Notice to Mariners.

MOBETON BAY—BRISBANE RIVER.

ON and after this date a light will be exhibited from Lytton, which will be visible from the beacon immediately above Luggage Point, eastward, to the Fishermen Islands. Vessels passing up the river should keep Luggage Point within two ships' lengths, until the small gap through the mangroves, above the point, is opened; they should then haul up and steer direct for the light at Lytton, until the large black buoy off the boat channel is sighted, after passing which they can shape a course up the river, as usual.

Vessels steering up the river, towards Lytton, will, while keeping this light in sight, be clear of the bank and the two red buoys on the west side of the channel.

SOUTH AUSTRALIA.

Notice to Mariners.

PORT WILLUNGA, GULF ST. VINCENT.

Buoy.—Notice is hereby given, that a large red buoy of the new construction has been placed outside the edge of the reef, extending to the westward of Snapper Point, the southern horn of the bay, in which lies Port Willunga.

Description and position.—The buoy is of pyramidal shape, with a round top, and may be seen at a distance of four (4) miles in clear weather. It is moored in ten and a half (10½) fathoms at low-water, immediately beyond the edge of the reef, and affords an excellent guide for clearing the rocky and uneven ground lying to the S.S.W. of the reef.

Caution in the event of buoy shifting.—In the event of any accident happening to the buoy, the reef may be cleared by keeping the inn close to the beach, to the northward of the jetty, twice its own breadth open to the northward of the end of the jetty. The buoy is placed inside this mark.

Moorings removed.—The moorings which were laid down in 1855 have been removed; ships will therefore have to depend on their own anchors. The holding ground is good anywhere outside the four-fathom line off the jetty.

Anchorage.—The anchorage is exposed to all winds from N.W. to S.W. round by west; and at times a heavy sea rolls in, rendering ships at anchor very uneasy, and, unless well found in ground-tackle, in an unsafe position.

Caution in bad weather.—Shelter in Eastern Cove, Kangaroo Island.—It is therefore recommended, on the approach of a N.W. gale which is indicated by a falling barometer, and the wind freshening from the northward, with a cloudy sky—that shelter should be sought in Eastern Cove, Kangaroo Island, where a ship may anchor in perfect safety, according to draft of water, and remain until the wind shifts to the southward, when she will have a fair wind to return to Port Willunga to complete her loading.

Notice to Mariners.

GULF ST. VINCENT—PORT WAKEFIELD.

THE following sailing directions and information are published for the guidance of commanders of ships visiting Port Wakefield.

(The bearings are magnetic; variation about 80° E. Soundings refer to low water, spring tides.)

Buoy on the Long Spit.—From the light-ship off the Port Adelaide outer bar, steer N.W. ¼ W., making allowance for tide and leeway, according to circumstances. Keep this course for twenty-two (22) miles to sight a large red buoy with a pyramidal top, surmounted by a ball. This buoy marks the S.W. extremity of the Long Spit, extending to the westward from the low sandy shore to the northward, and in the vicinity of the Gawler River.

Long Spit.—This extensive shoal extends for twenty (20) miles a north-westerly direction from the Port Gawler Flats, lying to the northward of the channel into Port Adelaide.

Position of buoy.—The buoy at the S.W. and W. extremity of the shoal is placed in nineteen (19) feet at low-water spring tides in lat. 34° 32' S., long. 138° 10' 15", with the south summit of the Hummock Range of hills at the head of the Gulf bearing N. 11° W. and Mount Lofty S. 33° E. With these bearings commanders of vessels will be able to place the position of the buoy on their own charts.

Hummock Range.—The following sketch of the Hummock Range will enable commanders of vessels to distinguish this mark:—



Hummock Range, N. by W. ¼ W.; distance 30 miles from the buoy on the Long Spit.

Coast line.—The coast line on the east side is distant from the buoy about six (6) miles, the low scrub inside the sandy beach being just visible from the deck of a small vessel; but this offers no guide, as, during the summer, and at times in winter, the coast line is much affected by refraction.

From the buoy to the westward the water deepens rapidly to six (6) fathoms, until a depth of ten (10) fathoms is attained in the middle of the Gulf.

The water inside the buoy—or from E.S.E. to N.N.E. round by E.—shoals somewhat rapidly to two and a half (2½) fathoms; but very quickly after that depth is attained.

