By His Excellency the Honorable Sie John Henry Thomas Mannes Sutton, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c. &c.

W HEREAS by the Amending Land Act 1865, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, before or after the proclamation of any agricultural area, proclaim as a road or as a town or village any portion or portions of such area not selected, purchased, or leased, and not exceeding, if proclaimed as a town or village, any hundred and forty acres of the lands comprised in such area, and the lands in such town or village shall be sold by auction in the manner provided for the sale by public auction of lands not reserved for proclamation in such areas: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the land hereinafter described as a town under the designation prefixed thereto, that is to say:—

The Town of Timor.—Six hundred and forty acres, county

THE TOWN OF TIMOR.—Six hundred and forty acres, county of Talbot and county unnamed, parish of Bet-bet: Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 15 of section 7A; bounded thence by the south boundary of that section and a line bearing west eighty chains; thence by lines bearing south eighty chains, east eighty chains, and north eighty chains to the point of commencement.—(68.N.10208.)

WHEREAS by The Land Act 1862 it is amongst other things enacted that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, the Governor in Council may proclaim such laud to be a municipal common, or a gold fields common, or a town common respectively, as the case may be: And whereas by The Amending Land Act 1865 it is amongst other things enacted that when any Crown land remains unsold within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected under The Land Act 1862, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land a farmers' common; when one-eighth part of any agricultural area has been selected under The Land Act 1863, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim any unselected and unleased portion of such agricultural area, not exceeding twice the quantity so selected and leasest, to be a temporary common for the use of such selectors and lessess: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the areas hereinafter mentioned to be Commons in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Acts, that is to say:—

DARRAWEIT-GUIM TOWN COMMON.—Allotment 68 in the service of Wellen melloned.

DARRAWEIT-GUIM TOWN COMMON.—Allotment 68 in the parish of Wallan-wallan, containing on area of 402 acres 3 roods 18 perches, is beroby proclaimed a Town Common for the use of all householders of the township of Darraweit-Guin.—

MOORMUBUG TEMPORARY COMMON.—The reserve lying be-tween allotments 81 and 198 in the parish of Bairnsdale, and containing an area of 19 acres 2 roods 23 perches, is hereby pro-claimed a Temporary Common for the use of selectors and lessees in the agricultural area of Moormurug.—(65.K.11871.)

Additional Light at the enteance to Gerlong Harbon; also Notice of Alterations in Buoys and Beacons, Port Phillip Bay.

1. Notice is hereby given that the beacon on the north end of Symond's Spit has been washed away; another beacon will be placed on the same spit in a few days.

#### FRANKSTON JETTY.

2. The jetty at Frankston having now been extended into twelve feet water, the moorings and buoy have been removed.

BUOYS.-WEST CHANNEL.

3. As several vessels have of late got foul of, and done serious damage to, the Swan Bay and No. 12 Elbow buoys, it has been found necessary to shift the former close in shore. Masters of vessels and others navigating this channel are hereby informed, that the ascertained depth of the water, in a straight line from buoy to buoy, on both sides of the West Channel does not exceed sixteen feet.

#### VOLUNTEER FORCE.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has approved of the accompanying Regulations, supplementary to Regulation No. 61, issued under The Volunteer Statute of 1865 (28 Vict. No. 266):—

1. The Officer commanding the Volunteer Force is authorised to fix the rate of pay of non-commissioned officers appointed under clause 61 of the Regulations issued under The Volunteer Statute 1865, serving on yearly pay, provided such pay does not exceed the sums voted for them by Parliament, and to pay and classify those serving on daily wages according to the following scale, viz. scale, viz. :-

Non-commissioned officers of the first class not to exceed

Non-commissioned officers of the first class not to exceed Eleven skillings (18.) per diem.

Non-commissioned officers of the second class not to exceed Ten skillings (10.) per diem.

Non-commissioned officers of the third class not to exceed Nine skillings (9s.) per diem.

Non-commissioned officers of the fourth class not to exceed Seven skillings (7s.) per diem.

Non-commissioned officers will be promoted or reduced from one class to another, by the officer commanding the force, at his

Persons serving in the Department, to whom it may not be desirable to give the rank of non-commissioned officers, such as artificers in the Military Store Department, may be classified as having the relative rank of non-commissioned officers of the first, second, third, or fourth class, and be paid accordingly.

travelling expenses, will be apportioned by the Colonel Commandant, at his discretion.
