, for the words "seven days at least previously to the day of making his application," shall be read "six days at least previously to the day of making his application."

2. In the form of lease, Schedule G., in the last recited proviso, for the words "the terms hereby granted shall thereupon cease determine and be void, anything herein contained to the contrary thereof notwithstanding," shall be read "the term hereby granted shall henceforth cease determine and be absolutely void, both at law and in equity, anything herein contained to the contrary thereof notwithstanding."

And the Honorable John Macgregor, Her Majesty's Minister of Mines for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

TEMPORARY COMMONS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Brigadier-General GEORGE JACKSON CAREY, Companion of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Commanding Her Majesty's troops in the Australian Colonies, and Officer administering the Government of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted that when any Crown land remains unsold within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land a farmers' common; when one-eighth part of any agricultural area has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim any unselected and unleased portion of such agricultural area, not exceeding twice the quantity so selected and leased, to be a temporary common for the use of such selectors and lessees: Now therefore I, the Officer administering the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the areas hereinafter mentioned to be Temporary Commons for the use of selectors and lessees in the agricultural areas of Callawadda, Dunneworthy, Narree-worran, and Rathireland respectively, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

CALLAWADDA TEMPORARY COMMON.—The allotments of land hereinafter enumerated, comprising an area of 248 acres, more or less, are hereby proclaimed a Temporary Common for the use of selectors and lessees in the agricultural area of Callawadda, viz.:—Parish of Callawadda, allotments 126a, 126b, 127a, 127b, 128a, 128b, 147a, and 147b.—(66.M.8974.)

DUNNEWORTHY TEMPORARY COMMON.—The allotments and piece of land hereinafter enumerated, comprising an area of 1940 acres, more or less, are hereby proclaimed a Temporary Common for the use of selectors and lessees in the agricultural area of Dunneworthy, viz.:—Parish of Dunneworthy, allotments 52, 78, 79, 80, 81, 82, 89, 90, and the reserve adjoining allotment 67 on the south-west.—(66.M.9637.)

NARREE-WORRAN TEMPORARY COMMON.—The allotments of land hereinafter enumerated, comprising an area of 3000 acres, more or less, are hereby proclaimed a Temporary Common for the use of selectors and lessees in the agricultural area of Narree-worran, viz.:—Parish of Scoresby, allotments 32, 33, 39, 40, 41, 42, 44, and 46. Parish of Narree-worran, allotments 45, 46, and 49.—(66.M.8893.)

RATHIRELAND TEMPORARY COMMON.—The allotments of land hereinafter enumerated, comprising an area of 344 acres, more or less, are hereby proclaimed a Temporary Common for the use of selectors and lessees in the agricultural area of Rathireland, viz.:—Parish of Kapong, allotments 8b and 4b of section 28. Parish of Bootahpool, allotment 1 of section 1.—(66.M.8664.)

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Brigadier-General GEORGE JACKSON CAREY, Companion of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Commanding Her Majesty's Troops in the Australian Colonies, and Officer administering the Government of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now recited Act: Now therefore I, the Officer administering the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase the common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

CAMPBELL'S DIGGINGS GOLD-FIELD COMMON, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 28th day of January, 1861, is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown lands within the boundaries hereinafter described, viz.: Commencing at a point on the track from Stawell to Moyston, the said point being on the prolongation northward of the west boundary of the existing common; thence by a line and the said boundary of that common bearing south three and a quarter miles, more or less, to a point on George's Creek; thence by that creek bearing westerly to a point thereon distant in a direct line forty-eight chains, more or less, from the last-named point; thence by lines bearing north sixty chains, N. 38° W. three miles seventy-two chains, north one mile sixty chains, and east two miles, more or less, to the aforesaid track from Stawell to Moyston; and thence by that track bearing south-easterly to the point of commencement. Area 6,400 acres, more or less, as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(G6.N.8176.)

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

Light at the Entrance of the River Yarra.

Masters of vessels, pilots, and others navigating the River Yarra, are hereby informed that, on and after the fifteenth instant, from sunset to sunrise, three fixed lights, each twenty feet above high water level, will be exhibited near the entrance of the River Yarra, viz., one red light on the outer Black Dolphin, one green light on the Elbow Beacon, one light on the Williamstown Beach; the latter so masked as only to show red up the first reach of the river, remainder white.