Caution in thick weather.—In thick weather, or in the middle of a summer day, when the sun is ahead, and objects much affected by refraction, the lead should be carefully attended to when steering to make the buoy.

Caution.—By maintaining a depth of five (5) fathoms the edge of the Long Spit may be avoided and the buoy sighted.

Buoy on the Bald Hill Spit.—Having brought the buoy to bear N.E. distant two (2) miles, steer N.W. by N. ¼ N., for twelve and a half (12½) miles, until the south summit of the Hummocks are seen bearing N., when alter the course to N. for four (4) miles, until the land at the head of the Gulf is raised above the horizon, and a bald hill on the east side, inside Sandy Point, distinguished; then alter the course to N.N.E., keeping in not less than four and a half (4½) fathoms, until a large red buoy, with a pyramidal top and triangular head is observed. Steer then to keep the buoy to the eastward at a distance of two (2) cables length; then alter the course to N.

Position of buoy.—This buoy is placed on the outer extremity of the Shoal Spit, stretching out to the westward of Sandy Point, or what is termed the "Bald Hill Spit." The buoy is placed in seventeen (17) feet, at low-water, and it offers an excellent guide for entering the anchorage of Port Wakefield.

Caution.—Before getting up to the buoy, sail should be taken in, and the ship got ready for anchoring.

Position for anchoring.—Having brought the largest store in the township of Port Wakefield to bear N.N.E. ¼ E., or the buoy S.E. ¼ E., and the mangrove bushes on Sandy Point to between E.S.E. and S.E. by E. ¼ E., anchor in four (4) fathoms at low-water. There will be room to swing in this berth, but not space to beat out of it without going into eighteen (18) feet at low-water.

Beating up the Gulf.—In making a passage from the light-ship to Port Wakefield against head winds, make the first board to the westward, and stand on that tack—say west—for about sixteen (16) miles, taking care not to come under eight (8) fathoms, so as to avoid the shoal water on the Orontes Bank; then, going about, endeavor to work between two shoals—viz., the Orontes Bank and the Long Spit—but in drawing to the northward do not fail to sight the buoy on the latter, danger, as it forms an excellent guide for enabling a commander of a ship to know when he is to the northward of the Orontes Bank.

Western coast may be approached.—Being off the buoy, and consequently to the northward of the Orontes Bank, the western coast may be safely approached, making long boards from five fathoms outside the Long Spit, on the east side, to within a mile of the western shore.

On nearing Sandy Point, the red buoy off the Bald Hill Spit should be passed, as previously directed, when short tacks must be made, taking care not to bring the buoy to bear to the southward of S. by E., and not standing to the westward into less than three and a half (3½) fathoms, anchoring in the space before indicated.

Small vessels.—Position for anchoring.—Small vessels may stand towards the landing-place, observing that the water shoals very rapidly from three (3) fathoms in some places; but even should a vessel touch the ground no injury will arise, as the bottom is generally composed of sand and mud, and there is no sea. Care, however, must be taken to keep a ship in such a position as to be clear of her anchor.

Land wind.—In leaving Port Wakefield it is advisable not to start until the morning, when the wind generally being easterly, an offing may be easily obtained without beating out.

Tides.—The tides at the head of the Gulf are very irregular, and much affected by prevailing winds. With strong westerly winds the rise of tide is much augmented, whilst the fall is much diminished.

This Rock about seven and a half (7½) miles to the southward of Bald Hill, and about two (2) miles from the sandy beach, lies in latitude 31° 22' 05" S., long. 138° 13' 15" E., with the following bearings.—Mount Lofty, S. 40° E.; S. Summit Hummocks, N. 20° W.

The rock, which is of lime-stone, and very small, is awash at low spring tides, and lies in the track of small vessels beating down the Gulf.

A large mud buoy, painted red, now marks the position of the rock. This buoy should, like all other red buoys, be kept on the starboard hand bound to the north, or inwards, and on the port hand when bound to the south, or outwards.

The rock may be easily avoided by keeping in three (3) fathoms at low-water, and in four and a half (4½) at high-water; the rise and fall at being nine (9) feet.

Some of the small coasters report other small rocks in the vicinity of Thistle Rock, but they have not yet been found by this Department.

