MAIN ROAD AND WORKS THEREON.

THE Governor in Council, in exercise of the power conferred by The Local Government Act 1863, has, by Order in Council made on the 21st day of January, 1867, appointed the road hereinafter mentioned to be a main road, in compliance with applications made in accordance with the 219th section of the said Act, and has directed the works mentioned in conjunction with such main road to be executed, viz.:—

A portion of the Ararat to south-western sea-board road, commencing at Youl's Creek bridge and extending northwards for a distance of five miles, to be a main road, on the condition that such portion of road be drained, formed, and metalled by the local bodies whose shires it traverses, within twelve months from the 21st of January aforesaid; otherwise the appointment to be revoked.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power conferred by The Local Government Act 1863, has, by Orders severally made on the 21st day of January, 1867, directed that the undermentioned Shire Councils shall, within the times by the said respective Orders appointed, execute the works on Main Roads hereinafter named and described, as provided by the 220th section of the said Act, according to plans deposited with the Board of Land and Works, that is to say:—

DEPOSITS UNDER REGULATIONS RELATING TO

DEPOSITS UNDER REGULATIONS RELATING TO LEASES OF AURIFEROUS AND MINERAL LANDS AND TO WATER-RIGHT LICENSES.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has, by Order made on the 21st day of January, 1867, directed the substitution of the following Regulations in lieu of those of the 16th February, 1863, and the 4th of December, 1865, respecting deposits under Orders in Council relating to leases of auriferous and mineral lands and to water-right licenses.

1. Clerks of petty sessions and wardens' clerks who receive deposits of money under existing or future regulations relating to the leasing of auriferous and mineral lands and to the granting of licenses for the use of water-rights shall forward monthly to the Oflice of Mines a statement in form A annexed

hereto.

2. Receipts for such deposits, whether paid by applicants or objectors, shall be given in the form contained in the schedules attached to the said regulations.

3. Books containing sets of printed receipts shall be supplied to the said clerks for the special purposes abovementioned.

4. No receipts other than such printed receipts shall be given either to applicants or objectors under any circumstances what-

5. Persons paying deposits shall be required to sign their names on the counterpart or block of such receipts, or, if unable to write, shall make their marks thereon in the presence of some person who shall sign his name in testimony of the payment being made, such person not being the clerk who receives the description.

being made, such person not being the clerk who receives the deposit.

6. Clerks of petty sessions and wardens' clerks who receive such deposits shall keep a separate bank account for such moneys exclusively, to be styled a Public Leasing Account, and all such deposits received shall be paid into the bank to the credit of such account daily.

7. All disbursements from the above-named account shall be made by cheque, and full particulars shall be written by the clerk on the butt of each cheque drawn by him.

8. The clerk shall not draw any cheque against a Public Leasing Account until he shall have obtained authority from the Secretary for Mines for the disbursement of the amount of such cheque from the said account.
