BERWICK CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE BERWICK CEMETERY.

- ALL fees must be paid to the treasurer before the ground is opened.
- The charges will be remitted for the burial of any poor person, on evidence being produced to the trustees that the friends of such person are not able to pay such fees.
- The name, age, late place of residence, and date of death of deceased, with cause of death and denomination, must be stated at the time of giving order for burial.
- On application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument or fence in the cemetery being made to the trustees, a certificate of permission will be granted on payment of the proper fees.
- All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences to be kept in repair at the expense of the owners.
- Every coffin in a vault must be bricked in, or cemented, or covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.
- Any person found destroying the fences, or in any way injuring the cemetery, will be prosecuted as the law directs.
- The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these regulations, subject to the approval of the Governor in Council.
- The friends of deceased must cause all graves to be dug and erect all monuments, tombs, or fences under the direction of the trustees, or whom they may appoint.
- A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who may withhold permission and prevent the erection of any monument which shall appear to them unbecoming or inappropriate, and shall determine and fix the position of any monument which may be preferred to be erected according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of all tombs, tablets, &c., copper cramps must be used.
- The usual hours of interment shall be from Nine a.m. to Four p.m. from the first of September to the thirtieth of April, and from Nine a.m. to Six p.m. the remainder of the year, Sundays excepted, which will be charged for as extra hours.