Winds.—It often occurs during westerly winds, at neaps, that a higher tide will be experienced than at the springs, with fine weather, and south or south-east winds.

With the latter, the tides are at the lowest, and the rise at springs is much reduced.

In fine weather, with the ordinary land and sea-breezes the time of high-water at F. and C. is five (5) hours, and the rise about nine (9) feet.

At neaps, in fine weather, the rise and fall is almost imperceptible, the time of apparent high-water being very irregular.

The winds, during fine weather in the summer are generally as follow:—From sun-rise to about 8 a.m. from E. to E.S.E.; in hot weather, the wind in the morning may be from N.E. gradually falling calm towards 8 o'clock a.m. The sea-breeze generally sets in after an interval of a couple of hours light winds, or calm, at about 11, and freshness towards 5 o'clock, gradually moderating till sunset, when it comes round to the S.E., and dies away towards night.

The barometer falls rapidly with northerly winds both in the summer and winter seasons, and generally precedes a change of weather from the westward. In summer the change often occurs suddenly from the southward, when it blows hard. In the winter the strongest winds are from the westward.

Produce is now sent from Port Wakefield to the shipping in the roadstead by barges. The river entrance is very shallow, and has a flat of upwards of a mile in extent uncovered at low water springs. At a rise of six (6) or seven (7) feet above the low water spring level the loaded barges can cross the bar.

The question of either deepening the entrance of the river, or building a jetty across the flat is now under the consideration of the Government.

The supply of fresh water at Port Wakefield is limited, and difficult to procure; it is therefore recommended that a sufficient stock should be obtained at Port Adelaide, if the ships call there on their way up the Gulf; or water can be obtained by arranging for the barges used at Port Wakefield—but which generally belong to persons at Port Adelaide—bringing up a supply.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1863* it is amongst other things enacted that at any time after the first annual election or general election, as the case may be, or first appointment of members of the district board, for any original or proclaimed district thereafter sometimes called "single district," the Governor in Council, if it seem fit, may, and if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said district, shall, within three months after the receipt of the same, divide the district into two, or, if the Governor in Council shall see fit, into three separate electoral subdivisions, thereafter called subdivisions by such names as shall by such Order in Council be assigned to the same, and in and by such Order in Council the boundaries of the subdivisions shall be set forth; provided that no such division shall be made within three months before any day appointed for holding any election of members of the district board in and for such district; and it is also enacted that every shire shall after the proclamation thereof as such be and be deemed to be and have been such and the same district as such shire was at the time of such proclamation, and save as aforesaid and save where therein otherwise expressly provided all the provisions of the said Act relating to districts shall continue and be of full force and effect with regard to such shire and be read accordingly: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council made on the fourth day of December, 1865, the Shire of Glenlyon was constituted: Now therefore His Excellency the Officer administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order divide the Shire of Glenlyon into three separate electoral subdivisions in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, by the names hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, and doth hereby set forth the boundaries of the said several subdivisions in manner following, that is to say:—

THE WESTERN RIDING—Commencing on the boundary of the shire at a point due south of the south-eastern angle of the parish of Glenlyon; thence north to and by the east boundaries of the parishes of Glenlyon and Holcombe to the shire boundary;

thence by the boundary of the shire westerly, southerly, and easterly to the commencing point.

THE SOUTHERN RIDING—Commencing on the boundary of the shire, at a point due south of the south-east angle of the parish of Glenlyon; thence easterly and northerly by the shire boundary to the north-eastern angle of allotment No. 1 of section 5, parish of Bourke; thence by the north-western boundary of said allotment to the north-west angle of allotment 6, section 5, in the parish of Bourke; thence west by the north boundary of allotments 18, 19, and 21 of section 6, parish of Bourke, to the north-west angle of allotment 21; thence south-westerly by a direct line to the south-east corner of allotment 13 of section 4, parish of Bourke; thence by the southern boundary of allotment 13 to the main road from Daylesford to Malmesbury; thence by a direct line west to the east boundary of the parish of Holcombe; thence southerly by the eastern boundaries of the parishes of Holcombe and Glenlyon to the south-east angle of the last-named parish; thence by a direct line south to the commencing point.

