CAUTION TO PASSENGERS.

THE attention of passengers and others is hereby directed to the following list of goods exempted from duty:—

Anchors, chain cables and shackles over 3-inch diameter; animals and birds; wrapping and printing paper, card and millboard; printed books and newspapers; printing materials and ink; coal, coke, and kerosene shale; cottons, linens, woollens, canvas, and bagging in the piece; cotton, raw, wick, and waste; hatters' felt hoods and silk plush; silk mixed doeskins or tweed trousers and coatings not containing more than two per cent. of silk; hogskins and minor articles used in making saddlery; quartz, quicksilver, rags, sulphur, resin, and saltpetre; hemp, jute, flax, cocoanut-fibre, and unserviceable cordage; fresh meat and fish; guano and other manures; plants; cocoanut and palm oil, wool, tallow, hides and skins, horns and hoofs; coin and bullion; iron in the ore and in scrap, pig, bar, rod, or plain sheet; hoop iron, iron pipes, railway iron rails; wire, No. 12 upwards; block and sheet tin, zinc, and copper in ore, ingot, and sheet; lead in ore, pig, and scrap; yellow metal, bolts and nails, and sheathing felt; steel; timber in logs 12 inches square and upwards; shooks and staves; stone and marble, unwrought; mill stones; pitch and tar; soda ash and caustic soda; silicate of soda and potash; specimens of natural history and curiosities; hair and bristles; telegraphic materials; minor articles of mixed or undescribed materials used in the making-up of apparel; sewing machines; metal work and minor articles used in manufacturing pianofortes; passengers' luggage, cabin and other furniture or personal effects, which have been in use and are not imported for sale; carriages and other vehicles used in the conveyance of passengers and goods across the frontier; and all packages in which goods are ordinarily imported.

And all persons are hereby cautioned against landing any goods not mentioned in such list; otherwise they will render themselves liable to severe penalties, and the goods, wherever found, to forfeiture. Any person having any articles liable to duty are desired to communicate with the customs officer on his boarding the vessel, or to ask the master to direct them to the nearest customs office.

N.B.—Passengers' baggage is always liable to examination by customs officers.

Tenders are required to be written on a form, printed copies of which may be had gratuitously on application at any post office in the colony, and may be forwarded (if by post, pre-paid) addressed to the Deputy Postmaster-General, with the words "Tender for the Conveyance of Mails" endorsed on the cover, or placed in the Tender-box at the General Post Office.

Tenders are requested to describe by their numbers, as below, the mail services for which they tender, and every tender will be taken to include the entire service as called for.

Every tender must bear the *bond fide* signatures and addresses of the tenderer, and of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfillment of the same in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

Every tender must be accompanied by a bank deposit-receipt for a sum equal to twenty per cent. of the amount for which the tenderer is willing to undertake the service; the money to be lodged to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General, and to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete, within ten

days of the date of notice being given of the acceptance of his tender, the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

The money deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them on application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts, but not otherwise.
