TOWN OF PARUPA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may from time to time, before or after the proclamation of any agricultural area, proclaim as a road or as a town or village any portion or portions of such area not selected, purchased, or leased, and not exceeding, if proclaimed as a town or village, six hundred and forty acres of the lands comprised in such area; and the lands in such town or village shall be sold by auction in the manner provided for the sale by public auction of lands not reserved for proclamation in such areas: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the land hereinafter described as a town, that is to say:—

TOWN OF PARUPA, county of Ripon, parish of Parupa (near Lake Boleke): Commencing at the south-east angle of suburban allotment 6, being the point of intersection of the western side of the road from Warrnambool to Ararat, by the southern side of the road from Portland to Geelong; bounded thence by the first-named road, bearing N. 4° 30' E. thirty chains; thence by a line bearing west eleven chains, more or less, to the eastern margin of a salt lake; thence by the eastern and southern margins of that lake, bearing south-westerly to a point bearing north from the north-east angle of suburban allotment 78; thence to the said angle of that allotment by a line bearing south fifteen chains, more or less; thence by a line and by the southern boundary of allotment 4 of section 25, bearing S. 73° 55' W. seventy-three chains fourteen links; thence by part of the east boundary of allotment 5, bearing south five chains; thence by the southern boundary of that allotment, bearing S. 73° 55' W. thirty chains eighteen links; thence by a line (crossing the aforesaid road from Portland to Geelong) bearing south three chains 12 links; thence by the road forming the west boundary of the parish of Parupa, bearing south eleven chains ninety-three links to the south side of the road forming the south boundary of suburban allotment 114; thence by the said side of that road, bearing east one hundred and twenty chains twenty links to the aforesaid road from Warrnambool to Ararat; and thence by that road, bearing N. 4° 30' E. fifty-one chains eighty-five links, more or less, to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(67.P.12215.)

2.