THE NORTHERN RIDING—Commencing on the boundary of the shire at the north-west angle of the parish of Bourke; thence easterly, northerly, and southerly by the boundaries of the shire to the north-east angle of allotment No. 1, section 5, parish of Bourke; thence by the north-western boundary of said allotment to the north-western angle of allotment 6, section 5, parish of Bourke; thence west by the north boundary of allotments 18, 19, and 21, section 6, parish of Bourke, to the north-west angle of allotment 21; thence south-westerly by a direct line to the south-east angle of allotment 13 of section 4, parish of Bourke; thence by the southern boundary of allotment 13, to the main road from Daylesford to Malmesbury; thence by a direct line west to the east boundary of the parish of Holcombe; thence by the said east boundary north to the commencing point.

And the Honorable William Mountford Kinsey Vale, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

THE WEST RIDING—Commencing at the junction of the Macalister and Thomson rivers, on the southern boundary of the shire; thence westerly and northerly by the southern and western boundaries of the shire to the junction of the Valencia Creek with the Avon River; thence southerly by the Avon River to the intersection of the northern boundary of the parish of Bundalagwah; thence westerly and southerly by the boundary of the said parish to the Macalister River; thence southerly by the Macalister River to the commencing point.

THE EAST RIDING—Commencing on the northern boundary of the shire at its intersection with the Avon River; thence easterly, southerly, and westerly, by the northern, eastern, and southern boundaries of the shire to the Avon River; thence by the Avon River north-westerly to the commencing point.

THE SOUTH RIDING—Commencing at the intersection of the northern boundary of the parish of Bundalaguh with the Avon River; thence westerly and southerly by the boundary of said parish to the Macalister River; thence southerly by that river to the Thomson River on the southern boundary of the shire; thence easterly by the southern boundary of the shire to the Avon River; thence by the Avon River north-westerly to the commencing point.

And the Honorable William Mountford Kinsey Vale, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

2ND GEELONG VOLUNTEER ARTILLERY CORPS.

RULES ADOPTED AT A SPECIAL GENERAL MEETING OF THE CORPS HELD FOR THAT PURPOSE.

Meetings of the Corps.

1. At any meeting of the corps, the senior officer present shall take the chair.

2. The commanding officer may at any time convene a special meeting of the corps, and must do so on the written requisition of twelve (12) members; provided the subject to be dealt with be not of a military nature, or in the opinion of the captain commanding, connected with the discipline of the corps. No such special meeting shall be held to be duly convened unless notice of it shall have been given at a parade of the corps, and it shall have been called by advertisement inserted or circular issued to every member four days previous to the day of meeting.

Fines.

3. Any member appearing on parade or company drill with uniform, arms, or accoutrements dirty or unserviceable from neglect, may be fined by the officer in command the sum of (1s.) One shilling.

4. Any member changing his permanent address must give notice of the same to the officer commanding, in writing, within thirty (30) days; and if he fail to do so, shall be fined the sum of (2s. 6d.) Half-a-crown.

5. A list of all fines imposed in any month shall be signed by the officer commanding and be posted in the orderly room or other place appointed on the first of the following month.

6. An account of all fines as incurred and received shall be kept in a book, which shall be open to inspection in the orderly room.

7. Any member reported for talking or other disorderly conduct in the ranks shall be fined (1s.) One shilling, and any non-commissioned officer in charge of a subdivision or section who does not report such talking or disorderly conduct may, at the discretion of the senior officer present, be fined (2s. 6d.) Half-a-crown.

8. Any member not attending or sending in his arms for inspection, at an inspection of arms of which one week's previous notice has been given by advertisement shall be fined (2s. 6d.) Half-a-crown.

Liabilities incurred by the Corps for Members.

9. An account shall be kept by the officer commanding between the corps and each of its members, wherein the member shall be debited with all liabilities incurred by the corps on his behalf, and credited with all sums earned by him as an effective.

10. If on the 1st of January in any one year a member's debit exceed his credit by (£1) One pound or upwards, he shall be fined the amount of such difference; provided always that the amount of such fine shall not in any case exceed (£2) Two pounds, and that the officer commanding may at his discretion remit the whole or any part.

11. If a member at any time desire to quit the corps under the provisions of the Act, he shall be fined the amount, if more than (10s.) Ten shillings, whereby his debit exceeds his credit; provided that no such fine shall exceed (£2) Two pounds, and that the whole or any part may at the discretion of the officer commanding be remitted.