Sailing Directions.—Before entering the Yarra, open the green light a little north of the red one, and when nearing the green light port and bring it and the shore red light in one, which marks lead past the Shell bank Dolphin.

Bound Out.—When passing the Shell bank Dolphin, bring the green and shore red light in one until close to the former, when starboard and haul gradually out towards the Dolphin red light.

1. *Repeal of former Bye-law.*—The bye-law of the said union, dated the 6th day of October, 1865, for fixing the amount of fees to be paid to the inspector for examining and comparing weights and measures within the said union shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

2. *Fees for Comparisons.*—The following fees shall be paid to the inspector of weights and measures for the time being for the said union (in lieu of those mentioned in the said repealed bye-law) for comparing any weights, measures, scales, balances, steelyards, beams, or other weighing-machines, with the "authorized copies" of the standard weights and measures in his possession, according to the said Act, namely:—

YARRAM-YARRAM FARMERS' COMMON.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE YARRAM-YARRAM FARMERS' COMMON, WITHIN THE SHIRE OF ALBERTON.

EVERY person resident within the parish of Yarram-yarram shall be entitled to depasture horses, cattle, or sheep on the said common, according to the following scale, viz.:

One head of cattle to each acre, and one horse or four sheep to every two acres owned or tenanted by him.

2. All persons entitled to and applying for a license to depasture any animals on the common must do so in form of schedule A hereto annexed.

3. All animals licensed to depasture on the common shall be delivered to the herdsman at the yard, or such place as the managers shall appoint, and (after the fees are paid) be branded with the brand of the common by the herdsman, with the assistance of their respective owners, previous to being put on the common.

4. All dead or diseased cattle, &c., found on the common, the owners of which neglect or refuse to remove the same within twenty-four hours after receiving notice from the managers or herdsman, shall be burned or removed, and the owners be liable to the penalties mentioned in clause 129 of *The Land Act 1862*.

5. All entire horses or bull calves, over six months old, found running on the common shall be impounded.

6. All holders of stock depasturing on the common shall muster them at a time and place appointed by the managers or herdsman, of which due notice shall be given them, for the purpose of branding such stock as may require to be branded with the brand of the common.

7. All licenses issued by the managers shall be in form of schedule B hereto annexed.

8. The licenses shall date from the 1st January, 1st April, 1st July, and 1st October in each year.

9. The fees chargeable on animals licensed shall be as follows, viz.:

For each horse	...	s. d.

to be paid quarterly in advance. Calves over six months old, and foals over twelve months old, to be paid for as cattle and horses respectively.

10. The managers or herdsman will not be responsible for any stock that may be depastured on the common.

11. All stock found on the common without being duly licensed to run thereon, and all stock on which the license fees are not paid within seven days after time when due will be impounded.

12. All disputes which may arise between the herdsman and the commoners must be referred to the managers, whose decision shall be final.

13. No person will be allowed to disturb, drive, or in any way interfere with any stock on the common after the 1st August, 1866, nor must any cattle or horses be removed without the herdsman's knowledge or presence, whether the same be legally depasturing or not.

14. Should the managers at any time consider the herdsman incompetent or negligent of his duties, they may remove or discharge him forthwith, or after one week's notice, as the exigency of the case may require.

15. A record to be kept by the managers or herdsman showing the number and description of stock, and the amount paid in respect thereof.

16. Special licenses may be granted by the managers when considered necessary, and with the consent of the council.

17. The managers to meet at least once every month, to transact any business that may come before them.

18. The managers to hand in to the secretary of the shire, on the second Wednesday of October in each year, the various books of account kept by them in respect of the common, together with a statement of the receipts and expenditure for the past year, for the purpose of being audited by the shire auditors.

19. The managers shall furnish such security as the council may determine.

20. All moneys received by the managers for licenses, &c., to be paid to the treasurer of the shire within one month after collection of the same.

21. Any person infringing any of the above rules will be liable to a penalty of Five pounds for the first, and Twenty pounds for every subsequent offence, as provided for in the 129th clause of *The Land Act 1862*.
