## LINTON CEMETERY.

## RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE LINTON GENERAL CEMETERY.

**A**LL charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.

2. Application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument to be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate of permission, in the form set out in the schedule, will be granted to the party applying for such permission on payment of the proper charges.

3. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery on a certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relatives or friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.

4. Orders for interments to be given at the office of the trustees, such notice to be given between the hours of Ten a.m. and Three p.m. the previous day.

5. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but the parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent (in writing) of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.

6. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased must be stated at the time of giving the order.

7. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

8. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m., in the months of September to April inclusive; and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. in the other four months.

9. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

10. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered in to the satisfaction of the trustees.

11. A plan of every monument or tombstone proposed to be erected and placed shall be exhibited to the said trustees before permission for the erection thereof is given, and the said trustees shall be at liberty to withhold such permission and prevent the erection of any monument or tombstone which shall appear to them inappropriate or unbecoming, and shall determine and fix the position of any monument or tombstone which may be proposed to be erected, according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner.

12. The cemetery will be open daily to the public from sunrise to sunset.

13. A plan of the cemetery showing the situation of the purchased and other graves is kept at the office, and may be inspected at the charge set out in the schedule; and a register of all grants is kept by the secretary.

14. The trustees will reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.

The deaths in July were fewer by 73 than those in June. They were above the average for July, extending over seven years, but not more so than might be expected from the increase of population. The mean temperature was half a degree lower than the average.

Males contributed 54 per cent. and females 46 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Forty per cent. of the deaths were of children who had not attained their fifth year. This is a lower proportion of infant mortality than that which obtained in the same month of any of the six previous years. In July, 1865, and also in July, 1861, 44 per cent. of the deaths were of children under five; 45 per cent. in July, 1863; 46 per cent. in July, 1862; 50 per cent. in July, 1861; and 48 per cent. in July, 1860.

Most deaths occurred on the 24th. The number was only 14. On one day of the previous month as many as 24 deaths took place. The smallest mortality occurred on the 11th, for which day only 3 deaths were recorded.

Five persons over 75 years of age died during the month, viz., a male aged 76, and a male aged 77, of old age; a male aged 78, of cancer; a male aged 81, of apoplexy; a female aged 95, of erysipelas.

The occurrence of only seven violent deaths was reported during the month, which is a number much lower than the average. Of these, two were accidental, viz., those of an infant under a year old, and a child aged 2, of scalds, the latter by tea. One was homicidal, viz., that of a woman whose throat was cut by her husband. Four were suicidal, viz., those of a man aged 38, described as a swindler, who destroyed himself by taking prussic acid; of a boots aged 34, who cut his throat; of a merchant aged 35, who poisoned himself with strychnine; and of a female aged 35, who cut her throat.

Fifty-nine deaths, or 22 per cent. of the whole, occurred in Public Institutions, as follow: 33 in the Melbourne Hospital, 2 in the Lying-in Hospital, 7 in the Benevolent Asylum, 3 in the Immigrants' Home, 7 in the Yarra Bend Asylum, 6 in the Industrial Schools, and 1 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 107, of which 68, or about 54 per cent., were of males, and 49, or nearly 46 per cent., were of females. Of those dying, 59 were under one year of age, 21 were between one and two years, 14 were between two and three, 5 were between three and four, and 8 were between four and five.

The persons dying at a more advanced age than five years numbered 161, of which 87, or 54 per cent., were males, and 74, or 46 per cent., were females; 14 were between five and ten, 4 were between ten and fifteen, 5 were between fifteen and twenty, 13 were between twenty and twenty-five, 14 were between twenty-five and thirty, 12 were between thirty and thirty-five, 30 were between thirty-five and forty, 14 were between forty and forty-five, 8 were between forty-five and fifty, 15 were between fifty and fifty-five, 4 were between fifty-five and sixty, 12 were between sixty and sixty-five, 7 were between sixty-five and seventy, 4 were between seventy and seventy-five, 3 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 2 were eighty and upwards.

Zymotic diseases, which occasioned 107 deaths in June, caused only 56 in July. Deaths from almost all complaints under this head showed reduced numbers in the latter as compared with the former month. Thus scarlatina and diphtheria caused 20 deaths against 31, typhus and infantile fever caused 8 against 20, diarrhoea and dysentery caused 8 against 24. Constitutional diseases caused 57 deaths against 60. Under this head 35 deaths were attributed to phthisis against 37 in June.
